The sign of peace, which follows the Our Father and precedes reception of Holy Communion, is an important gesture of union and forgiveness.

There are many ways to extend a sign of peace. Oftentimes we do so with a handshake with those who are in close proximity to us.

Because we are in the midst of the cold and flu season, we recommend refraining from shaking one another's hands. A wave of a hand or a nod with eye contact and a smile is a healthier method of participating in this significant aspect of the Mass, and may help curb the spread of illness.

Prevention of a cold or flu includes washing your hands often with soap and water and avoiding close contact with anyone who is or has been ill.

## LEARNING ABOUT THE DOCUMENTS OF THE 2ND VATICAN COUNCIL

October 11, 2012, marked the 50th anniversary of the opening session of the Second Vatican Council. A mere three months into his papacy, Blessed Pope John

XXIII stunned the Catholic world with his announcement of solemn convocation that would go down in history as the Second Vatican Ecumenical Council, and that would usher the Roman Catholic Church into the second-half of the 20th Century, and ultimately, the new millennium. The goal was modernizing the Church, while simultaneously returning the Church to its ancient Christian roots. The Council produced 16 Conciliar documents. Parish Staff Members have taken time to summarize the documents and their thoughts will be shared with you through the Bulletin, one document per week.

### **Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, or *Sacrosanctum Concilium*** *as summarized by Diane Heerman, Director of Liturgy*

The Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy (*Sacrosanctum Concilium*) was the first document produced by the Second Vatican Council, and arguably the most influential. The everyday lives of millions of Catholics around the world have been influenced by what it had to say. It was approved by an overwhelming majority of the Council Fathers (2,147 to 4), and promulgated by Pope Paul VI on December 4, 1963. It set in motion the most far-reaching liturgical reform in Catholic history.

The “Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy” establishes the principle of greater participation by the laity in the celebration of mass and authorizes significant changes in the texts, forms, and language used in the celebration of mass and the administration of the sacraments.

Mother Church earnestly desires that all the faithful should be led to that fully conscious and active participation in liturgical celebrations which is demanded by the very nature of the liturgy. Such participation by the Christian people as a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a redeemed people (1 Peter 2:9; cf. 2:4-5), is their right and duty by reason of their baptism.

—*Sacrosanctum Concilium* 14

The aims of the Second Vatican Council primarily were: 1. To impart vigor to the Christian life of the faithful, 2. To adapt to the needs of our times, 3. To promote union among believers in Christ, and 4. To invite all into the household of the Church. The council strongly believed that it is through liturgy, the worship of the Church, that the work of our redemption is accomplished, most of all in the divine sacrifice of the Eucharist. Hence, the purpose of the liturgical renewal is not a mere change in the form of worship but aims at the renewal of Christian life.

Not only Popes and bishops, pastors and religious, but all faithful Catholics have a part to play in its vision and mission. Within all the baptized is the call and privilege to be caught up in the work of the liturgy: the eternal praise of the Father by the Son, through the Holy Spirit. If at times we fail to do our part as well as we should, it remains, nevertheless, a great work and a vibrant calling.

Our next session of *GriefShare*, January 30, explores “**The Effects of Grief**”. You will begin to understand which reactions to the death of your loved one are normal and which are not. You are welcome to come to any or all sessions. For more information, call the Parish Offices at 565-5000. The GriefShare videos cover topics essential to your recovery from the hurt of grief and Meetings are Wednesday evenings at 6:30 pm in the Seven Dolours Parish Center at 731 Pierre.
