SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING Those needing the Sacrament of Anointing may call the parish to schedule a time with one of the priests.

LEARNING ABOUT THE DOCUMENTS OF THE 2ND VATICAN COUNCIL

October 11, 2012, marked the 50th anniversary of the opening session of the Second Vatican Council. The Council produced 16 Conciliar documents. Parish Staff Members have taken time to summarize the documents and their thoughts will be shared with you through the Bulletin, one document per week.

Declaration of the Relation of the Church to Non-Christian Religions or *Nostra Aetate*, as summarized by Maria McAnemey, Youth Director

Part 1: A focus on what will follow –The Catholic Church acknowledges the oneness of the Human condition, to ask the questions of our existence: what we hold in common, namely morals, values, belief, sacred actions, worship, prayer, and other human efforts to reach beyond ourselves and seek the Divine. The acknowledgement of a common search is just that; nothing more.

Part 2: There are non-Christian religions that occur in a culturally derived questioning and understanding of the human condition (Buddhism & Hinduism) sometimes with the sense and acknowledgement of a Supreme Being. The Catholic Church rejects nothing that is true and holy in these religions. Our belief is that the notion that the search for God—the one God, as we believe—is universal. The proper focus is and should always be on Christ, on the building up of the Christian way, and not on the tearing down of others. *"She (the Church) regards with sincere reverence those ways of conduct and of life, those precepts and teachings which, though differing in many aspects from the ones she holds and sets forth, nonetheless often reflect a ray of that Truth which enlightens all men."* NA 2

Part 3: The Islamic faith acknowledges one God; linked to the line of Abraham, and together with us they adore the one, merciful God, mankind's judge on the last day. The Church must leave the past behind, for the greater good of both Muslims and Christians, and seek to create further relationship for mutual understanding, benefits and participation in a common search for moral welfare, social justice and peace amongst our believers. *"Though they do not acknowledge Jesus as God, they revere Him as a prophet. They also honor Mary, His virgin Mother; at times they even call on her with devotion."* NA 3

Part 4: There is a common religious bond and spiritual legacy shared by the Jewish faithful and the Catholic Church. God and the Jewish people previously and currently abide in covenant. The Jewish faith, unlike other non-Christian religions, is already a response to God's revelation in the Old Covenant. *To the Jewish people "belong the sonship, the glory, the covenants, the giving of the law, the worship, and the promises; to them belong the patriarchs, and of their race, according to the flesh, is the Christ"* NA 3; for the gifts and the call of God are irrevocable.

The dialogue with Judaism cannot end with ethics, morals, or the common search for the Supreme Being. Because we share such a rich history of the Lord's creation, there is a need for accurate biblical interpretation and religious education so that the depth of the past is understood. There is also a need for Catholics and Jews to collaborate in "biblical and theological enquiry and ... friendly discussions", without the intent or desire of converting those who practice the Jewish faith. *"Since the spiritual patrimony common to Christians and Jews is thus so great, this sacred synod wants to foster and recommend that mutual understanding and respect which is the fruit, above all, of biblical and theological studies as well as of fraternal dialogues."* NA 4

Though those who pressed for the death of Christ were of Jewish descent, Christians must also acknowledge that Christ entered His passion and death knowingly and willingly for our salvation. The Jewish faithful of that time, nor of today, cannot be charged with the condemnation and death of Christ. Furthermore, the Church soundly rejects any act of anti-Semitism or persecution of the Jewish faithful. *"The Church has always held, and holds now, Christ underwent His passion and death freely, because of the sins of men and out of infinite love, in order that all may reach salvation."* NA 4

Part 5 – In Conclusion, as Christians, one cannot purport to be of God's people if one does not acknowledge that all people are God's creation and that He wants to be in all lives. Part of the search for wisdom of the age is maintaining a real understanding of one's own faith, being able to live that faith in a friendly and attractive way so as to evangelize, yet be able to have the conversation without the sense of superiority.

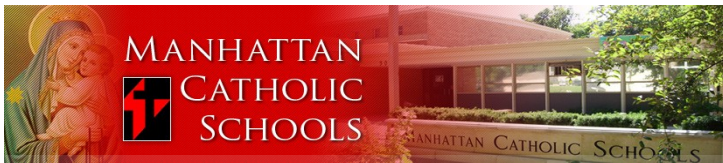

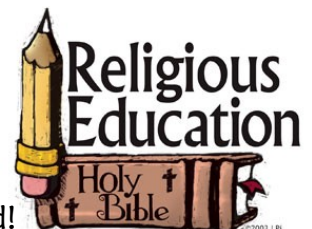
