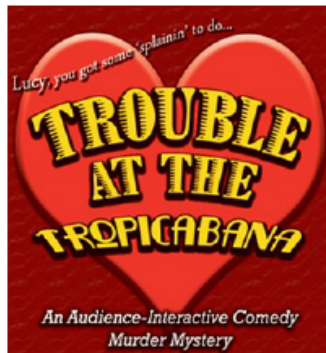

LEARNING ABOUT THE DOCUMENTS OF THE 2ND VATICAN COUNCIL

October 11, 2012, marked the 50th anniversary of the opening session of the

Second Vatican Council. The Council produced 16 Conciliar documents. Parish Staff Members have taken time to summarize the documents and their thoughts will be shared with you through the Bulletin, one document per week.

Declaration on Religious Freedom or *DIGNITATIS HUMANAЕ*, as summarized by Katie Neubauer, Director of Finance

The foundation of religious freedom lies within a person's dignity which is revealed through the word of God. In accordance with this dignity all men are bound to seek religious truth, and act upon it with a clear conscience.

The Vatican council declares that no one shall ever be forced to act in a manner contrary or against his or her conscience. Not through coercion by individuals or groups, nor by the government.

The sole role of the government is to create a safe environment in order to enable people to truly exercise their religious rights. In consequence, the government must acknowledge the right of parents to make a genuinely free choice of school and means of religious education.

That does not mean disobedience towards lawful authority but to come to decisions in the light of truth through a sense responsibility while striving for what is true, right and just, as through these actions all nations can come to closer unity.

May the God and Father of all grant that the human family, through careful observance of the principle of religious freedom in society, may be brought by the grace of Christ and the power of the Holy Spirit to the sublime and unending and "glorious freedom of the sons of God" (Rom. 8:21).

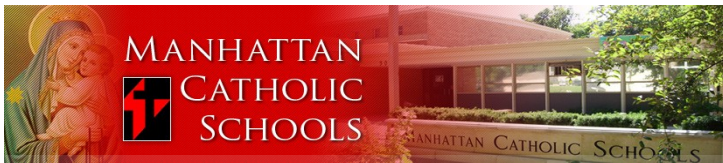

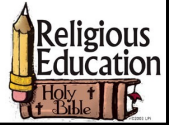
