LEARNING ABOUT THE DOCUMENTS OF THE 2ND VATICAN COUNCIL

October 11, 2012, marked the 50th anniversary of the opening session of the Second Vatican Council. The Council produced 16 Conciliar documents. Parish Staff Members have taken time to summarize the documents and their thoughts will be shared with you through the Bulletin, one document per week.

Presbyterorum Ordinis or Decree On the Ministry and Life of Priests, as summarized by Fr. Merlin Kieffer, In Residence

The decree deals with Priesthood in two main areas: the personal life of the priest and his life in relationship to his ministry. Underlying principles are significantly stressed in its treatment on priestly life in relation to their ministry. Other points in the document are concerned with the life of the priest in relation to his personal vocation.

There was a need to clarify the true priestly identity, as derived from the life of Christ and the traditional teaching of the Church. The decree speaks of the relationship priests have to the body of bishops and to other priests, with whom they are united by a sacramental bond. And thirdly to the relationship they have to the laity for whom they function as pastors:

"Priests by sacred ordination and mission which they receive from the bishops are promoted to the service of Christ the Teacher, Priest and King. They share in His ministry, a ministry whereby the Church here on earth is unceasingly built up into the People of God, the Body of Christ and the Temple of the Holy Spirit." (#2)

The document reflects the Council's intent to expand the notion of priestly ministry from one focused largely on ministry of the sacraments to a broader **threefold ministry of God's Word, sacraments, and community leadership**. Priests are said to act "*in the person of Christ the head*" in the exercise of this threefold ministry. They are one with the faithful by virtue of a common baptism, and with whom they share a common call of discipleship.

Priests achieve holiness of life, the decree teaches, through the ministry they exercise. And it offers some counsels for an adequate and permanent formation which may help priests to joyfully and responsibly live their vocation.

The decree does not offer an exhaustive exposition on the priesthood, but rather responds to the principal questions of a doctrinal, disciplinary and pastoral nature, placed upon the priests by the demands of the new evangelization.

In order to realize their mission, priests need to nourish in themselves a life which is a pure reflection of their identity, and to live a union of love with Jesus Christ Eternal High Priest. This task demands priests who are deeply and fully immersed in the mystery of Christ and capable of embodying a new style of pastoral life.

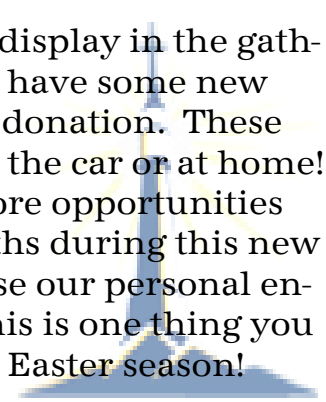
NEW SIGN FOR SAINT PATRICK'S

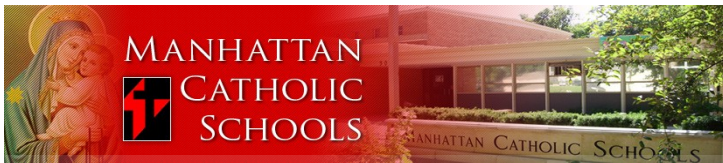
