

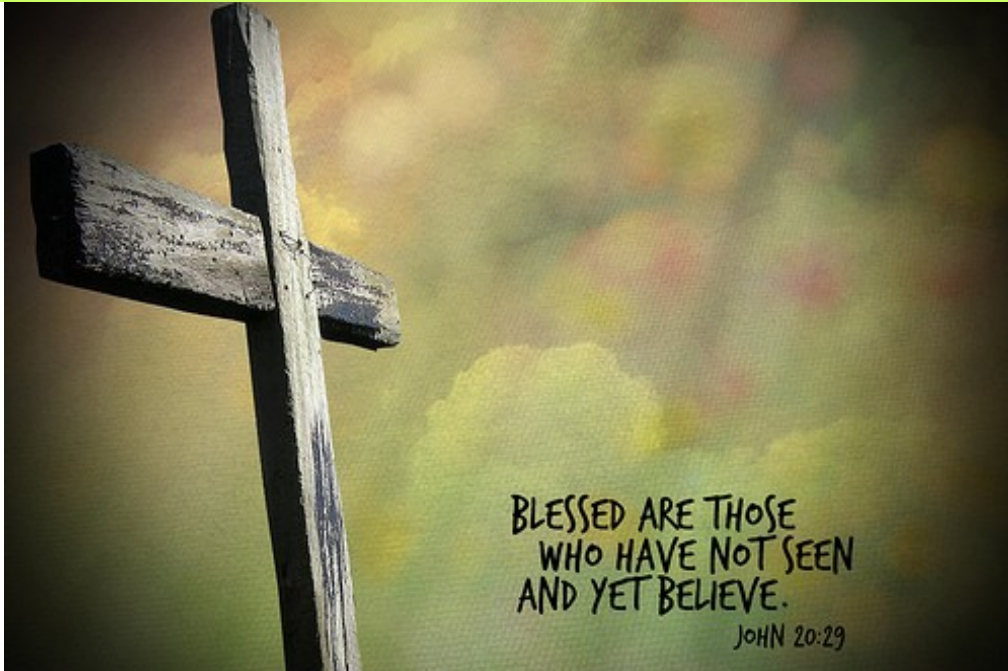

INFANT BAPTISM Parents seeking to have their child baptized must call the parish office and schedule a preparation session, after which the baptism is scheduled.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE Couples seeking the Sacrament of Marriage must contact the parish at least 6 months prior to the intended date, and participate in sessions of preparation. Weddings are not scheduled in Advent or Lent.

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING Those needing the Sacrament of Anointing may call the parish to schedule a time with one of the priests.

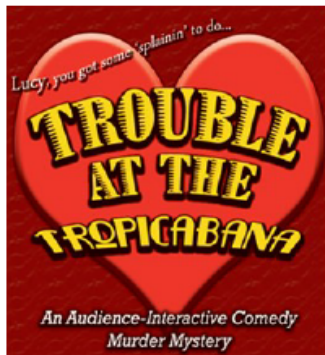

YEAR OF FAITH 2012-2013

LEARNING ABOUT THE DOCUMENTS OF THE 2ND VATICAN COUNCIL

October 11, 2012, marked the 50th anniversary of the opening session of the Second Vatican Council. The Council produced 16 Conciliar documents. Parish Staff Members have taken time to summarize the documents and their thoughts will be shared with you through the Bulletin, one document per week.

Ad Gentes

or Decree on the Mission Activity of the Church , as summarized by Ken Randall, Director of Maintenance

“Divinely sent to the nations of the world to be unto them ‘a universal sacrament of salvation’ the Church, driven by the inner necessity of her own catholicity, and obeying the mandate of her Founder, strives ever to proclaim the Gospel to all men.

In the present state of affairs, out of which there is arising a new situation for mankind, the Church being the salt of the earth and the light of the world, is more urgently called upon to save and renew every creature, that all things may be restored in Christ and all men may constitute one family in Him and one people of God.

The main duty of the laity is the witness which they are bound to bear to Christ by their lives and works in the home, in their social milieu, and in their professional circle.

Since the whole Church is missionary, and the work of evangelization is a basic duty of The People of God, all sons and daughters of the Church should have a lively awareness of their responsibility to the world; they should foster in themselves a truly catholic spirit, and should know that their first and most important obligation for the spread of the faith is to lead a profoundly Christian life.

Let Christians labor and collaborate with others in regulating the affairs of social and economic life. Let them devote themselves to the education of children and young people by means of different kinds of schools, which should be considered not only as the most excellent means of forming and developing Christian youth, but also as a public service, especially in the developing nations, working toward the uplifting of human dignity, and toward better living conditions. Let them take part in the strivings of those who, waging war on famine, ignorance, and disease are struggling to better their way of life, and bring peace to the world. In this activity, the faithful should offer aid to projects sponsored by public and private organizations, governments, Christian communities, and even by non-Christian religions.”

These ideas, set down between forty seven and fifty years ago (Oct 11 1962 to Dec 8 1965), are as relevant today as when they were written. Although meant to show that we are all to evangelize, it is not possible that everyone travel to far away countries. We can, however, by the lives we live and by our support of our churches, Catholic schools, and charitable organizations, be missionaries of Christ and his Church.

3. (b) The candle lighted from the Easter candle shows how close the newly baptized is to the Easter mystery and that from now on, he or she is called to be the light of the world.

The Knights of Columbus will be serving a chicken dinner on Sunday, April 7th from 4-7 p.m.

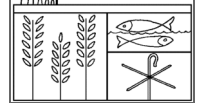

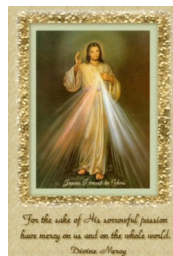
Knights of Columbus College Scholarships

Stewards of Hope Parish Objective for Section Nine: Youth and Young Adult Ministry is "The pastor, the

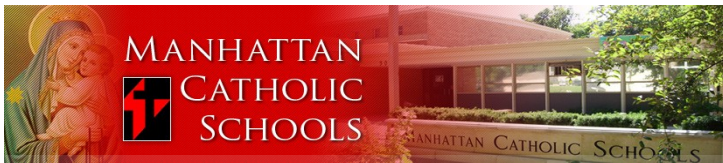

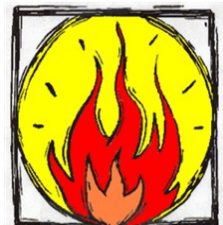
