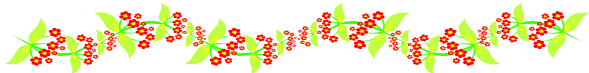

We interrupt the weekly staff reflections on the 16 documents of the Second Vatican Council for Fr. Joe to speak about an important announcement:

MEATLESS FRIDAYS ARE NO LONGER JUST FOR LENT

Yes, you read correctly. As of last month, Bishop Wiesenburger promulgated that all Catholics of the Salina Diocese are strongly encouraged to make the sacrifice of abstinence from meat on all Fridays of the Year. Okay, this is nothing new. Many mature Catholics will remember the days before the Second Vatican Council when abstinence was required year round on Fridays (with the penalty of mortal sin). It is a common belief that requirement was removed and only limited to Lent following the Second Vatican Council. This is partly true as the requirement was limited to Fridays of Lent. However, the Council Fathers recommended to keep Fridays as a day of penance throughout the year, without the penalty of sin.

So, what Bishop Wiesenburger has promulgated, indeed, is nothing new. He is simply renewing the encouragement of all the faithful of the Diocese to keep Fridays (outside of Lent) as days of penance. The easiest form of this is through abstinence from meat (like the Fridays of Lent). This discipline is a good challenge for all of us, but may be very difficult. This decree is not meant to cause undue ill for the faithful, but a method of strengthening our spiritual discipline and our Catholic identity.

The Bishop recognizes that abstaining from meat may be difficult (due to public school menus, work related gatherings, etc). For this reason, we are allowed and encouraged to offer other penances on Fridays other than abstaining from meat.

What follows are optional acts of penance that may replace one's penance of abstinence:

- *Make a visit to the Church (10-15 min.)*
- *Make a visit to the Adoration Chapel (10-15 min.)*
- *Read the Gospel or scripture of the day as a family before or after evening meal (usccb.org)*
- *Pray the Rosary*
- *Pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet*
- *Any additional prayer of the saint of your choosing (your patron or saint of the day)*
- *An additional morning offering of reading a daily reflection.*

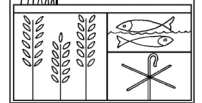

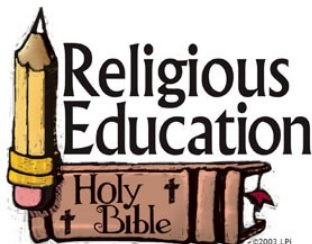

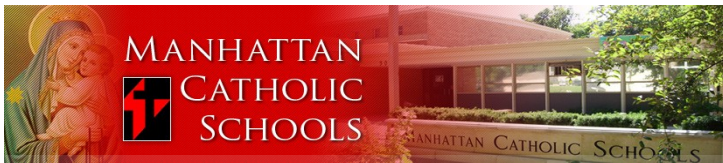

Welcome to our newest transfer member, George Thomas Neill, who has taken up residence near Wamego and is recently retired. He was voted into the Council during our April meeting. We are excited that George has chosen to be part of our parish community.

The Knights of Columbus Council # 1832 will grant two one-time non-renewable \$500 scholarships for post high school education. In granting scholarships, priority consideration will be given to those whose father, guardian, or grandfather is active in the Seven Dolores Council's activities. Other considerations are stewardship activities for the church & community, academic record, and your financial need. The awards are made at the discretion of the scholarship committee. Join us for our monthly breakfasts to raise funds to support the education of seminarians sponsored by our council. Council 1832 sponsored the Food for Families publicity campaign again this year during the Lenten season ending March 31. All food products and cash donations from the food drive were given to the Seven

Dolores Food Pantry. The total amount of donated food weighed in at 1840 pounds! The cash donations totaled \$230. The cash will be used to buy bulk items at lower prices to distribute in smaller quantities. Thanks to everyone that donated to our cause this Lenten season! Our outgoing District Deputy and fellow member of Council 1832, Joe Beck, is vying for a chance to be a delegate to the Supreme convention in San Antonio this August. One requirement is the act of campaigning and hosting a hospitality room. As a gesture of thanks for all of his hard work and guidance as District Deputy for District 25, the Council voted to donate \$100 to help fund his hospitality room at this year's state convention in Olathe, KS. Joe will be a great delegate to the Supreme convention.

The Council enjoyed a presentation by Fr. Joe Popelka, parish priest of Seven Dolores and our council chaplain, on the topic of jail ministry. This ministry started in February 2009 with the urging of three parishioners. Fr. stated he was reluctant at first, but has found the ministry to be very rewarding in terms of helping people, and in some cases, leading inmates' lives on a better path. He holds Mass at the Riley County jail every third Friday of the month at 2pm. The attendance ranges from 1 to 25 people and not all Catholic. Fr. Joe's story was very heartfelt and a great example of how a charitable act has the potential to affect someone's life.
