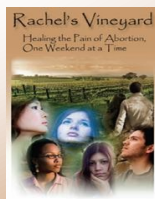

YEAR OF FAITH 2012

LEARNING ABOUT THE DOCUMENTS OF THE 2ND VATICAN COUNCIL

October 11, 2012, marked the 50th anniversary of the opening session of the Second Vatican Council. The Council produced 16 Conciliar documents. Parish Staff Members have taken time to summarize the documents and their thoughts will be shared with you through the Bulletin, one document per week.

Dei Verbum

*or Dogmatic Constitution on Divine Revelation,
as summarized by Diane Heerman, Director of Liturgy*

Dei Verbum - Dogmatic Constitution on Divine Revelation

was promulgated by Pope Paul VI on November 18, 1965, following approval by the assembled bishops by a vote of 2,344 to 6. It is one of the principal documents of the Second Vatican Council. The phrase "Dei Verbum" is Latin for "Word of God" and is taken from the first line of the document, as is customary for titles of major Catholic documents. Vatican II sums up the purpose of the Dogmatic Constitution *Dei Verbum*, "On Divine Revelation," in the prologue as follows: Following then in the steps of the Councils of Trent and Vatican I, this Synod wishes to set forth the true doctrine on divine Revelation and its transmission. For it wants the whole world to hear the summons to salvation, so that through hearing it may believe, through belief it may hope, through hope it may come to love.

Holy Mother Church presents to her faithful the authentic truths concerning Divine Revelation in *Dei verbum*. Therein, we find treatment of such important topics as inspiration; the Old Testament as preparation for the New; the value of the Old Testament for Christians; the unity of the two testaments; and Christ in the Old Testament.

Chapter 2: 10 states "Sacred tradition and Sacred Scripture form one sacred deposit of the word of God, committed to the Church." It is not from Sacred Scripture alone that the Church draws her certainty about everything which has been revealed. Both sacred tradition and Sacred Scripture are to be accepted and venerated with the same sense of loyalty and reverence.

Chapter 3: 11 states that the Church "accepts as sacred and canonical the books of the Old and New Testaments, whole and entire, with all their parts; on the grounds that, written under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, they have God as their author, and have been handed on as such to the Church herself." ...Sacred Scripture presents to us "firmly, faithfully, and without error" all the truths God wished to convey to humankind for the sake of its salvation. The Church, in the document *Dei verbum*, has clarified points and established norms of Scripture study for the sake of guiding her faithful in the way of truth. For, it is to her alone that the "commission and ministry of watching over and interpreting the Word of God" has been entrusted.

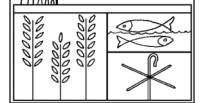

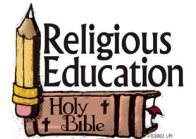
