SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE Couples seeking the Sacrament of Marriage must contact the parish at least 6 months prior to the intended date, and participate in sessions of preparation. Weddings are not scheduled in Advent or Lent.

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING Those needing the Sacrament of Anointing may call the parish to schedule a time with one of the priests.

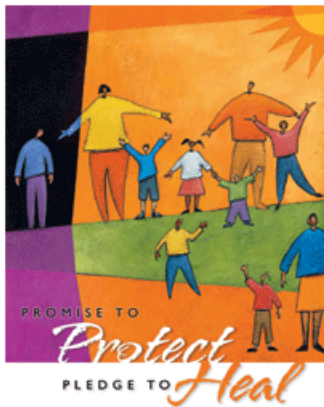
CHANGES TO THE REGISTER

Total Consecration to Jesus through Mary is a 33-day spiritual journey focusing on the following themes: Spirit of the World, Knowledge of Self, Knowledge of Our Lady and Knowledge of Christ. On the 34th day, we make our Total Consecration. It can conclude on any Marian Feast and must start so that the Feast falls on the 34th day. The next opportunity is January 1st, The Solemnity of Mary; Consecration would have to begin on November 29th. Any person interested in going through DeMontfort's Total Consecration program for the first time or who made their total consecration in a previous year and wishes to renew their consecration can participate.

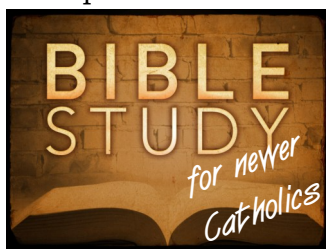
CHOIR UPDATE

Small Group For Newer Catholics

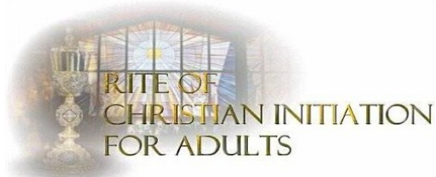
Our next meeting is Tuesday, November 26th at 6:30pm in the Blue Room in the Parish Center.
