The Season of Lent begins on March 5th.

This penitential season is a time for us to take inventory of our faith lives: how well do we reflect the life of Christ in our own life? *Please take a few moments to examine this flyer which includes important information regarding the Lenten Season and what is offered to help your journey of 40 Days in Lent.*

If you have not already brought your old palms, please leave them in the specially marked place in the gathering space of church no later than February 23rd. These will be burned to create the ashes for Ash Wednesday.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS

There will be Stations of the Cross in the context of Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament at 6 PM in English and 7 PM in Spanish.

CONFESSIONS

Confessions are available each Thursday of Lent at 5:00 PM (Two priests will be available to hear confessions). There will be a Communal Penance Service on April 6th at 3 PM. There will be confessions on Monday and Tuesday of Holy Week (April 14th & 15th) at Noon and 6 PM.

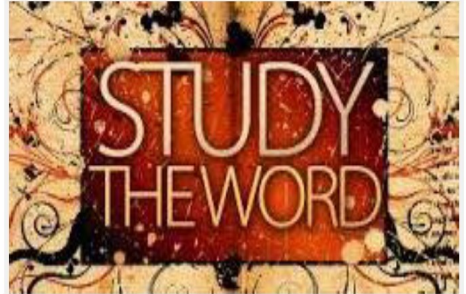

"Bible Study with Fr. Kieffer"

John's Gospel is intent on expressing the spiritual implications of the words and deeds of Jesus, so it has been called the "spiritual gospel" or "the theological gospel." This gospel contains many details about Jesus not found in the synoptic gospels, i.e.: that his public ministry lasted for several years, that he traveled to Jerusalem for various festivals and met serious opposition long before his death.

STATEMENT OF PENANCE, FASTING, ABSTINENCE

By Divine Law, penance is required of everyone. The Bishops of the United States remind us that since we are not exempt from sinfulness, we should not consider ourselves exempt from penance. Pastors, teachers and parents of children, should educate those under their care to a true sense of penitence. Traditional forms of penance are: abstinence from meat, fasting from food, other practices of self-denial, acts of religion (increased prayer life, participation in daily Mass and other devotions, spiritual and Scriptural reading), or other acts of charity and Christian witness. The CHURCH'S TEACHING AND DISCIPLINE regarding penance:

ABSTINENCE means not eating meat. The obligation of abstinence begins at the age of fourteen (14) years.

FASTING means eating only one full meal a day with the other two meals being without meat and together not equaling a full meal. The obligation of fasting begins at the age of eighteen (18) years or with the eighteenth birthday, and ends at the age of sixty (60) or with the sixtieth birthday.

BOTH ASH WEDNESDAY and **GOOD FRIDAY** are days of both abstinence from meat and fasting, days of self-denial and mortification.

OTHER FRIDAYS OF LENT are days of abstinence from meat.

OTHER FRIDAYS OF THE YEAR outside Lent are to be observed as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of penance or self-denial.

ALL WEEKDAYS OF LENT should also be considered days of penance. A self-imposed observance of the traditional practice of fasting (allowing meat at only the full meal) is strongly recommended along with the other forms of penance mentioned above.

OTHER SPECIAL DAYS OF PENANCE can be assigned by the Bishop. In the Salina Diocese there are four: 1. 2nd Friday in January, for the needs of all people; 2. 1st Friday in April, for the fruits of the earth; 3. 1st Friday in July, for world justice and peace; and 4. Friday before Thanksgiving, for human rights and equality. It is strongly recommended that these four days be observed as days of fast and abstinence.



ORIENTACIONES SOBRE EL AYUNO, LA ABSTINENCIA Y PENITENCIA

Por ley divina, todos los bautizados estamos obligados a hacer penitencia. Los Obispos de los Estados Unidos nos recuerdan que nadie está libre de caer en pecado, y por ello no podemos tampoco considerarnos libres de hacer penitencia. Los párrocos, catequistas y padres de familia deben enseñar a todos aquellos confiados a su cuidado el verdadero sentido de la penitencia. Los medios ya conocidos de penitencia son: la abstinencia de carne, el ayuno y otras formas de mortificación, actos de piedad, (más tiempo de oración, ir a misa diariamente y otras devociones, lectura de la Sagrada Escritura), obras de caridad para con los más necesitados y enseñar la religión al que no sabe. **LO QUE LA IGLESIA ENSEÑA Y PIDE SOBRE LA PENITENCIA ES:**

ABSTENERSE DE COMER CARNE. La abstinencia obliga desde la edad de los 14 años en adelante.

AYUNAR comiendo sólo una comida completa al día sin carne y que las otras dos comidas del día juntas no se comparen a una comida completa. El ayuno obliga a quienes ya cumplieron 18 años de edad hasta los 60 años.

MIÉRCOLES DE CENIZA Y VIERNES SANTO son días de abstinencia de carne y ayuno, días de realizar actos de piedad y mortificación.

TODOS LOS VIERNES DE CUARESMA son días de abstinencia.

TODOS LOS VIERNES DEL AÑO fuera de la cuaresma son días para hacer penitencia, si se quiere se puede sustituir la abstinencia con alguna otra práctica de penitencia o acto de caridad.

TODOS LOS DÍAS DE CUARESMA deben ser considerados como días de penitencia. Se puede ayunar si así se quiere (permitiendo comer carne en una sola comida al día) además de hacer otras formas de penitencia como las ya mencionadas arriba.

OTROS DÍAS DE PENITENCIA han sido señalados por el Obispo de Salina: 1. Segundo viernes de enero, por las necesidades de todos los pueblos; 2. Primer viernes de abril, por los frutos de la tierra; 3. Primer viernes de julio, por la justicia y la paz en el mundo; 4. Viernes antes del Día de Gracias, por los derechos humanos y la igualdad. Se recomienda que estos días se guarden con el ayuno y la abstinencia.

“Consecration to Jesus through Mary”

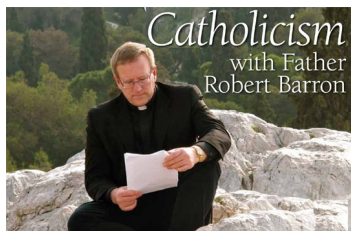

Catholic Community Annual Appeal

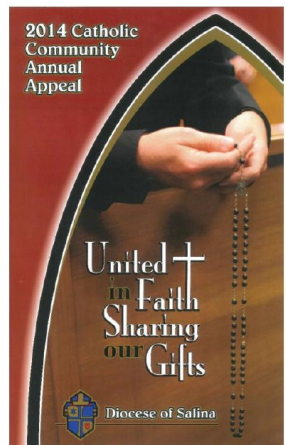
The CCAA helps more than 8,000 children receive formation through parish religious education programs and Catholic Schools.
