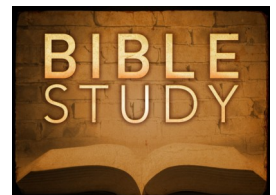

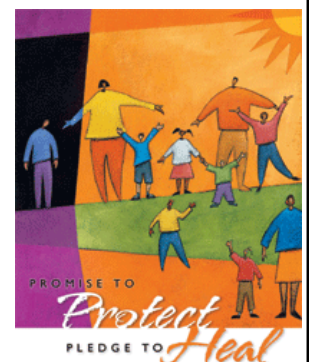
ST. PAUL'S BREAKFAST CREW

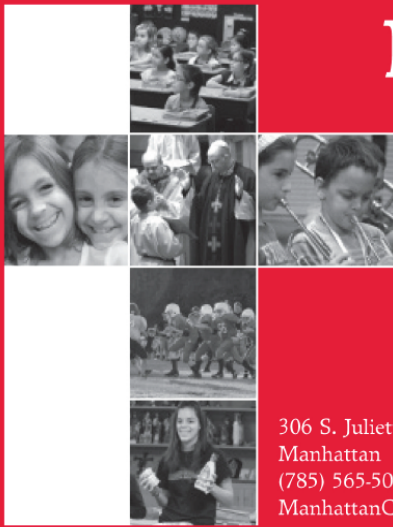
ABUSE OF MINORS PASTORAL RESPONSE HOTLINE 785-825-0865

MESI can house 47 individuals at one time for 28 to 30 days. This is very flexible and can vary as needed. Everyone earns their keep at the shelter by performing certain chores.
