Ministry Q & A



We're changing the way we sign parishioners up for the various ministries. Included in this bulletin are the Time, Talent and Treasure worksheets for 2014-15. Please remove them from the bulletin and fill them out. We've attempted to provide plenty of instruction through the frequently asked questions below. Hopefully you'll find your answer there! If you have additional questions, feel free to call the Parish Office at 565-5000.

Q. What do some of these ministries entail? I'm not sure what they are, just by the name.

Some of the ministries listed on the worksheets are lesser-known, or at least, the names are not self-explanatory. Here's a list of those with a description of each:

Sacristan – In charge of keeping oil in sanctuary candles. Also keeps altar free of clutter and straightens gathering space and sanctuary.

Rosary Leader – This ministry only applies to the months of May and October. A rosary is recited in these months before the 6 pm, 8 am and 10 am Masses. Leaders must arrive ½ hour before Mass.

Albs/Altar Cleaning – Makes sure albs (server robes) are clean. Cleans altar linens according to prescribed protocol.

Funeral Hospitality – Greets/hands out programs at funerals held at Seven Dolors. This ministry is not preparing the food for funeral dinners, which is handled by the ladies Circles.

Ministry of Care Committee – Visiting sick parishioners in the hospital; keeping contact with them after going home.

Elizabeth Ministry – Taking meals to new mothers and their families.

Q. If I'm already involved in ministry and don't want to try anything new right now, do I even need to turn in the worksheet?

Yes, please do. Each Stewardship Renewal, we need parishioners to tell us what ministries they want to be involved in for that coming year. For example, if you have been a lector for several years, you still would have to note on this year's worksheet that you want to be on the active list for lectors for 2015.

Q. How do I get the worksheets to the office?

You have several options. After cutting the worksheets out of this bulletin, fill them out and return them by a) putting them in a sealed envelope marked *Parish Office, Attn: Stacie* and putting them in the collection basket at Mass, b) putting them in a sealed envelope and mailing them to the Parish Center at 731 Pierre, Manhattan, KS, 66502, Attn: Stacie, c) faxing them to the Parish Center at 785-565-5003 **OR** d) scanning them and emailing them to office@sevendolors.com.

Q. Is there a deadline?

We need the worksheets back as soon as possible, and no later than October 1st, please.

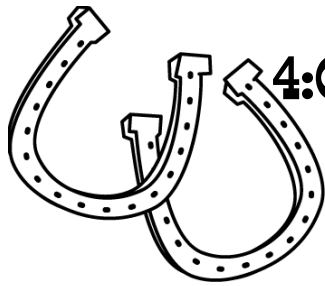

Our Lady of Sorrows: All About Our Parish Feast Day

This feast dates back to the 12th century. It was especially promoted by the Cistercians and the Servites, so much so that in the 14th and 15th centuries it was widely celebrated throughout the Catholic Church. In 1482 the feast was added to the Missal under the title of "Our Lady of Compassion." Pope Benedict XIII added it to the Roman calendar in 1727 on the Friday before Palm Sunday. In 1913, Pope Pius X fixed the date on September 15. The title "Our Lady of Sorrows" focuses on Mary's intense suffering during the passion and death of Christ. "The Seven Dolors," the title by which it was celebrated in the 17th century, referred to the seven swords that pierced the Heart of Mary. The feast is like an octave for the birthday of Our Lady on September 8th.

The feast of Our Lady of Sorrows is dedicated to the spiritual martyrdom of Mary, Mother of God, and her compassion with the sufferings of her Divine Son, Jesus. In her suffering as co-redeemer, she reminds us of the tremendous evil of sin and shows us the way of true repentance. May the numerous tears of the Mother of God be conducive to our salvation; with which tears Thou, O God, art able to wash away the sins of the whole world. As Mary stood at the foot of the Cross on which Jesus hung, the sword of sorrow Simeon had foretold pierced her soul. Below are the seven sorrows of Mary:

The prophecy of Simeon (*Luke 2:25-35*)

The flight into Egypt (*Matthew 2:13-15*)

Loss of the Child Jesus for three days (*Luke 2:41-50*)

Mary meets Jesus on his way to Calvary (*Luke 23:27-31; John 19:17*)

Crucifixion and Death of Jesus (*John 19:25-30*)

The body of Jesus being taken from the Cross (*Psalms 130; Luke 23:50-54; John 19:31-37*)

The burial of Jesus (*Isaiah 53:8; Luke 23:50-56; John 19:38-42; Mark 15:40-47*)



Symbols: heart pierced with a sword; heart pierced by seven swords; winged heart pierced with a sword; flowers: red rose, iris (meaning: "sword-lily"), cyclamen.

Patron: people named Dolores, Dolais, Deloris, Dolorita, Maria Dolorosa, Pia, and Pieta.

SEVEN DOLORS FOOD PANTRY



Seven Dolors Food Pantry strives to provide nutritious and adequate food for those less fortunate in our community. We function in association with the Flint Hills Breadbasket and are one of five church food pantries. We are open on Thursday afternoons; however, there is a pantry open each day, Monday through Friday. All clients are pre-approved by the Breadbasket before they can receive food from the pantries. Over the past 12 months we have served 2,207 men, women and children.

We are blessed to have so many generous donors: Each week we receive non-perishable food from the parishioners of Seven Dolors and St. Thomas More as well as cash donations to purchase items in short supply: we receive meat, milk, eggs, margarine, and any other needed available items from the Breadbasket; each month we receive approximately 50 lbs. of meat items from St. Thomas More parishioners as part of the

Prairie Land Food program and each week, we pick up slightly blemished produce donated by Ray's Apple Market.

Every year we receive sizable donations of non-perishable foods from the Knights of Columbus food drive during Lent and the Manhattan Catholic Schools food drives.

Non-perishable food donations may be left in the church gathering space or brought to the Parish Center office.

The food pantry is operated solely by volunteers who find it very rewarding to help these individuals and seldom leave this ministry. For any volunteer opportunities you may use the Time, Talent, and Treasure forms or call the parish office.

The Family Center Budget Shop is an organization staffed entirely by volunteers from local parishes and the community. It is under the sponsorship and ownership of Seven Dolors Parish. A committee including representatives from Seven Dolors and St. Thomas More parishes involved in the shop operation is advised by the Seven Dolors pastor. Our income is used for the benefit of Manhattan Catholic Schools, the local parishes, and other community needs as approved by the committee.

GOALS

1. To provide low-cost clothing and household items for the community.
2. To provide free clothing for persons referred by the local parishes, Red Cross, SRS, Manhattan Emergency Shelter, Shepherd's Crossing, Crisis Center, Bread Basket, or School Social Workers.
3. To donate surplus items to the Indian Missions in South Dakota, the Veteran's Administration Hospital in Topeka, The Twin Valley Developmental Services and other requests by agencies .
4. To participate in efforts to protect ecological systems.
5. To serve all people with dignity and respect without regard to race, color, or creed.

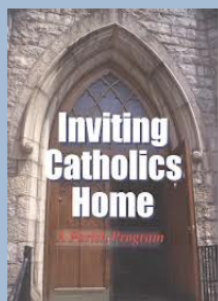

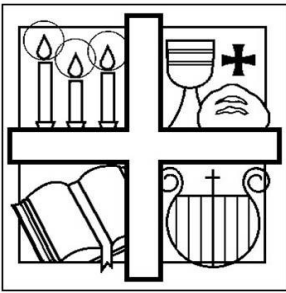

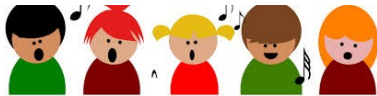

A CAMPAIGN FOR MCS

Q: Why are we conducting a capital campaign?

A: Upon the results of the feasibility study, members of the Parish Council, Finance Council and Manhattan Catholic Schools' Council of Education made the recommendation to proceed with a capital campaign for both the church and school. Our campaign will be addressing maintenance and improvements to the interior and exterior of our school as well as interior improvements to our church. With the 100-year anniversary of our church approaching, we have a fantastic opportunity to bring the church back to its original glory through an interior restoration. As a group, we also agreed that improving the comfort and security of our school will provide the optimal learning environment necessary for our current students and faculty, as well as market the school to potential future students.

Q: What maintenance and improvement projects are we addressing?

To help track our progress during the campaign, we have decided to tier the approved projects. Our campaign will comprise of three goals; a celebration goal, a challenge goal and a miracle goal. Our celebration goal consists of replacing the roofs on both schools, as well as a paint restoration to the interior of the church. Completing our next challenge goal will allow us to complete the first two projects, as well as make some interior upgrades to the school and church. This includes new HVAC units, new windows, lighting, and paint and flooring refresh in the school. For the church this includes a new sound system, lighting, flooring, alter furniture and restoring the pews. Achieving our final Miracle goal will allow us to do all the above, as well as upgrade the HVAC delivery system in the church and provide new technology and security upgrades to the school.

Q: I do not have kids at MCS, why should I support a campaign that includes school related maintenance?

A: The future of our parish and our Catholic community as a whole is nurtured in the classrooms of our own school. We have a responsibility as a parish to ensure that our school's infrastructure is in a condition that provides a safe and comfortable environment for our current faculty and students as well as appeals to prospective families who are considering Manhattan Catholic Schools for their children. Plus, many members of our parish utilize the school facilities for religious education classes and to host other parish sponsored events. Many students pass through our school and go on to become future residents, community leaders, public workers, business owners, and loyal promoters of Manhattan. They in turn have a strong desire to support the Catholic school system that shaped them into who they are today. Your gift can inspire the next

great leader of your parish community and offer them the opportunity to send their children to Manhattan Catholic Schools.

Q: What does painting the interior of the church include?

A: With the 100-year anniversary of the church coming up in 2020, there is a shared desire to update the church and restore the interior to its original beauty. This will include much of the original paint color scheme, stenciling, and architectural renderings that were prevalent back in the church's early days. Much of the work will have to be done by hand and will take time to complete. We will utilize a combination of parish input, old pictures of the church interior, design recommendations from the Diocesan Art and Architecture committee, as well as current designs from other local, long-established churches in the area to inspire our final product.

Q: Do the school's roofs really need to be replaced?

A: Yes, both the elementary and middle school buildings need a brand new roof. It has been over 25 years since either one has been completely replaced. Some parts of the roof with major leaks are a distraction to the students and teachers who are directly below these problem areas. We plan to install a high quality, standing seam metal roof to improve weather resistance and eliminate future leaks.

Q: How soon can we start to recognize a cost savings from the HVAC delivery upgrade?

A: After some preliminary calculations, based on current expenses, we will be cost neutral in 4-5 years. This means we will save enough money in energy expenses to have the cost of the delivery upgrade paid for in about 5 years. Any savings after year 5 will be a cost benefit to us and a major reduction in our maintenance budget.

Q: Some of the proposed projects are cosmetic. Can we utilize volunteers to satisfy these needs?

A: Yes and no. Painting and refreshing interior walls and other minor cosmetic repairs are relatively easy and can be completed using volunteers. At this time, most of the necessary maintenance and improvement projects require a professional contractor to complete the renovations according to building codes. We are currently in the process of hiring a general contractor to assist with the completion of all our projects in a timely manner.

Q: Other parishes in the area have children at MCS, will they be asked to support the campaign?

A: Yes, without question! We are working with Fr. Don Zimmerman and the parishioners from St. Thomas More, to ensure we effectively communicate and promote the school specific projects we want to complete. We will also appeal to MCS alumni and past supporters, to maximize our potential and raise enough funds to complete all our school projects. Rest assured, everyone will have the opportunity to participate in this campaign.

Q: Does this campaign take the place of our annual school fundraiser?

A: No, absolutely not. Next year's annual fund drive will continue to support the budget needs of our school. In addition to the annual fund drive, we must stress that all gifts to the campaign are over and above your normal Sunday offertory. The *Preserve Our Past, Prepare Our Future* campaign simply cannot jeopardize our ability to support the day-to-day functions of Seven Dolors parish.

Q: When does the campaign start and how can I help?

A: In the coming weeks, you will be receiving details regarding the *Preserve Our Past, Prepare Our Future* campaign. Included will be instructions on how you can contribute. Between now and December, everyone will be asked to consider a gift to our campaign. We ask that you be receptive to our campaign volunteers and wait until you are personally contacted to make a gift. All we ask of you right now is, that you continue to pray for the success of our campaign and your willingness to be a part of this great undertaking.
