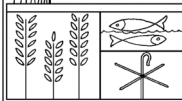

2015 CATHOLIC COMMUNITY ANNUAL APPEAL



In place of a recorded Message, we are providing the transcript of Bishop Weisenburger's address for this weekend:

This is Bishop Weisenburger and I have a brief, but important message to share with you today about the Catholic Community Annual Appeal. I have been your bishop now for just under three years. During that time I've grown in my understanding of our Diocese, our ministries, and the rich faith of our people. As I visit your parishes, I am welcomed with great hospitality. I have been invited to many celebrations, as well as into many of your homes—and the diocese of Salina truly has become my home.

Our 2015 theme for our *Catholic Community Annual Appeal* is **Lift Up Your Hearts**. This theme reminds us of our gratitude to God for all that we have. You might recall that we say these words during Mass, at the very beginning of the Eucharistic Prayer. It is a moment of hopeful joy in the Mass, anticipating the Eucharist that is about to follow.



In July, Pope Francis said, "The Church, by her nature, is missionary. She exists so that every man and woman may encounter Jesus." Our Holy Father continues to call us to have concern for the needs of others, and to respond to those needs. The many ministries that are funded by the Annual Appeal ... do just that.

I am here today to remind you of how much I truly count on you to assist me ... to help others. Our annual appeal funds the day-to-day operations of the Diocesan Church for the coming year; and those ministries affect people in every corner of our Diocese

This year we are again focused on caring for our retired priests, and payment for seminary education—providing for our future priests. But the real ministries and needs of our Diocesan Church are actually quite extensive. Your commitment to the Annual appeal also makes possible:

Diocesan-wide youth ministry, the formation for lay ministries – as well as the permanent diaconate, accreditation of our Catholic schools religious education programs for our children family life outreach, ministry to immigrants, and, Diocesan-wide evangelization efforts,

Many of you were generous in supporting our first diocesan-wide campaign: *YESTERDAY, TODAY, and FOREVER*. I remain grateful to all who contribute to the needs of our Diocese with their funds and their continued prayers. And I ask that you join me in this effort.

May the work that we have begun together, bring faith in Jesus Christ to every corner of our Diocese. And may God bless you abundantly.
