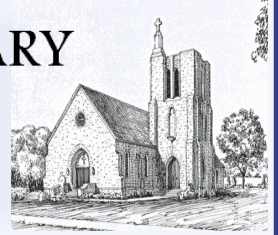

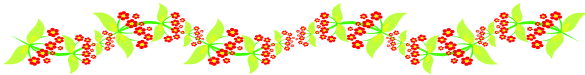

For the last several weekends plus the daily readings, it's been all about bread, grumbling and complaints. Several things come to my mind with the readings. First, we Catholics do food! We have potlucks, hospitality Sundays, Knight of Columbus breakfasts, picnics, funeral dinners etc. I could go on and on. It is interesting to me that our social gatherings usually have something to eat. It amazes me that we correlate our daily lives with our Sunday worship! Think about the ritual of eating at home. We gather as a family, sit down at the table, listen to each other's happenings of the day, eat what mom or dad made for supper, than continue on with the evening routine. So what do we do on Sunday? We come together as the Body of Christ (gather as family), find our favorite pew in church (sit down at table), listen to the words from Scripture (listen to each other's happening of the day) and receive Communion (eat what mom or dad made). Did you realize eating at home was a ritual? Did you realize how much each ritual it is alike? The other thing is all the complaining the Israelites did – it was all about food. So, think about this: we have the opportunity to receive the Body and Blood of Christ each day. This is Jesus the Bread of Life. "Amen, amen, I say to you, whoever believes has eternal life. I am the bread of life." We are invited to eat and drink at Eucharist each week - I hope you never complain with your mouth full.

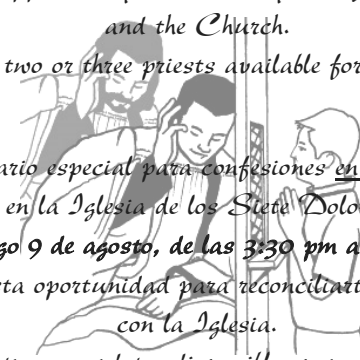

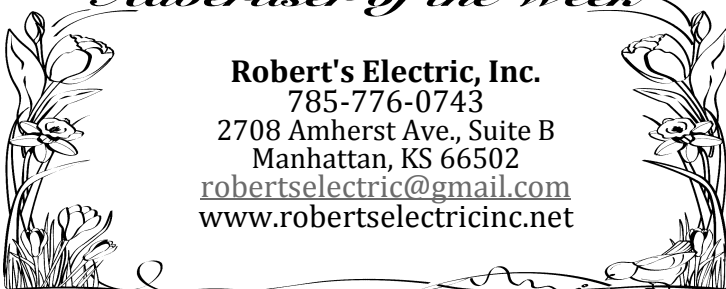

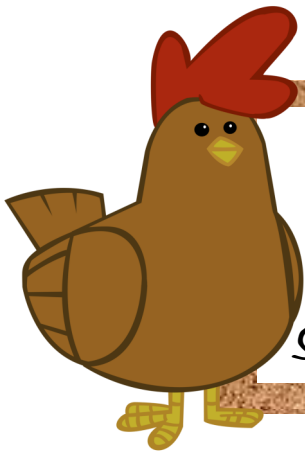
