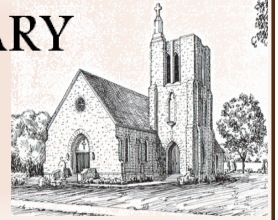

STEWARDSHIP THOUGHT

“So out of the ground the Lord God formed every beast of the field and every bird of the air, and brought them to the man to see what he would call them; and whatever the man called every living creature, that was its name.” Genesis 2:19

From Rosie's Desk –

I just had to share Fr. Ron Rolheiser's reflection on this week's readings.

"We need our children. Our children raise us, not vice versa. It is they who put a rope around us and take us where we would rather not go, namely, into an adulthood and into a selflessness that, without them, we would never attain. We become adult by having and raising children. This, perhaps more than anything else, moves us beyond being children ourselves. Why is this so?"

Some of the reasons are more obvious than others: When we are raising children it is more natural for us to stop thinking of ourselves as children, when we are forced to respond to others' needs we tend to be less focused on our own. Raising children forces us to live a certain virtue. It is constrictive adulthood; we mature, almost against our will. But there is a deeper dynamic operative too: Children have the power to fire within us the deepest and most powerful surges of love that we can ever experience in this life. More so than does romantic love or the love that we have when we get involved in causes, love for our children is a love that can take us beyond ourselves, break our narcissism, and let us genuinely imitate (weak though it may be) the life-giving love of God.

There is something in children, some combination of helplessness, dependence, innocence, trust, vulnerability, simplicity, playfulness, and simple physical beauty that opens the heart to selflessness in a way that our other loves do not. Perhaps there is nothing in this world as powerful to break selfishness as is the simple act of looking at our own children. In our love for our children we are given a privileged avenue to feel as God feels—to burst in unselfishness, in fire, in joy, in delight, and in the desire to let another's life be more real and important than my own." *Ron Rolheiser* (www.ronrolheiser.com)

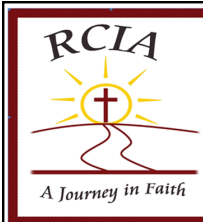

MINISTRY OF CARE CONCERNS

Seven Dolors "Ministry of Care", through its priests and lay volunteers, wishes to serve the spiritual needs of parishioners who are hospitalized, homebound or in a care facility—with **Communion, Anointing or a visit or call.**

Federal law prevents hospitals from disclosing the presence of any **patient** to others, *even* Church ministers, unless the patient or a caregiver has signed the HIPPA release.

So, priests and lay ministers **visiting the hospital will not have a parishioner's name** on the Catholic List of admissions when they go for Anointing or Communion unless the patient or their 'caregiver' asks the nurse to make sure he/she are on the "**Catholic List**" and signs the required release. (*You can also list your parish.*)

By the same law, other care institutions like *Via Christi, Meadowlark, Stoneybrook and Good Samaritan Hospice* cannot reveal your presence or that of a family member.

Once a patient leaves a hospital or other care facility, *they cannot tell us* where they have gone! We sometimes do not find out about a parishioner *in one of these care facilities or an out of town hospital for weeks.* **A family member, relative or friend must let us know!**

Church Basement and School/Gym Rental

It seems like in this day and age everything we do is becoming more complicated. Speaking of complicated, we are being asked to change the way we rent the church basement and school gym. As always, we will continue to rent these spaces for a donation. That has not changed. However, due to insurance concerns, we are going to have to start requiring that the person responsible for the rental provide a copy of their homeowners insurance listing that coverage has been extended for the rental event. Although this seems like a burdensome request, insurance companies are actually used to getting these requests and it should be relatively easy for them to provide you with this. We apologize for the inconvenience, but if this allows us to continue renting the space for birthdays, anniversaries, graduations, etc., then it is a small price to pay. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation.

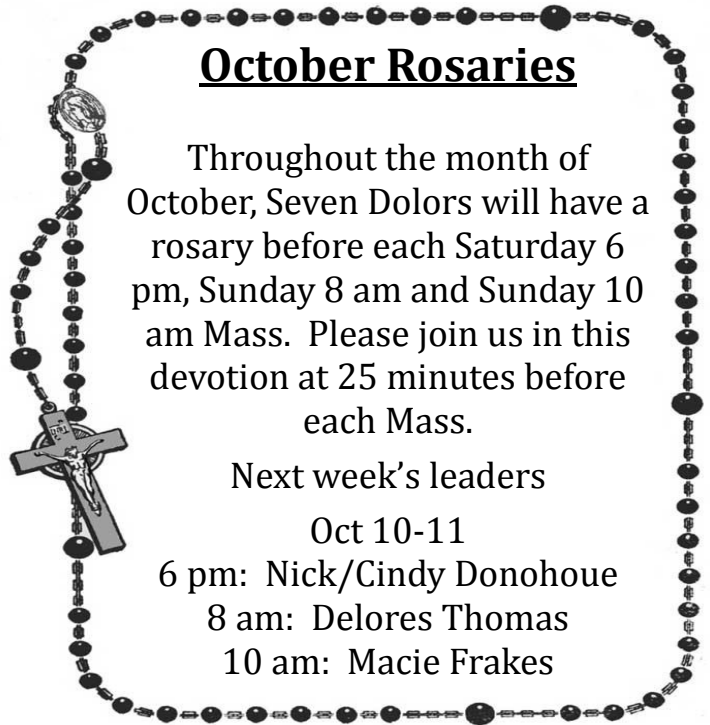


