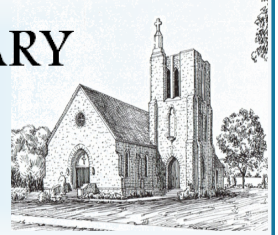
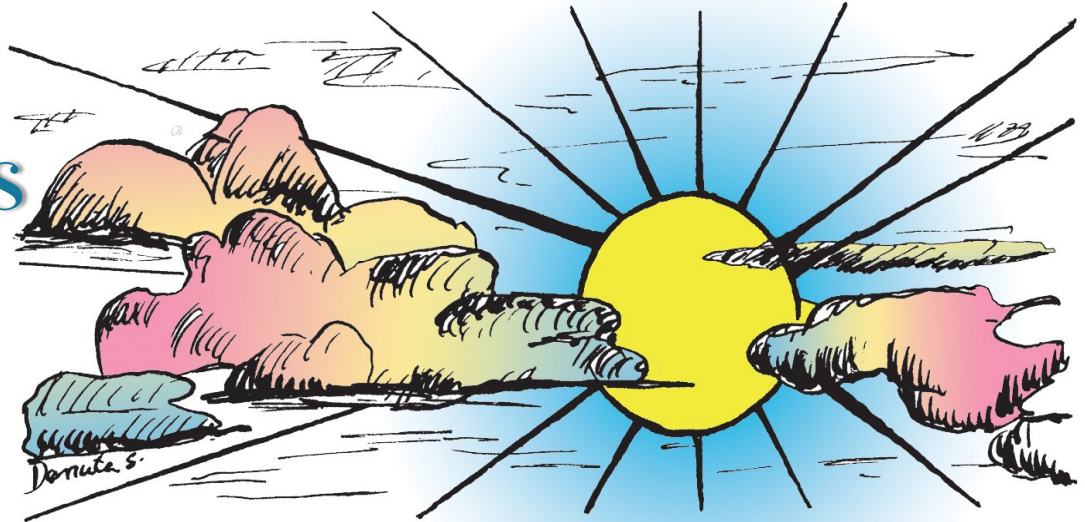

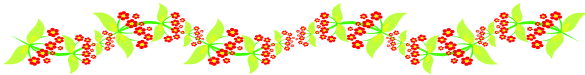

The doors of the Church admit us to a new place. As you enter a church, you unconsciously lift your head and your eyes, and, as you survey the great interior space of the church, there also takes place in you an inward expansion and enlargement. The large width and height are an analogy to infinity and eternity. A church is made to be similar to the heavenly dwelling place of God. While the outdoor space of the sky is unconfined and formless, the portion of space set aside for the church has been formed, fashioned and designed at every point with God in view. The long aisles, the width and solidity of the walls, the high arched and vaulted roof bring home to us that this is God's house and the seat of his hidden presence.

It is the doors that admit to this mysterious wonderful place. Lay aside at the door all that cramps and narrows your mind and soul. Open your heart and lift your eyes as you enter.

The church is also a representation of you, yourself. For you, your soul and your body, are the living temples of God. Open up that temple, make it spacious and give it height.

Heed the cry of the doors. Let them open wide your heart and soul and let your passing through them lift up your spirits as you raise your eyes entering the new space.

She wrote for a grant that enable her to develop a database that includes 90 congregations of sisters, networks and collaborations where there is a strong presence of sisters who address human trafficking. Please join us for this evening of sisterhood. This is open to all women.
