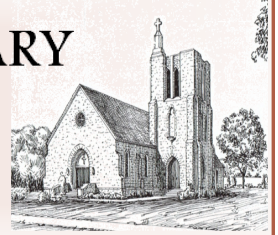

FROM ROSIE'S DESK

I read a great article this weekend on the Presentation of the Gifts that I want to share.

"What is the meaning and purpose of bringing the bread, wine and collection basket to the front of the altar during mass? In slang terms

we call this 'bringing up the gifts' to the altar. The more formal term used to describe this action is 'presentation of the gifts' or the 'offertory procession' which means processing or bringing to the altar the offerings of the people.

History tells us that the 'offertory procession' is one of the most ancient customs of the Church. In the second and third centuries the people themselves provided the bread and wine for the Eucharist. Beginning in the third century in Rome, deacons carried and presented to the bishop the gifts brought by the faithful. As the Roman liturgy or way of celebrating Eucharist spread to other lands, the offertory procession became a true procession of all the people who brought forth not only bread and wine but at times also oil, candles, wheat, grapes, and other items of precious value. Since this procession was meant to compliment the communion procession later

during the Eucharist, those who presented gift were expected to receive the Eucharist; the transformed bread and wine they offered was returned to them, transformed and changed into the living presence of Christ. The offertory procession gradually disappeared for a time during the Middle Ages due to the decrease number of communicants; for a period of time a large number of people attended the Eucharist but did not receive communion because of the belief they were unworthy or undeserving.

Today, the original order of the Mass has been restored to once again include a simple procession of gifts. The procession of the gifts is intended to carry a spiritual meaning. It is symbolic of how the community of believers bring their various gifts to the altar as an expression of praise and thanks to God. We bring the gifts of bread and wine, which God transforms into the living presence of Christ. We bring the material gift of money which God transforms into works of faith, hope and love through the Church. We bring the gift of ourselves, who God transforms into the image and likeness of Christ. The offertory procession is a recognition of how all good gifts find their source.

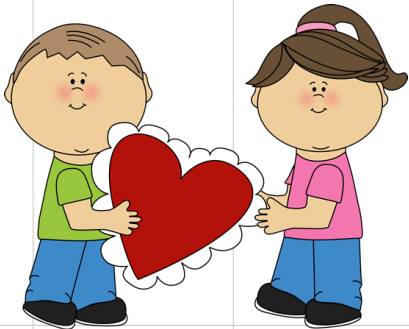
