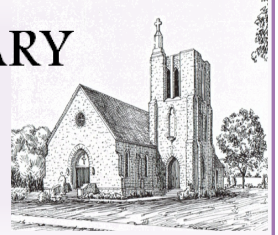

CAPITAL CAMPAIGN UPDATE

As of the end of January, there is \$1,150,979 pledged to the Church Renovation. Of this, \$658,107 has already been given and is collecting interest. The Renovation Committee has been working with the architect to develop a plan to present to the church members by early summer. The plan is to do the construction in the summer of 2017. The committee thanks each and every person for their donation.

RECTORY REMODEL

As was mentioned at Mass on the weekend of March 19-20, the Rectory is in need of significant remodeling. There has no major updating for at least 40 years. The HVAC systems, as one example, are well over 20 years old. To date, a little over \$145,000 has been donated for this specific purpose. None of these funds are part of the Capital Campaign for the Church or the School Campaign. We will continue to update as decisions are made. Again, the parish leadership is humbled by your generosity.

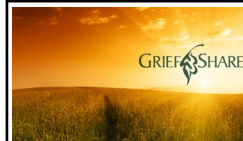



STEM at Manhattan Catholic Schools

Manhattan Catholic Schools has received an anonymous grant to fund a **STEM** Program and Coordinator for five years. **STEM** is an acronym for **Science, Technology, Engineering and Math**, a career readiness push in the United States. The STEM program will start in the 2016-17 school year.

Our vision for the STEM Program/Coordinator:

1. Develop a comprehensive plan for K-8 STEM activities with students, teachers, parents and community.
2. Support K-8 teachers with the science curriculum and STEM activities.
3. Connect MCS to the STEM community to allow learning outside of school. This is a great opportunity for our students who may eventually seek employment in the STEM fields.
4. Engage parents with opportunities for their children outside of school and during the summer break.
5. Provide leadership for our teachers and seek professional development opportunities for the staff in the STEM fields.

We are excited about this opportunity! Development of this program will help set us apart from other educational institutions in Manhattan and the surrounding area.

A Major Degree was held on February 13, which will give candidates the ability to participate in First, Second, Third, or all three Degrees in the same day. The ceremonies were held at St. Thomas More parish hall. The Council also welcomes Roger's son, Justin Bauer, who has rejoined the Order after once being a Knight in California.

The Council was privileged to hear a presentation by Deb Kluttz, executive director of The Homestead, which is a ministry extension of Westview Community Church, serving women who have exited the sex industry. A support structure is in place for women to escape the industry and begin to reintegrate back into independent living. Ms. Kluttz said there are great resources by volunteers to help the women learn new trades and be able to advance their lives.

A three hour adoration will be held following the Holy Thursday service on March 24. Different organizations within Seven Dolors have been asked to sponsor an hour of the adoration. The Knights of Columbus has been assigned the third hour of adoration from 11pm to midnight. All Knights are encouraged to participate in the adoration hour. Night Prayer will final hour starting at 11:45pm.

The Knights of Columbus Council # 1832 will grant two one-time non-renewable \$500 scholarships for post high school education. In granting scholarships, priority consideration will be given to those whose father, guardian, or grandfather is active in the Seven Dolors Council's activities. Other considerations are stewardship activities for the church & community, academic record, and your financial need. The awards are made at the discretion of the scholarship committee.
