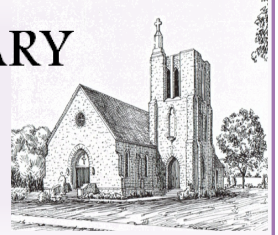

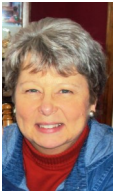

Our Lenten season is coming to an end. Amazing how these last five weeks have blown by.

Here's what I'd like you to think about: The Triduum! Holy Week begins on Palm Sunday, March 20. We have been building up to this very sacred time and each year we are given the opportunity to bring the Lenten season to a grand climax-celebrating the liturgies for the Triduum – those special three days. Mark your calendars now for these special days: Holy Thursday, Good Friday and the EASTER VIGIL!

Hold your hands up if you have attended the vigil...what? You haven't?! Well, you've missed THE best liturgy of all time! Sister Janis used to call it "the mother of ALL vigils!" And you know, she's right! Celebrating Easter vigil is the epitome of all that is embodied in our Catholic liturgy....smells, bells, lights, candles, music, scripture and the sacraments. Starting OUTSIDE with the Easter FIRE! Entering the church in darkness. Now I know you're saying "Oh, that's the one that takes so long...ugh." Ask yourself how many ball games have you sat through? Dance recitals...concerts? The Vigil is at least a celebration where you know most of the people! And what better way to bring in the Risen Lord! You'd be one of the first like Mary Magdalene! So, take off your watches, you don't need to watch the time and put on your new Easter clothes and join us as the candidates we have gotten to know at the 10 o'clock Mass throughout these last few months, make their profession of faith and join our Catholic community. (And there's a party after Mass!)

Divine Mercy Sunday

Our parish will host a Divine Mercy hour of prayer on Sunday, April 3rd at 3:00 pm.

This devotion was established by St. John Paul II for the 2nd Sunday of Easter.

All are welcome.



The St. Patrick's Celebration on March 19th is cancelled this year due to lack of support/attendance. This makes us even more appreciative of those who put this together in past years. We will continue to look at this for next year and beyond.

The Chrism Mass is being held on Tuesday this year, March 15 at the Cathedral in Salina at 11:30am. This is when the bishop blesses three oils — the Oil of Catechumens (oleum catechumenorum or oleum sanctorum) – used for all baptisms, the Oil of the Infirm (oleum infirmorum) – used to anoint the sick and dying, and holy Chrism (sacrum chrisma) – also for baptism. These oils will be used in the administration of the sacraments throughout the diocese for the year. This tradition is rooted in the early Church as noted in the Gelasian Sacramentary (named after Pope Gelasius I, d. 496.) Previously, this Mass was celebration on the Thursday before Holy Thursday. Pope Paul VI introduced the renewal of the priestly commitment into this liturgy. You are welcome to this very beautiful, holy celebration of Eucharist.

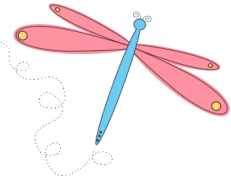

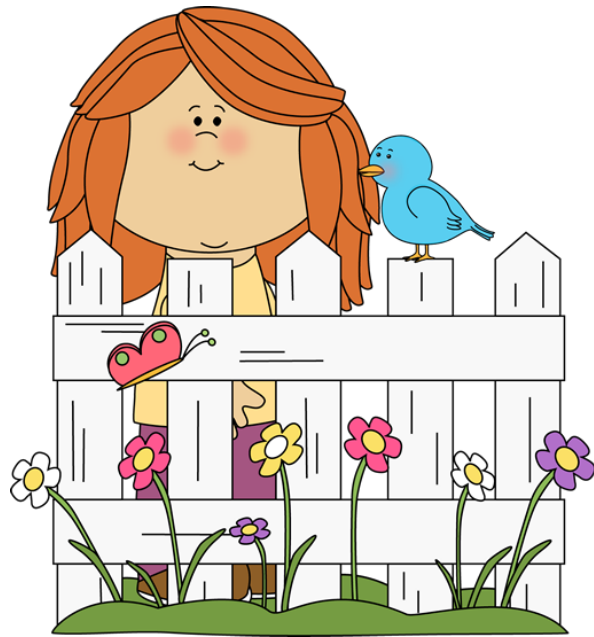

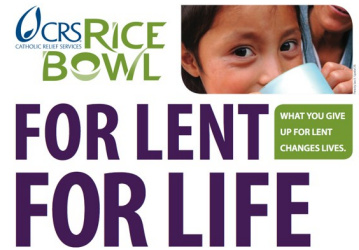
