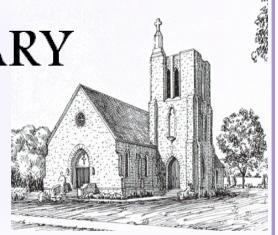

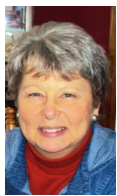

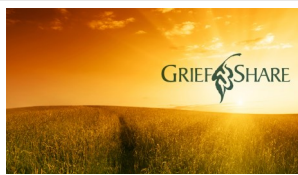
Our Holy Father, Pope Francis, has declared from December 8, 2015 until the end of November, 2016, to be a year of mercy, a time to be aware of God's mercy to us and to extend this mercy to all. As a way to make this concrete, he has challenged us to focus on the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy. The word "corporal" means "body" and thus these works help others meet another's physical needs, e.g., hunger. The spiritual works of mercy assist others to meet the deep needs of our souls, e.g., sound advice when hurting. In the coming weeks, we will list in the bulletin some examples of concrete ways we can exercise these works.

CORPORAL WORKS OF MERCY

Clothe the Naked

ACT:

1. Count your shoes and give a portion to the poor.
2. For every new item of clothing that goes into your closet, give one away.
3. Buy less clothing for yourself; instead, contribute to the needs of the poor.
4. Support programs that provide clothing to help the poor dress for interviews and jobs.
5. Give gently used clothing, with buttons and zippers intact, to the poor.
6. Pass down clothes to a younger sibling/cousin.
7. Change a baby's diaper.

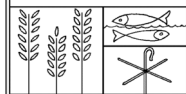

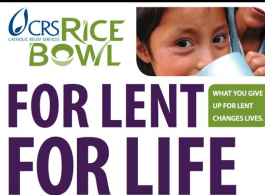


HOLY LAND COLLECTION

RICE BOWLS

The Rice Bowl project gives us a wonderful way to fast, pray and give alms (our Lenten task). We eat less food one meal a week, the money we save we place in the Rice Bowl and then pray for those who will receive the benefit. The Rice Bowls are so named because for many of the world's poor, rice is their daily meal. We bring the Rice Bowls to Holy Thursday Mass as our way of washing the feet of the poor of the world.
