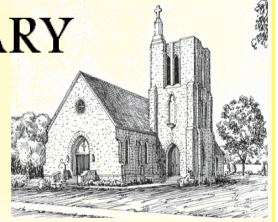
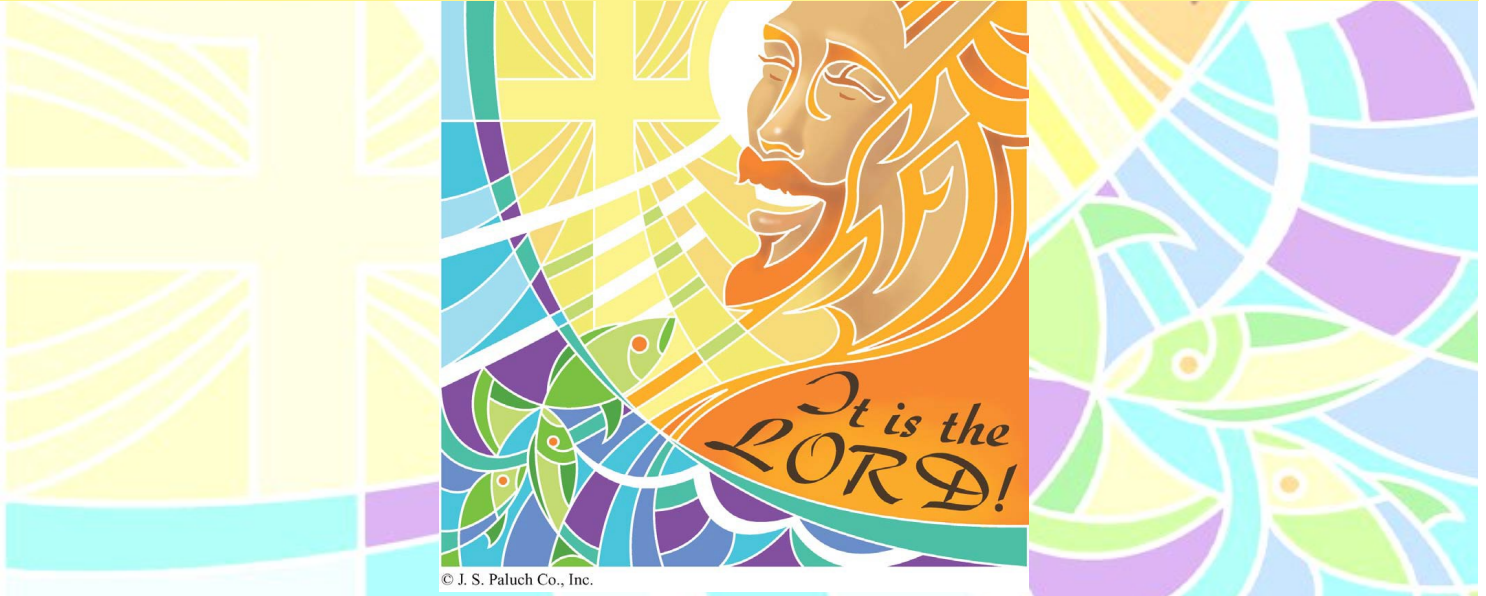

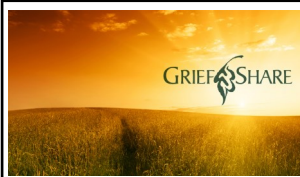
Our Holy Father, Pope Francis, has declared from December 8, 2015 until the end of November, 2016, to be a year of mercy, a time to be aware of God's mercy to us and to extend this mercy to all. As a way to make this concrete, he has challenged us to focus on the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy. The word "corporal" means "body" and thus these works help others meet another's physical needs, e.g., hunger. The spiritual works of mercy assist others to meet the deep needs of our souls, e.g., sound advice when hurting. In the coming weeks, we will list in the bulletin some examples of concrete ways we can exercise these works.

CORPORAL WORKS OF MERCY

Comfort the Sick

ACT:

1. Give your time to be with people who are sick.
2. Visit the homebound you know.
3. Send a card to someone who is ill.
4. Support caregivers.
5. Drive an elderly person to the doctor.
6. Take a sick person some soup.
7. Help a child make a card for a sick person.
8. Pray with someone who is sick, or sick at heart.

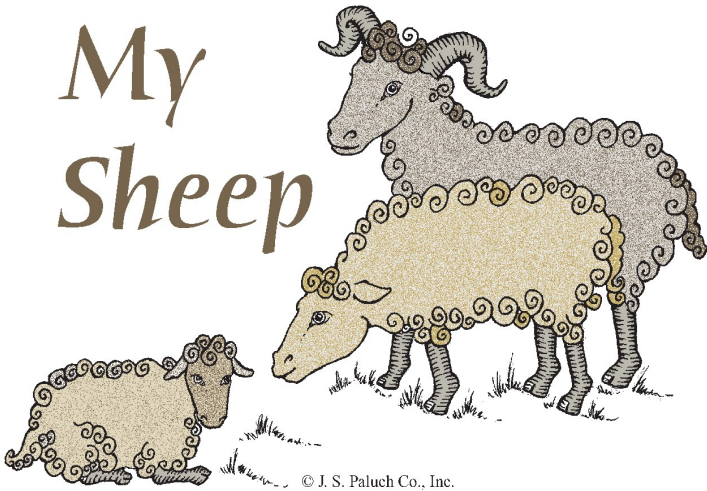
