**DIVORCECARE & DC4K - SEPTEMBER 12TH**  
When a marriage ends it is more than a separation of two people. It is a death of an important part of their lives. DivorceCare is a thirteen week video series offering sessions for those already divorced or in the divorce process. The program provides support and guidance, along with tools to help with the initial stress, anger and guilt.

Are your children angry, hurt and confused about your separation or divorce? A DivorceCare for Kids (DC4K) group is a safe place where kids ages 5-12 can begin to heal while having fun. DC4K meets weekly at the same time as DivorceCare, Mondays at 6:30 beginning 9/12.

## Some Family Guidelines

Do show children that you are concerned about issues. Express your opinions or beliefs about these issues, and share questions you have about issues or candidates. Look for opportunities to state where you stand, but don't push your children to adopt your stance or to support your candidate.

Do ask your child(ren) for their opinions, questions, or concerns. Be genuine with your interest, and really listen to what they have to say. Don't worry if they don't agree with your position. The most important thing is that your children are aware and concerned and that they are thinking about the issues in moral terms.

Do show that you truly respect different points of view on the issues or candidates—that good people can disagree on specific matters without rancor.

Do get involved yourself. If you believe strongly in an issue or candidate—and hopefully you do—take an active role. It's a cliché, but actions do speak much louder than words, especially to our children. Do look for activities that your children or your whole family could get involved in with you.

Do vote and let your children know that you see voting as a priority. Bring your children with you to the polls. Watch the election returns together.



## Prayer Before Elections

*Lord God, as the election approaches, we seek to better understand the issues and concerns that confront our country, and how the Gospel compels us to respond as faithful citizens in our community.*

*We ask for eyes that are free from blindness so that we might see each other as brothers and sisters, one and equal in dignity, especially those who are victims of abuse and violence, deceit and poverty.*

*We ask for ears that will hear the cries of children unborn and those abandoned, men and women oppressed because of race or creed, religion or gender.*

*We ask for minds and hearts that are open to hearing the voice of leaders who will bring us closer to your Kingdom.*

*We pray for discernment so that we may choose leaders who hear your Word, live your love, and keep in the ways of your truth as they follow in the steps of Jesus and his Apostles and guide us to your Kingdom of justice and peace.*

*Amen*

## Voter Guides: Ok for church?

Voter guides can be an informative and helpful guide to a conscientious Catholic when discerning which candidates to support. However, it is an area in which churches must be very careful, lest they put their tax status in jeopardy.

From Bishop Weisenburger's statement on 'Voter Guides': "Your church's 501(c)(3) tax-exemption may be revoked if it engages in any prohibited activity. For example, the Internal Revenue Service, in 1995, revoked the tax exemption of the Church at Pierce Creek in upstate New York after the church paid for newspaper advertisements in opposition to a presidential candidate in the 1992 election. Revocation would result in the organization's income for the year becoming subject to income tax."

For this reason, the Bishop, while not banning the use or distribution of voter guides, is insisting that they be unbiased. We cannot risk the appearance of supporting or condemning any one candidate. Please do not attempt to distribute any literature on church property without having it approved by Fr. Kerry.

Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults is a process designed for individuals discerning the possibility of joining the Catholic Church. It is an adult look at the Catholic faith and is meant to be a means to grow in relationship with God through the Catholic Church. The sessions are conducted by the RCIA Team which is composed of members of each parish. They mentor those on their journeys of faith. This collaborative process is comprised of team members from Seven Dolors and St. Thomas More Parishes. Sessions begin on September 15 and continue to just after Easter. In addition to the weekly sessions, apprenticeship opportunities are encouraged. There are three required rituals for catechumens and candidates: The Rite of Acceptance, The Rite of Election and The Easter Vigil. Breaking Open the Word is the discussion of weekly scriptures from the Sunday Mass.
