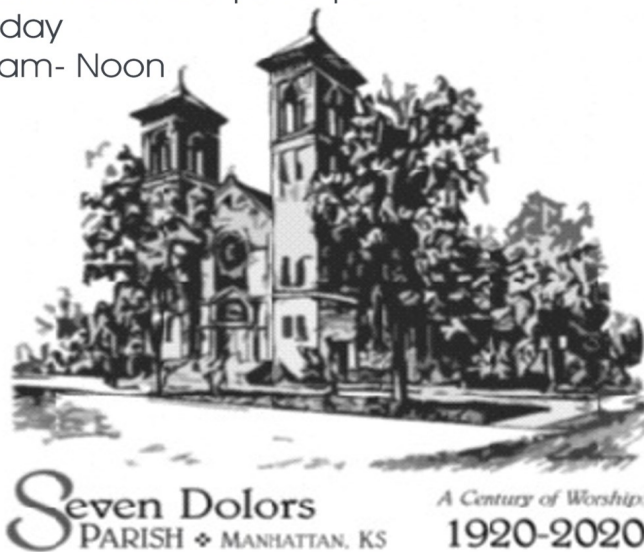

# VOTING OUR FAITH

a reflection from a priest of the Salina Diocese

The Catechism of the Catholic Church tells us we have a moral obligation to exercise the right to vote (#2240). The Catechism also tells us “it is the duty of citizens to contribute along with the civil authorities to the good of society in a spirit of truth, justice, solidarity, and freedom” (#2239). This means we must discern which candidates for public office will likely contribute the most to truth, justice, solidarity and freedom.

Our Catholic moral framework does not fit the rigid ideologies of “right” or “left,” or the platform of any political party. As Catholics we are called to be a community of conscience, testing every candidate and party for how they affect human life and dignity, and how they pursue justice and peace. The Church doesn’t tell individual believers how they should vote by endorsing or opposing candidates. Rather, the role of the Church is to share our social teaching, to highlight the moral dimensions of issues, to participate in debate on public policy, and to witness to the Gospel. By doing this the Church aspires to help a person form their conscience. Believers are to bring their well-formed and well-informed conscience to bear when deciding to vote for a particular candidate. This means choosing our nation’s leadership is not a popularity contest. Voting may be more fun if we “like” the candidates, but to vote our conscience is a grace and a virtue.

The U.S. Bishops’ raise a series of questions to assist believers in gaining a well-informed conscience. Please find below a list of some of those questions:

- How can our nation not turn to violence to solve some of its most difficult problems - abortion to deal with difficult pregnancies; the death penalty to combat crime; euthanasia and assisted suicide to deal with the burdens of age, illness and disability; and war to address international disputes?
- How will we address the tragic fact that more than 30,000 children die every day as a result of hunger, international debt, and lack of development around the world?
- How can health care better protect human life and respect human dignity?
- How will our society combat continuing prejudice, overcome hostility toward immigrants and refugees, and heal the wounds of racism, religious bigotry and discrimination?
- How will our nation pursue the values of justice and peace in a world where injustice is common, desperate poverty widespread, and peace is too often overwhelmed by violence?

These are some of the serious issues candidates should be discussing. If they are not, we should continue to ask them as part of our Christian duty.

## PASTORAL COUNCIL POINTS:

The Pastoral Council met on its usual 3rd Monday of the month (October 17) at 7:00 in the Parish Center. Some items discussed: Under Financial Report, it was noted that parish ordinary income giving increased after Fr. Kerry's letter, but it has now fallen off. The parish did purchase a new copy machine and we are very grateful to donors who purchased ads on the back of the bulletin that assist us with this. The Liturgy Commission reported that they discussed Advent preparation, Confession times for Christmas, Mass times for Holy Days (Nov 1 and Dec 8) and Christmas. We will read the names of the deceased of the previous year at the Masses on the first weekend of November. The Rite of Acceptance for RCIA will be celebrated at the 10:00 Mass on November 20. Parish Life was glad for all who enjoyed the Picnic and are reviewing it for next year's celebration.

Under general comments, members stated they really enjoyed the Parish Mission at St. Thomas More. Fr Kerry told them that St. Isidore's is having a Parish Mission the three days before Ash Wednesday to which all will be invited (Feb 26-28). Fr. Carlos said that two Sisters from Mexico (who have residence in Salina) are visiting the parish each Friday and on Sundays to make home visits and to prepare children and adults for the celebration of sacraments.

### RITE OF ACCEPTANCE



On Sunday, November 20, the Feast of Christ the King, Seven Dolores Parish will celebrate the Rite of Acceptance for our Catechumens and Candidates. This is the first of the "threshold rites" of the RCIA process and the first public ritual. In this Rite, a change of identity takes place: those previously known as Inquirers become catechumens – the unbaptized or candidates – the baptized. They are officially welcomed by the Church as "disciples in training". They are literally marked with the cross of Christ as God's own. Our responsibility as a parish is to travel this journey with them by showing them examples of what BEING a Catholic Christian is all about.
