New Chapel at Via Christi Hospital

On October 12, Bishop Weisenburger blessed the new Chapel, named Mercy Chapel, at Via Christi Hospital. The name of the chapel was a way to encompass Via Christi Hospital's past, present and future. When Memorial Hospital and Saint Mary Hospital joined to become Mercy Regional Health Center in 1996, two distinct histories of care combined to become one community led hospital.

Creation of a worthy chapel was part of the 15.5 million construction project. The chapel is a sanctuary for hospital patients, family members and associates of all faith traditions. At the same time, it is a Catholic chapel.

As a way to assist family members of patients, hospital personnel and the wider Catholic community, Catholic Mass will be celebrated the first and third Friday of each month at 12:00 noon. The community is welcome to participate.

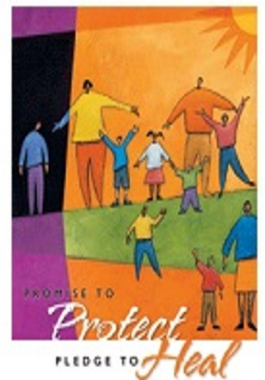

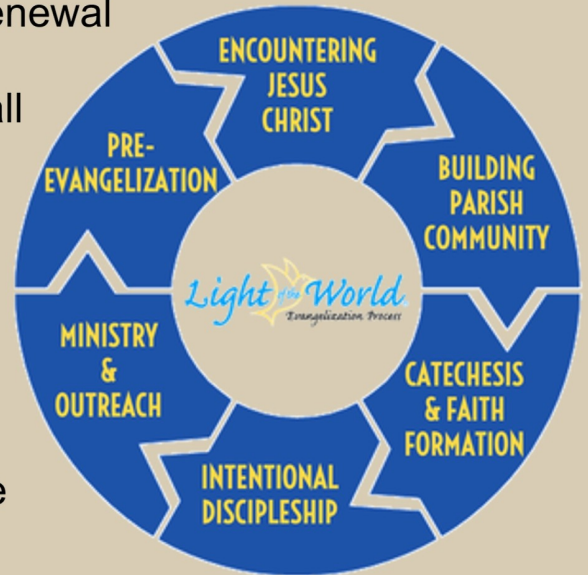


Light of the World Evangelization Retreat is coming to the St. Thomas More Parish **January 27, 28, and 29, 2017.**

Ruminations with ROSIE

As you know, with the start of this new liturgical year, the Holy Year of Mercy comes to an end. BUT it doesn't mean we forget what mercy means to us in the Catholic Faith. The first thing that always comes to my mind when I associate mercy with the Catholic church is the WORKS OF MERCY. The Corporal Works are: Feed the hungry, Give drink to the thirsty, Clothe the naked, Shelter the homeless, Visit the sick, Visit the imprisoned and Bury the dead. The Spiritual Works are: Counsel the doubtful, Instruct the ignorant, Admonish the sinner, Comfort the Sorrowful, Forgive injuries, Bear wrongs patiently and Pray for the living and the dead. I want to address the last Corporal Work of Mercy - BURY THE DEAD. We have just finished celebrating the Feast of All Saints and All Souls. You probably even put a name or two into the Book of the Dead...but have you considered that when our parish has a funeral, we are all invited to fulfill the last Work of Mercy by attending the funeral? Now I realize that many of us work during the day, making it impossible for us to celebrate someone's life at a funeral BUT many of us don't have jobs and/or are retired. Next time you hear or read that Seven Dolors is celebrating someone's life at a funeral Mass, consider coming to fulfill that Work of Mercy! Most of the time you won't know the person we are burying...that doesn't matter. You don't need to know the person who has died. Sometimes the attendance at a funeral is VERY small due to the size of the family or the extended family has moved away etc. We, as a parish, can be such a sign of comfort to the family when we attend the funeral Mass of someone we don't know. This Advent, this beginning of the new church year, ponder the thought of making this your "new liturgical year's" resolution. Let's Bury the Dead as a parish community.

Judy is the executive director of the Manhattan Crisis Center, which includes the Emergency Shelter and crisis hotline. She has been director for 23 years. The program helps victims of domestic and sexual abuse and operates a 24-hour crisis hot line. Its services cover five surrounding counties. One of the more interesting features of the program is the PRA, or police response advocate, who arrives on a domestic violence call to be there for the parties involved to voluntarily speak to, and provides immediate help for those that request it. Thanks to Judy for speaking to the Council about the crisis program of Manhattan.
