# Shepherd's Crossing Update

The Annual Meeting for Shepherd's Crossing is Monday, January 30th at St. Thomas More Parish Hall. We have supported Shepherd's Crossing for as long as they have been in existence. Seven Dolors was included on the original board over 10 years ago. The 2016 yearly is: 35 churches gave \$75,700; Individual/business/organization gave \$180,000. Over 750 households were helped with \$135,100 for Utilities; 129 households were helped with \$8,400 for prescriptions; 550 households were helped with \$142,200 for rent; and 39 people were helped with \$1000 for Birth Certificates/Drivers Licences/I.D.'s. Total for the Year of 2016: \$286,700 helped 1,460 people in their emergency needs. 23 volunteers gave more than 2000 hours of service. Fairy Godmother & Guardian Angels applications totaled 79. Lions Club Referrals were 23.

# Parish Pastoral Council Notes


Council Members are: Fr. Kerry, Rosie Rundell, Fr. Carlos, Jolene Amtower, Lucille Johnson, Dennis Kuehler, Cathie Lavis, Pat McCoy, Joe McGraw, Tammy Pachta, Delores Thomas and Ray Buyle. Following are reports from the last meeting. **Capital Campaign:** The Committee met on November 28. There will be a presentation by Fr. Kerry and Ray Buyle to parishioners on a weekend in the near future and will show what the newly renovated church will look like. **Rectory renovation:** According to Fr. Kerry, the work is scheduled to begin the middle of February and last four months. **Latino Ministry:** Fr. Carlos reported the nuns from Salina continue to come to Manhattan two days a week. They visit homes and help prepare the children for First Communion and Confirmation. The Guadalupe celebration was well attended. The dancers did a fantastic job. They were not only from the Manhattan area, but several other countries were represented as well. **Commission Reports: Liturgy:** No report. The commission will meet this coming Wednesday. **Catholic Formation:** Currently there are 20 catechists, the most for a number of years. A total of 122 students are enrolled which is a nice increase. 30 students are doing First Reconciliation & Communion and 29 will be Confirmed. For CYO/YDisciple, the attendance has doubled from last year. A copy of the report listing happenings, upcoming trips and fundraising events is attached and becomes a permanent part of these minutes. **Parish Life:** Jolene reported that the planned New Year's Eve Celebration was canceled as only 30 reservations were received. The Parish Birthday Dinner will be April 2 and will have a "Saints" theme. It will be catered. **Building and Grounds:** There will be a report from Liason Pat McCoy at the next meeting. **Evangelization:** Dennis Kuehler was not there but a meeting will be scheduled. **Stewardship/Social Action:** Lucille said the Giving Tree had great support. Father had thank you notes from the families who received gifts and they were very grateful. **Old Business: Mission:** Rosie was unable to make contact with Deacon Ralph Poyo so she will look for another speaker for the Parish Mission in October.

# Stewardship Spotlight: Dennis Jones

Let us introduce you to Dennis Jones. Dennis came to Manhattan in 1956 with his parents and brother. He was baptized in St. Paul, Minnesota. Dennis is a product of our Catholic school system, having attended Seven Dolores Grade School and graduating from Luckey High School. He has been involved in our parish for many years, serving on various committees and parish organization. To Dennis, listening is an important facet of good stewardship. We need to listen to the Holy Spirit! The Holy Spirit guides us in discerning how to use the Time, Talent and Treasure we have been given. He also recommends listening to the Church and to the people around us. They reveal their need in one way or another. Listen to cries for help and for ways to serve. His favorite act of stewardship is serving as an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion. In his words "It is an awesome and awe-inspiring experience to help bring Christ's Sacred Body and Precious Blood to the faithful. Whether at Mass or in homes, I find myself grinning at the knowledge of what is occurring around me." Dennis thinks of Stewardship as Service. Sometimes much is needed, but most often helping others involves only a few moments here or a few dollars there. He prays every day, especially at the Adoration Chapel, for the grace to wisely use what he has been given. He listens to family, friends, and people around him. A few words of encouragement or a willing ear can mean a lot to someone who is hurting. What advice would he give to others about Stewardship? Say Yes! We are afraid that we won't measure up or that our contribution is trivial. Remember that nothing God asks of us is unimportant and that God will always give us the means to serve if we say YES!

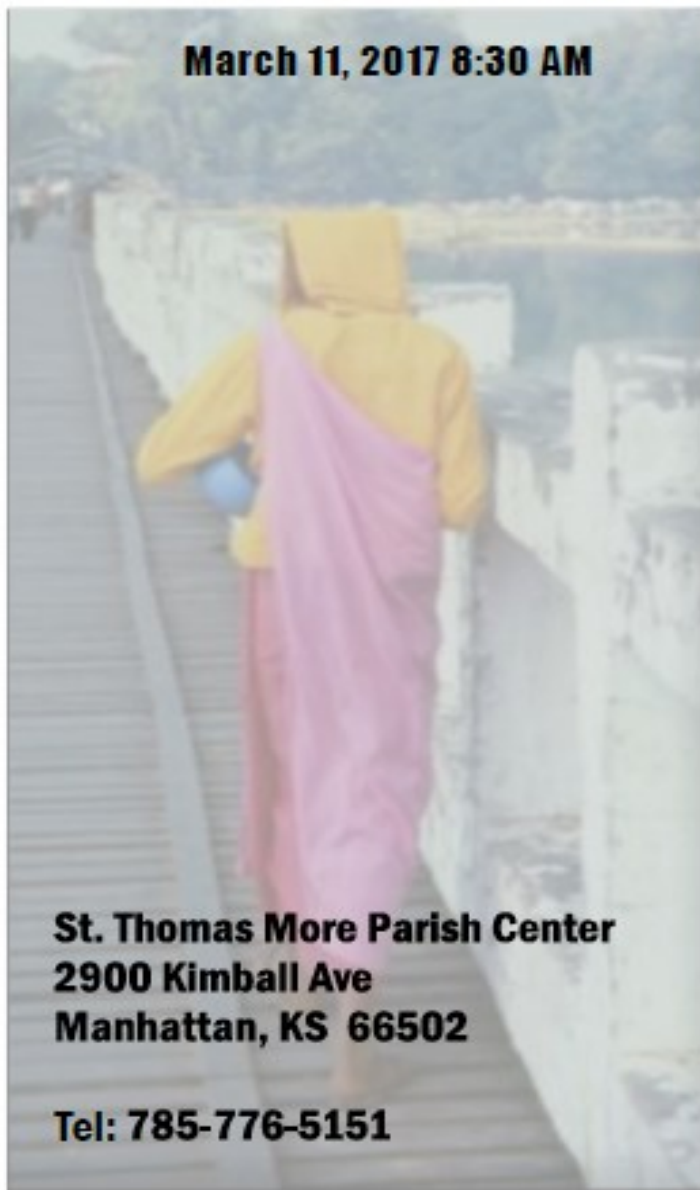


## MINISTERS OF CARE

Sister Edith Prendergast, R.S.C.

Edith Prendergast, R.S.C. was born Catherine (Kathleen) Prendergast in Moneyvroe, Cappoquin, Co. Waterford, to Catherine and Richard Prendergast. She was the fifth of six children to be raised on the family farm in the townland of Affane in the western area of the county. It was in this rural setting that Edith learned that care for those less fortunate was a basic human value that defines who we are in the world before one another and before God. Her father, Richard, was a man who often invited travelers neighbors, strangers and friends, to join the family at table for a meal. Need was met with Richard's quiet graciousness, and this ever-present generosity toward those less fortunate shaped Edith as she eventually grew to discern a vocation to religious life. Edith's primary-level education took place at St. John the Baptist primary school in Affane, from which she graduated and entered secondary school at the Presentation Convent School in Lismore, Waterford. Following her graduation from Secondary School (High School), she sat for state examinations in which she successfully secured employment as a civil servant in the governmental Department of Agriculture. Within a year, however, the strong faith environment and outreach to the needy experienced in her family setting, inspired her to dedicate herself to religious life. Inspired by the story and example of Mother Mary Aikenhead, Edith pursued this vocation with the Religious Sisters of Charity at Milltown, Dublin, entering the convent on February 2, 1959. It was as a novice that the young woman born to Richard and Catherine chose the name Edith in religious life.

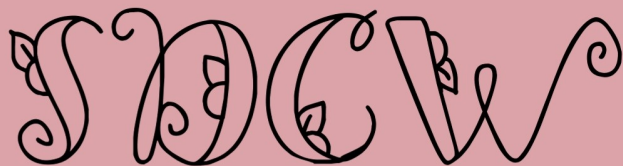

The next big event for the RCIA catechumens and candidates is the Rite of Election. This will be held on Sunday, March 12 in Salina at Sacred Heart Cathedral at 3p.m. Many parishes seem to not quite clearly grasp the reason that a Rite of Election is included in the initiation process. Many believe the purpose of the rite is to introduce the catechumens to the bishop. Or, as an extension of that, to show the catechumens that they are joining the Catholic Church, which is made up of many, many parishes — not just their home parish. Some seem to see the Rite of Election as the catechumens' final choice to be baptized — a grand public declaration that they have finally decided to sign up, literally. None of these, however, are reasons we celebrate the Rite of Election. The reason we celebrate this ritual is given to us in the introduction to the rite: "Thus the Church makes its "election," that is, the choice and admission of those catechumens who have the dispositions that make them fit to take part, at the next major celebration, in the sacraments of initiation." (119). This choice is made by the Church (headed locally by the bishop) as an outward expression of the choice already made by God. Only those catechumens who are "fit/able/qualified" are chosen to enter into the final phase to join the Church. Those chosen are expected to be initiated into a life in Christ, which necessarily means of a life of mission. Before we send the catechumens for election, we must discern not if they know enough to ascent to Catholic belief, but if they are fit enough to take on the rigors of missionary discipleship. Please keep in your prayers Amy Piatt, Diana Fay, Parker Eaves, Lola Oppy, and Airica Voma as they continue on their faith journey.
