PASCHAL MYSTERY

During Holy Week, we will hear this phrase often. It refers to the suffering, death and resurrection of Christ. The word paschal is derived from the Greek, Hebrew and Aramaic word "pasha" or "pesha," which literally means to "pass over." The word often refers to the angel of death "passing over" the houses of the Hebrews as they escaped from Egypt. During Holy Week, we celebrate Christ "passing over" from death into life. Today, we experience the Paschal Mystery in

our daily lives as we move through our own times of suffering onto a dying to ourselves in some way and find that we have come through to a new level of living.

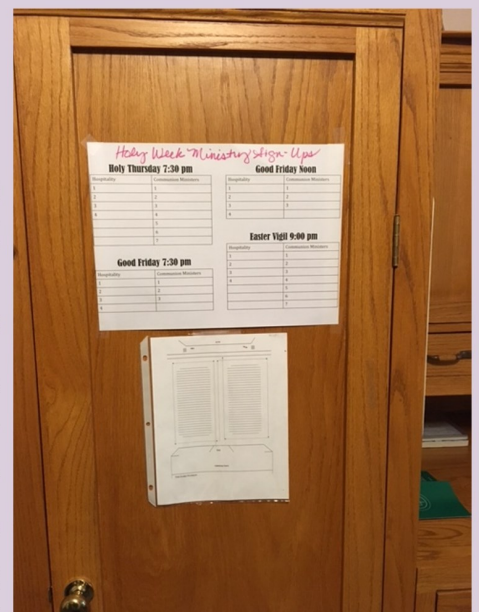

The Sacred Paschal Triduum

Our journey of discipleship is leading us to the Sacred Triduum, the 'Three Days' which celebrate the Paschal Mystery of Jesus' life, Passion, Death, and Resurrection. These days are the center of the liturgical year. During the Three Days, which begin with the Thursday Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper, continue through Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil. We do not reenact historical events - our liturgy celebrates them! On Holy Thursday, we ponder what it means that Jesus washed the feet of the disciples. Our task on Holy Thursday is to respond to the model of service Jesus gave us. God calls us to do as Jesus did. And our sustenance is the Body and Blood of Christ as nourishment. In this sacred meal, we remember and celebrate his everlasting presence with us until he comes again in glory. Good Friday reminds us that we share in Jesus' Passion and Death. Following him would not be easy. Through his Death, the Cross became a tree of life, once for all. Suffering no longer has the final word. Jesus' Cross is the cross of hope and glory. Easter Vigil is the summit of our liturgical year. The proclamation of Christ's Resurrection means we are alive for God in Christ Jesus! The Easter Alleluia is our song as disciples of the Risen One. Let the joy of the Resurrection be palpable in our participation in these great liturgies.



Sister Janis Wagner always called it "the Mother of ALL Vigils!" I call it the BEST celebration of what the Church is all about! It has EVERYTHING in it! Bells, candles, water, oil, incense, Scripture, processions, Baptisms, Choir, Confirmation, Professions of Faith!!! WHEW!!! That's a lot!! But you know what? I wouldn't miss it for the world!! We only get to celebrate like that ONCE a year. It's the time when we welcome those we have watched being dismissed at the 10 o'clock Mass. It's the time we get to celebrate Jesus Resurrection! It's the beginning of the Easter season. It's a time to celebrate your Christian Catholicity! At over two hours, some might be intimidated by the length of the Mass. Please consider experiencing this rich faith tradition as a joyous conclusion to your Lenten journey. We want to invite you to celebrate with us at 9pm on Saturday night, April 15th. We begin outside around the Easter fire. What better way to end the penitential season of Lent? So put on your Easter clothes, take off your watch and join with Seven Dolors parish as we celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus!

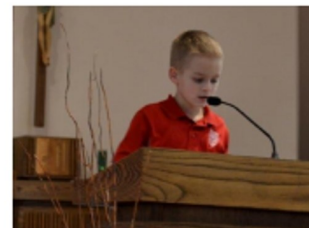

“During the month of April, we give special honor to the Holy Eucharist. The Eucharist, the Second Vatican Council taught us, is ‘the source and summit of the Christian life’ (Lumen gentium, 11). What does that mean? It means that our participation in the Eucharist is the source from which we draw our strength to live as Jesus taught and to serve in his name. It is also the summit, the high point of our communal life. We use the word Eucharist to describe our celebration of the Mass. We use the same word when we speak of the Sacrament of Christ’s Body and Blood. In this month of the Eucharist, let us participate more fully and actively in the Church’s liturgy, our celebration of the Eucharist.” (2017 Sourcebook). And let us take time too, for quiet time in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament in our own Perpetual Adoration Chapel, to become more aware of the wondrous Christ comes to us in the Eucharist. Seven Dolors Parish is made up of so many people who are models for the stewardship way of life. This month we would like to introduce you to the Aikens family. Chris and Christine joined our parish family in 2007 and ten years later, are now a family of four – a son, Damien, and a daughter, Heidi. Christine is a professor at K-State and Chris is a research technician, also at K-State. Christine states their philosophy of stewardship “As each one has received a gift, use it to serve one another as good

stewards of God's varied grace" (1 Peter 4:10). They know that we all have different gifts. Whatever gifts we have can be used to serve others and God. One of the most rewarding and fun things about sharing their gifts is helping with the music for the Puppet Ministry during Advent and Lent. Christine also plays the violin with the strings for our weekend liturgies. They encounter many people at work and in their everyday lives and treating everyone with respect and dignity is an important aspect of how they live out their stewardship. We can also be good stewards of creation, and appreciate God's gifts in nature.

What advice would they give to other families to help them embrace Stewardship more fully? Do whatever you can do. Be the best cake-bakers or cookie-bakers! You might not be able to be as involved as you would like, but there are ways to serve the church and others that do not require a lot of extra time. Lectors and Eucharistic ministers are always needed! Musicians and puppeteers, too! As a challenge, try to do one more thing than you are currently doing whether it is a one-time volunteer event or a longer-term commitment. You'll be glad you did!

PASTORAL COUNCIL UPDATE

The Council will be working on an updated Mission Statement for our parish. One of the questions for them (and YOU) to ponder is "What makes a member of Seven Dolores Parish a good Catholic?" Reports: MCS: Work is being done on the Junior high windows and doors. A new person was hired to help with the janitorial responsibilities. Finance Council: Capital Campaign is progressing. Hispanic Ministry: Fr. Carlos and the Madres have prepared six children for Baptism at Easter Vigil. They participated in the Rite of Sending and the Rite of Election at Sacred Heart Cathedral. Commission Reports: Liturgy Commission has prepared for Lent and are completing Holy Week preparations. Both children's choir and parish choir are doing well. Catholic Formation has updated their guidelines. Totus Tuus and VBS are planned for this summer. Small groups were encouraged to use FORMED. Parish Life is working hard on the annual Parish Birthday Dinner which is April 2. Social Action's focus this year will be establishing the commission and to look into a parish-wide recycling program. Evangelization is working on finding a presenter for the parish mission to held in October. Building and Grounds continues with the upkeep of the parish grounds including the basements of all the buildings. Spring clean-up will be scheduled.

Over 150 women from across the diocese attended the 11th Annual Women's Spirituality Conference sponsored by Seven Dolores and St. Thomas More Women's Group. Despite the snowy forecast, we even had someone from Oakley KS! Sister Edith Prendergast, RSC provided us with several tips on how to incorporate Ignatian Spirituality into our daily lives. The Family Center Budget shop has been a mainstay in our parish for many years. We have three special ladies that are included with eighty other volunteers that make the Budget Shop a valuable asset to our parish and to the community on the whole. We would like to honor the following ladies as they step back from being active in the workings of the Budget Shop, who have given time, energy and love to living the Corporal Work of Mercy: Clothing the Naked.

Marge Schlegel began volunteering in what was known as the Home and School Store located in the Bardwell house formerly located next door to the present Luckey High building. Her youngest daughter came with her until she started school in 1965. In 1968, the parish purchased a little white house at 716 Colorado which housed the shop until 1982 when the present building at 730 Colorado was built. It also housed the childcare facility in the basement. Marge said "It was always fun and I sometimes found items to busy." She regrets having to retire but she is no longer able to drive.

Beatrice Ayon started volunteering at the shop in 1995 after she retired from her position at Irwin Army Hospital. Bea says "Working at the shop was like a big, happy family and the profits all went for a good cause in the community which makes you feel good." Her health has been the reason for retirement.

Mary Delores Schlegel has been volunteering at the back table since the year 2000. She will continue to be in charge of sorting jewelry donations, keeping the jewelry case looking great. She also continues to work retail one day each month.

These three ladies have all volunteered at our Budget shop for a very long time. They all voiced how much they have enjoyed the comradeship of working there and gained great satisfaction in seeing the needs of those who come to the Budget Shop being met through their efforts.

All three worked in the back room sorting the donated items every Monday and Tuesday morning.

These ladies, along with our eighty other volunteers are a true blessing to our mission.
