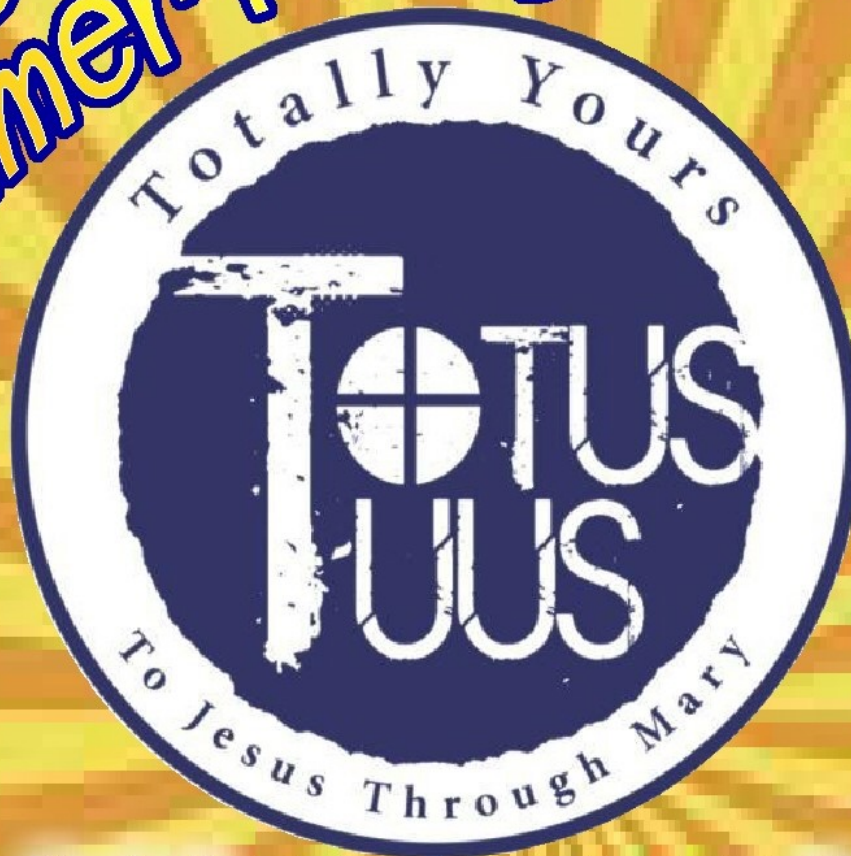

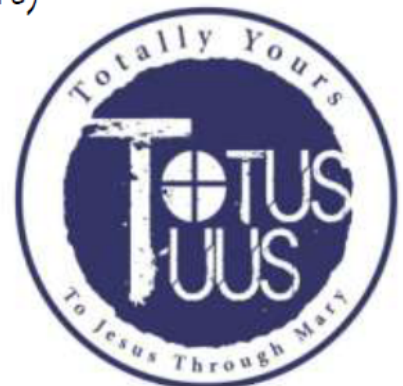

Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults

As Catholics, we are not known for our evangelization skills and the concept is scary for many Catholics. We tend to be quiet about our faith, careful not to offend or make others feel awkward. We absolutely love the meme, "Preach the gospel at all times, and when necessary, use words." That notion seemingly lets us off the hook about talking about our faith. Can't we just live by example and let that serve as our evangelization? No. **The number-one source of new Catholics has been people who marry into the faith.** Here are some simple suggestions for inviting new people into the church – pick one!

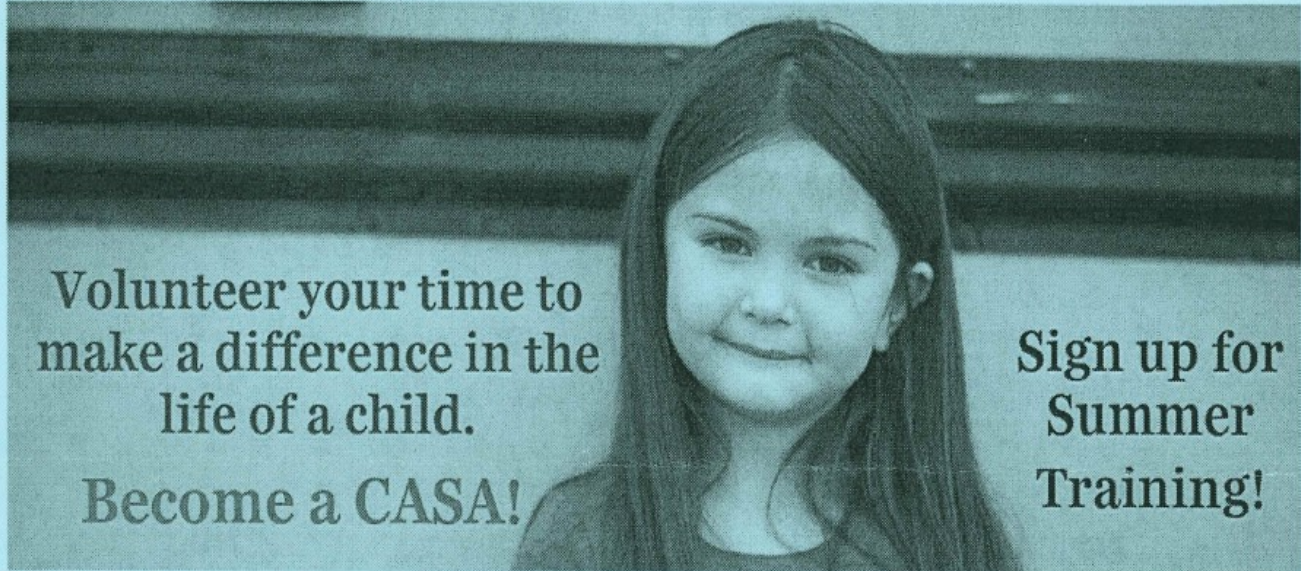
1. Change your perception of yourself. Think of yourself as someone who shares faith with others. For example, if asked, "What do you do in your parish?", reply: "Primarily, I share my faith, and I help others grow in faith." Even if you can't bring yourself to say that out loud, think it to yourself before you reply.
 2. Pray daily that the Holy Spirit will give you a chance to share your faith with someone.
 3. Talk to strangers. Talk to people at the grocery store, the coffee shop, on the bus or subway, or at a restaurant. Set a goal for 3-5 conversations a day with strangers.
 4. Talk about everyday life. You don't have to begin the conversation with a deep religious question. Use Jesus as your model. He didn't walk up to the woman at the well and begin by asking her about her faith life and her many husbands. He asked for a drink of water. Just ask for a drink. Or comment on the weather. Or what you had for dessert. Or the latest victory of your home team. Just start things off, and see where the conversation goes.
 5. If it feels right, ask a deeper question. Don't force the conversation to a deeper level, but don't shy away from it either. What's the worst that could happen? Here are few example questions, but come up with your own that fit your personality and interests:
 - How are you growing personally?
 - What single thing would you like to make absolutely certain you do (if at all possible) during your lifetime?
 - How do you think a person can keep from becoming a workaholic?
 - What do you consider to be two major turning points in your life?
 - What is something you consider to be a great personal success? Why was it so significant?
 - What is the key to maintaining balance in your life?
- After you ask a question, just listen. Try to hear the answer beneath the answer. Pope Francis says our job is to bind up the wounds. Listen for the wound. You don't have to do anything about the wound right now. Just deeply listening is a healing action.
7. If it feels right, offer to pray either with or for the person about what they shared with you. Again, don't force prayer upon someone who isn't open to it, but don't automatically assume they aren't interested in your prayer, even if they said they aren't religious. Let the Holy Spirit guide you.
 8. If it feels right, invite the person to join you at church this coming Sunday and call Rosie at the Parish Center 565-5000.

6 Ways I Can Make My Parish Better

- 1. Think of yourself as part of a parish family.** Family members share a common heritage and history. Family members don't always agree, but they do feel a strong commitment to one another and to the family as a whole.
- 2. Be welcoming.** Introduce yourself to people you don't know, especially if they are sitting alone in church or standing by themselves. If they're new, offer to give them a tour, introducing them to other parishioners, or simply telling them why you love our parish.
- 3. Use your gifts and talents for the good of the parish.** God has given each person unique gifts and talents that are intended to be shared. Filling out the Stewardship form (Time-Talent-Treasure) is a great way to help Seven Dolors. Be the best cookie maker or cake baker there is! That IS a gift!
- 4. Attend parish events.** Take advantage of opportunities to meet new people, feel more connected, and affirm your fellow parishioners who work hard to plan and execute these events. Our next event is the annual Parish Picnic to honor our parish feast day. The picnic is September 10.
- 5. Support our parish financially.** You know how expensive it is to run your own home. Parishes face even higher costs – and we are in the midst of raising funds to start on the renovation of our almost 100-year-old church to celebrate the anniversary in a few short years. If you haven't pledged an amount and feel a call to help, contact Erin at the finance office.
- 6. Pray for our parish.** Keep Fr. Kerry, Fr. Carlos, Fr. Merlin, the parish staff and fellow parishioners in your daily prayers. Pray also for the return of Catholics who have strayed from the practice of the Faith, people who have been hurt by the Church, people raised with no faith and people searching for meaning and purpose in life.

No parish is perfect and even the best parishes can improve. Imagine what would happen if every person in our parish did one little thing to make Seven Dolors Parish better!

- *document management (print / no print; color / black and white)





Why should I consider recycling?

- Recycling eases the landfill burden.
- Recycling saves energy and natural resources.
- Recycling reduces litter and contributes to a cleaner environment.

Here's some of the things we will eventually be looking at collecting, which are basic materials accepted for recycling: aluminum cans, food and beverage glass, plastic jugs, bottles (#1-7 plastics only), steel cans, paper and magazines, cardboard & newspaper.

Be watching for more information in the next newsletters about what we, as a parish, will be collecting and when it will start. If you are interested in being part of the Recycling Team, call the Parish Center. Social Action Commission meets again in July.

Thoughts for June

The feast of **Corpus Christi** falls on Father's Day this year. Perhaps take a moment to make the connection to our father's as the first teachers of the faith and the sharing and nourishing the faith through the Eucharist.

On the Friday following the Solemnity of Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, we celebrate the Solemnity of the **Most Sacred Heart of Jesus**. Because this solemnity usually falls in June, the month of June is also known as the "Month of the Sacred Heart." Devotion to

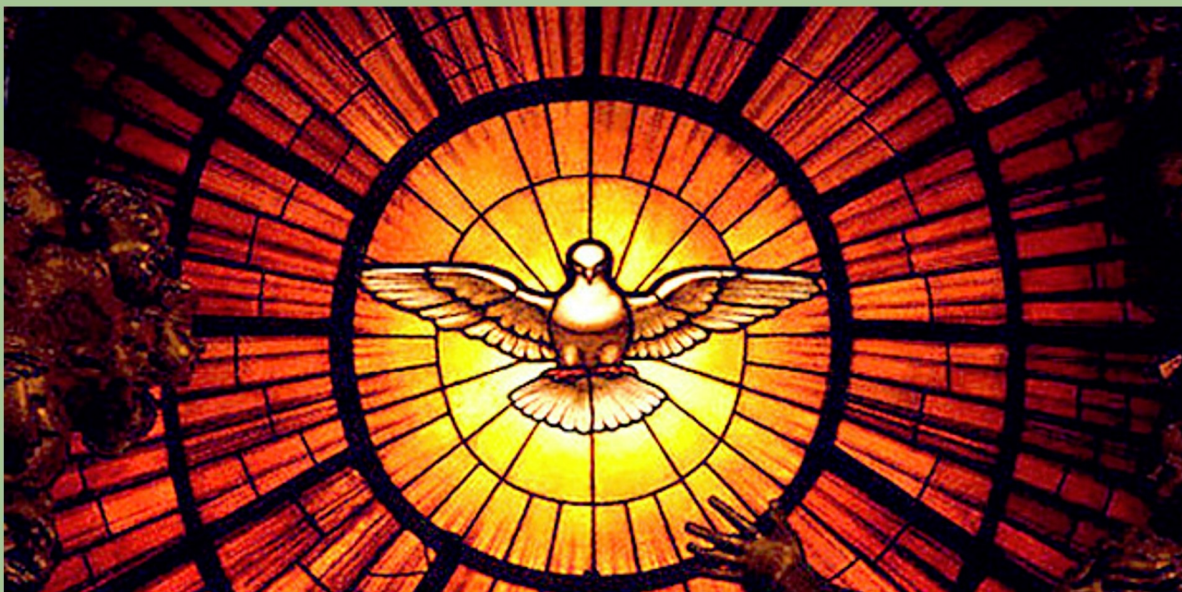


the Sacred Heart of Jesus is all about pondering Christ's love and meditating on Christ's suffering.



Also, on the Solemnity of **Pentecost**, the Church deserves the same energy and creativity from the faithful as the celebrations of Triduum and Christmas. The Greek word for Pentecost means "fiftieth," and in early Christianity it referred to the entire fifty days of Easter. The roots of Pentecost can be found in the Jewish festival of Weeks (Shavuot). The fifty-day celebration following

Passover. It was a harvest festival in which the first fruits of the harvest were offered to God in gratitude. It eventually became associated with the giving of the Torah on Mount Sinai. Early Christians reinterpreted the Jewish festival as a commemoration of the coming of the Holy Spirit, since Acts records that the Holy Spirit came to the disciples when the festival of Pentecost was fulfilled. The celebration of Pentecost may begin on Saturday afternoon or evening with the Vigil. By the end of the fourth century in the West, Pentecost became a time for the initiation of those not baptized at Easter. Recall one of your own Sacrament of Initiation - your Confirmation. What is your Confirmation name? Have you been true to their model? On June 4, wear **RED** to celebrate this great feast!
