Immaculate Heart of Mary



The month of August is dedicated to the Immaculate Heart of Mary.

The memorial of the Immaculate Heart of Mary takes place on the day after the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, usually in June, but in this month when we celebrate Mary's Assumption (August 15) and her Coronation or Queenship (August 22), we also give honor to her Immaculate Heart. There are many prayers to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. Here is one short enough to memorize and pray every day during this special month: *O Immaculate Heart of the Blessed Virgin Mary, obtain for me from Jesus a pure and humble heart.* (Sourcebook 2017 LTP)

The Transfiguration & The Assumption of Mary

The Feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord reminds us about the depth of mystery that surrounded Jesus Christ – mystery in the sense that we can never exhaust who he really is or categorize him in any way. Fully human, he may indeed have needed a tent or a place to camp on the mountain, like Peter asked. But just when the apostles may have been getting really comfortable with their understanding of Jesus as friend and teacher, they catch a glimpse of his heavenly glory, challenging them to remain open to Christ communicating to them who he is as son of God. We have moments like the Apostles each time we encounter and grapple with a new and challenging image of God in the scriptures. Remaining humble and open to the revelatory action of God's Word and Spirit is a way to enter ever more deeply into the mystery of who God is for us in Jesus Christ. (sourcebook 2017 ltp)

August 15th, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. This day we celebrate the promise of God expressed fully in the life of Mary. God invites us to eternal life, to enjoy the glorious new creation of his son in body, soul, and spirit. Our final hope is the resurrection of our own bodies at the end of time to exist forever in this new order of creation. The Solemnity of the Assumption is our great celebration of this final hope. Mary is a pioneer for us in faith. She was the first among us to accept Jesus Christ into her life. In her bodily assumption, she is also the first to fully enjoy eternal life at the side of her risen son in the glory of heaven. Where she has gone, we hope to follow. We rejoice in the fulfillment of God's promise in her, as we turn to her to guide us to the side of her risen son who reigns in heaven. (sourcebook 2017 ltp)

What is the difference between a feast and a solemnity? In the hierarchy of eucharistic liturgies, solemnities celebrate events, beliefs, and personages of greatest importance and universal significance in salvation history. Feasts are celebrations of lesser significance.

WORSHIP & FAITH: FALL ITV

Worship and Faith, a 3 hour course, will be available this fall at St. Thomas More over Interactive Television. Fr. Frank Coady will be the instructor. This is an excellent opportunity for Adult Ed.! You can take it for credit or for personal enrichment so that your faith grows in understanding of what the Church is all about.

COURSE DESCRIPTION: The Church's Creeds evolved out of a doctrinal concern, but they were always more than doctrine; they were prayed by the Christian community. The way the Church prayed her faith, primarily in the Eucharistic gathering, even contributed to the formation of the New Testament. For every generation, the principal gateway into the faith is the way it worships. Thus worship must be regarded as one of the most vigorous and central elements of the Pastoral Ministry Formation curriculum. This course will consider the relationship between liturgical prayer and religious imagination, focusing particularly on the meaning liturgy can have for contemporary Catholics, as well as present day challenges.

The class will be held Saturday mornings, 8:30 - 12:00 noon on Sept. 9, 16, 23, Oct. 7, 14, 21, 28, Nov. 4 and 11. To register, go to dcdioocese.org. Safe Environment

Each Parish and School in the Diocese of Salina has a Safety Coordinator, each serving as an extension of the Diocese of Salina, but also to the Office of Child and Youth Protection (OCYP). This position was designed to help the Pastor coordinate the implementation of the parish compliance requirements designed to keep minors safe at their locations. The Safety Coordinator of your parish has a thorough understanding of Safe Environment Policies and procedures and takes care of all the record keeping, reporting and communicating the importance of a safe environment and models behaviors that support the Promise to Protect, Pledge to Heal.

If you currently work or volunteer with minors at your parish your Safety Coordinator has your Safe Environment training records. The Safety Coordinator of your parish is Deb Price. If you are NEW to the Parish or you need to UPDATE (if has been over 5 years since your last training/background check) and you want to work or volunteer with minors or continue to work or volunteer with minors at the parish, please contact Deb Price so she can get you started/updated with the Safe Environment Training for our Diocese.

The Safety Coordinator will oversee your training, answer any questions you may have and make sure your training is properly recorded. Please contact your Safety Coordinator with any questions.

Ways to be a Good Godparent

- * Most importantly, become an example of wholehearted Catholic Christian living for your godchild.

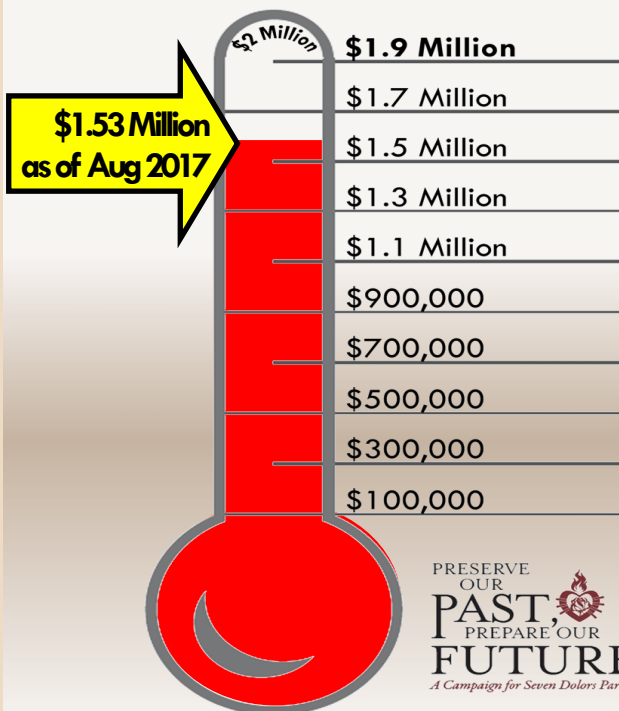
Ways to Keep the Lord's Day Holy

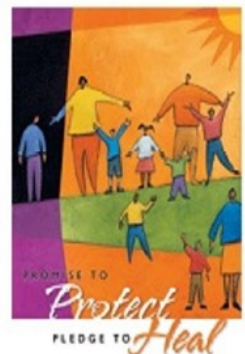
Abuse of Minors Pastoral Response Hotline 785-825-0865

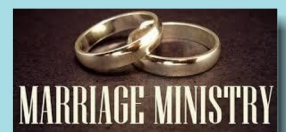
