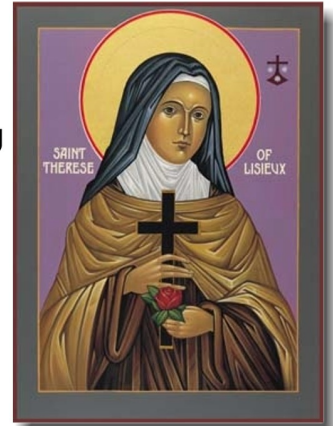

BEING PATIENT WITH YOURSELF

Brother Joseph Schmidt writes of a time when Thérèse of Lisieux counseled someone who was impatient with her own impatience: “Thérèse was asking the sister . . . Can you be willing to be patient with yourself until God gives you the grace to be patient with the sisters? Can you accept and love yourself and not become your own adversary? Can you bear serenely the distress and personal trial of knowing that you have the weakness of impatience? Success in virtue is not the point. Love--love of the sisters in their weakness and love of yourself in your inadequacy--that, Thérèse was trying to say, is the point.”



So I invite you to practice patience. It surely does take practice, and God will no doubt allow you many opportunities to learn. When you are in a hurry or impatient for some particular outcome, first observe the sensation in your body. Notice what this impatience feels like, where it shows up--for example, your jaw, neck, chest, or gut. Be present to the feeling. Slowly expand your awareness to include what your senses are taking in from the outside world--what you see, touch, smell, or taste. Be present to this moment. Let the reality of both your impatience and the outer reality be as they are, without your attachment to them. It is what it is. And all is grace.

St. Joseph's Adoration Chapel

Thank you, thank you, thank you to everyone who signed up to help with adoration hours at the St. Joseph's Eucharistic Adoration Chapel on 8th and Pierre following our promotion on the June 24-25 weekend masses. We had 17 people sign up to be substitute adorers and six others sign up to be full-time adorers. Of the six full-time adorers, four took hours with other permanent adorers and two took vacant hours.

We've also had 35 other people sign up as substitute adorers since we implemented a web-based substitute request system back in March. Since March we have gone from having 2 substitute adorers available to now having 54 substitute adorers on-call. Our sincerest thanks go out to everyone who have helped with taking hours. Not only is this a great blessing for the Adoration Chapel but adorers are constantly coming away with stories of how their lives have been transformed from spending time in front of the Most Blessed Sacrament.

Following is one such testimony from Father Gale Hammerschmidt, pastor at St. Isidore's:

To all who are, or have been, responsible for the continued presence of St. Joseph's Eucharistic Adoration Chapel in Manhattan, I want to say thank you. Many times I wonder if I would be a priest today if it wasn't for that place. I know that God works as He does, and that indeed He probably would have found another way to get me to where I needed to be, but as it happened, it was with the presence of the Eucharist at the St. Joseph Chapel that changed my life. In those years while I taught at Manhattan Catholic Schools the one hour each month that I spent in adoration, gradually allowed me to see that there is no better life on Earth than a life lived for Jesus Christ. Music Liturgy Fall 2017

"For ever I will sing the goodness of the Lord." On behalf of the Seven Dolors musicians, we want to express our appreciation for your participation in joyfully singing at the Masses. It so awesome to hear your voices fill the church in prayer and song. A special thanks to all the Cantors, Parish Choir members under the direction of Joe McGraw, Youth Choir under the direction of Sara Redetzke and instrumentalists for sharing their gift of music and leading us to be a "singing Parish." If any of you are interested in joining this team of musicians, please contact Joe, Sara or Ramona at 565-5000.

Starting on Labor Day Weekend, which also begins the fall season, we will switch from singing the Heritage Mass to the Mass of Christ the Savior. Why do we switch Mass settings throughout the year? Why is the Church decorated differently at different times? Each season throughout the Church year has its unique identity. We have been in Ordinary Time since June 25 and will continue until the 1st Sunday in Advent. Since Ordinary Time, a time of ongoing pilgrimage through our Christian life, is the longest part of the liturgical year, we sing two different Mass settings, one over the Summer and one for Fall in which we will also see more Fall decorations fill the Church.

How do you know what Season we are in and what Mass setting are we doing? Each Sunday, the Cantor begins our celebration by welcoming all visitors and what Sunday we are celebrating. The number of the Mass setting will be posted on the hymn board and the Cantor will remind us for the first two weekends of this change.

Memorial Book

Our parish Memorial Book is in the Gathering Area, which you are welcome to peruse. It is a large red binder book entitled "In Remembrance" on the cover. Inside are honored our deceased in whose name a memorial was left to either Seven Dolors Parish, Manhattan Catholic Schools or St. Patrick's. A Mass is being offered once per month for the repose of all the souls named in the book.

In continuing with the principles of Laudato Si, a World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation is scheduled for September 1.

We live at a time when all Christians are faced with the same decisive challenges, to which we must respond together, in order to be more credible and effective. 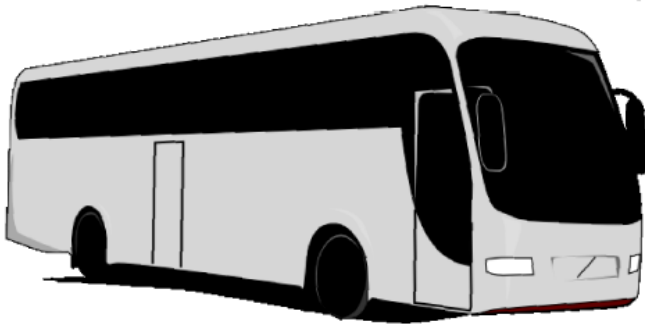

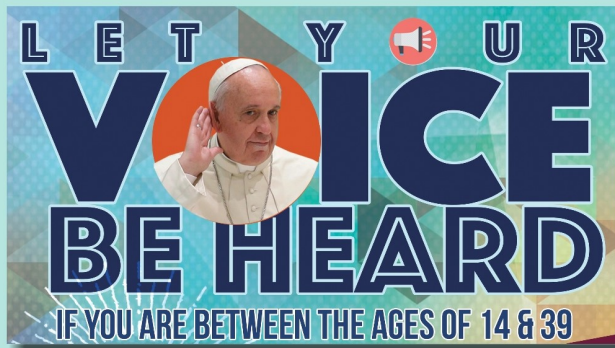

Beck Family: STEWARDSHIP SPOTLIGHT

Joe and Coleen Beck have been active members of Seven Dolors Parish for more than 35 years. They feel that the most important aspect of stewardship is being where God wants you to be at that moment and taking care of what God puts in front of you, whether it's tending to a toddler's runny nose, visiting an older friend, helping with building projects for the church, volunteering at any number of non-profits in the community, or any number of things one might consider tedious or mundane. God gives all an opportunity to live the Gospel.



Stewardship would ask that each of us let God work through us, though it could be in small ways. They truly enjoy the times stewardship involves working with others and the friendships that develop through those opportunities. Laughing and sharing and learning together develops strong bonds of friendship. They try to be aware of opportunities to do good things. Joe shares there is a line from the Knights of Columbus that says, "Let us lead by the example of our lives." This is always in the back of their minds. It was once stated "Christians should leave a place better than when they found it." That might mean pulling up one or two weeds out of the ground on your way to Church or the Chapel or picking up a piece of litter and putting it in the trash. It could mean sewing on a button for a friend who can't see or helping at the bee keepers store to make a better product for sale or shoring up table saws for a non-profit so they work properly. Stewardship definitely involves allowing your time to be used by others. Time is one of the BEST gifts to give. Stewardship calls them to be aware of opportunities to do good things. How does someone promote Stewardship? They recommend starting early with your children. If you want them to understand the importance of our Catholic Christian community and the responsibilities that go with that, get your children involved in service projects early - for family, for neighbors, for Seven Dolors, etc. and emphasize that they are doing it for God. St. Mother Theresa said, "Every day...do something for God."

Have you come downstairs to visit with the **RCIA** candidates yet? You have an opportunity each week to sit in and share your faith story and experiences of being Catholic with those who are contemplating being Catholic after the 10a.m. Mass. Discipleship is not only lived out in the parish, but in the world; we are recognizing that we are preparing people to live in the real world, not only in the sacristy. The Church in every age is called to interpret the signs of the times with the light of the Gospel. The initiation process takes *Gaudium et spes* and does the very same thing.

Tips for Making a Good Confession

- 1 ...pray before going into the confessional, try to recollect and remember our sins
- 2 ...examine our consciences regularly and thoroughly
- 3 ...wait our turn in line patiently; be praying and/or reflecting upon the sins we will confess
- 4 ...come at the time confessions are scheduled, not a few minutes before they are to end
- 5 ...speak distinctly but not so loudly that we might be overheard
- 6 ...state our sins clearly and briefly without rambling
- 7 ...listen carefully to the advice the priest gives
- 8 ...confess our own sins and not someone else's
- 9 ...carefully listen to and remember the penance and be sure to understand it
- 10 ...use a regular formula for confession so that it is familiar and comfortable
- 11 ...never be afraid to say something "embarrassing" ... just say it
- 12 ...never worry that the priest will judge us.... he is usually impressed by our courage
- 13 ...never fear that the priest will not keep our confession secret... he is bound by the Seal
- 14 ..."tendencies" or "struggles" are not sins, but it can be good to discuss them with the priest
- 15 ...never leave the confessional before the priest has finished giving absolution
- 16 ...memorize an Act of Contrition
- 17 ...answer the priest's questions briefly if he asks for a clarification
- 18 ...ask questions if we can't understand what he means when he tells us something
- 19 ...keep in mind that sometimes priests can have bad days just like we do
- 20 ...remember that priests must go to confession, too, so they know what we are going through

Parish Feast Day



SEPTEMBER is the month of Our Lady of Sorrows. On September 15, the Church observes a memorial honoring Mary as Our Lady of Sorrow. "And a sword will pierce your own soul, too," Simeon told Mary when she presented the child Jesus in the Temple forty days after his birth (Luke 2:35). That prophecy was fulfilled when Mary stood at the foot of her son's Cross, sharing his bitter suffering. During this month of September, we honor Mary under the title of Our Lady of Sorrows. This month, let us bring to Mary all our sorrows, knowing that she understands what it is to suffer. This month is good time to draw closer to Mary by meditating on the great hymn to the Mother of Sorrows, Stabat mater, or "At the Cross her Station Keeping." In this beautiful prayer we ask for the grace to feel with Mary, to share her sorrow. Our parish is celebrating this feast with a parish picnic on Sept. 10 at Sunset Zoo.
