Here's a little about the Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica from the Sourcebook. St. John Lateran is one of the four major basilicas in Rome, with St. Peter, St. Mary Major, and St. Paul Outside the Walls. It is unique among the four since it (not St. Peter's) is the cathedral church of the Bishop of Rome, the pope. "Lateran" was the name of a Roman family whose lands were seized for the Church by the Emperor Constantine, and which then became the site of a great basilica dedicated in honor of John the Baptist. For centuries, the old Lateran palace was the residence of the popes. It was only when the popes returned from the Avignon exile in the 14th century that they took up residence at the Vatican. The basilica now has a triple dedication in honor of St. John the Baptist, St. John the Evangelist, and our Lord. Across the front of the basilica is a Latin inscription that says, "This is the mother and head of all churches in the whole world." It is a reminder of why the dedication of this one church is celebrated by the universal Church: we are one family, one flock, and we are led by one shepherd, the successor of St. Peter.

November: the Month of All Souls

On November 1, we celebrate the Solemnity of All Saints, remembering all the saints known and unknown to us who enjoy the glory of heaven. In today's Gospel account we hear the Beatitudes, which are guidelines for true joy and the attainment of sanctity in our Christian lives. We have to live lives of holiness so that we may attain happiness in this life, but even more happiness in the next life as we strive to likewise be numbered among all the saints in heaven.

At Mass, the Collect reminds us of the great cloud of witnesses by which we are surrounded as it tells of how in this one celebration we venerate the merits of all the saints. Thus, we can take comfort in asking for the reconciliation with God "for which we earnestly long" because we can count on the intercessions of so many saints. The Prayer over the Offerings reiterates that we live our lives, and offer this Eucharist, in the communion of Saints, and therefore they celebrate with us. We can experience their solidarity with and concern for us because they are assured of immortality in the Lord. The Solemn Blessings for the Feast of All Saints asks for us all to strive to imitate and be in communion with the saints. Does the dismissal formula "Go in peace, glorifying the Lord by your life" ring true for you? It did for our saints!



Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed (All Souls' Day)

All Souls' Day is unique on the liturgical calendar. Neither a solemnity nor a feast, this commemoration outranks other feasts and even takes the place of a Sunday in Ordinary Time (should this commemoration fall on a Sunday). Prayer for the dead reaches deep into our human history, and it has been our custom from the earliest days of the Church. The belief that our prayers can be of assistance to the dead is a treasured tenet of our Catholic faith. We profess it every time we recite the Nicene Creed: "I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come." This day is the Church's MEMORIAL DAY. Our parish Book of the Dead will be up front in church on the north side. You are welcome to add the names of your loved ones who have died this past year.

Holiday GriefShare

“GriefShare: Surviving the Holidays” will be held on Monday, November 13 at 6:30pm. in the Parish Center, and again on Monday, December 11 at 6:30pm. Whether it’s been one week or ten years since the death of your loved one, come join us as we journey through grief together. The holiday season can be especially stressful and we want to help you through it.

The seminar features practical suggestions and reassurance through video interviews with counselors, grief experts and other people who have experienced the holidays after their loved one’s death. Multiple topics will be addressed. Those attending will receive a book with readings providing additional insights and ideas on holiday survival. RITE OF ACCEPTANCE

Sunday, November 19, Seven Dolors Parish will celebrate the Rite of Acceptance for our Catechumens and Candidates at the 10am Mass. This is the first of the “threshold rites” of the RCIA process and the first public ritual. In this Rite, a change of identity takes place: those previously known as Inquirers become catechumens – the unbaptized or candidates – the baptized. They are welcomed by the Church as “disciples in training”. They are marked with the cross of Christ as God’s own. As a parish, we travel this journey with them by showing them examples of what BEING a Catholic Christian is all about. We should all reflect on how WE have been marked with the Cross of Christ. What does this mean to YOU?

St. Joseph's Adoration Chapel

The St. Joseph’s Adoration Chapel at the southeast corner of 8th and Pierre provides sanctuary for prayerful thought and contemplation, reading, study and conversation with Jesus. Come take advantage of this great blessing to our community.

Jhoe Stonestreet is a parishioner at St. Thomas More and a long time adorer. The following testimony from Jhoe comes from her personal experience of what she has found at the chapel.

You’re invited for coffee at the adoration chapel!...This is not a time to sip your favorite caffeinated beverage, though. Rather, we take a drink from the infinite well-spring of Love. In the Blessed Sacrament, Jesus, veiled in humility in the form of a host (that we might come to Him), is our sustenance. He lightens our burdens, comforts us in our afflictions, and gives us the courage and strength to fight temptations and carry our cross on earth. Here, the tyranny of noise loses its power. Experience the sobering intoxication of Jesus living in our midst, and leave super-charged with the one, authentic, and efficacious Cup-a-J_ _ _ _ (Hint: It’s not Joe). Although not fair-trade, it’s organic.

The Adoration Chapel is open 24/7 and anyone is encouraged to visit at anytime for any length of time. Eucharistic Adoration is one of the greatest devotionals for transforming your heart to be more like Jesus.

Advent 2017

The Season of Advent begins at the end of this month, Sunday, December 3. This is the shortest length of Advent that you can get – the 4th Sunday of Advent is December 24! CARING FOR 'OUR COMMON HOME'

Seven Dolors will have a recycling dumpster in place on Nov. 1. It will be located in the drive by the NW corner of the Luckey Building. The following curbside recycling guidelines are to be observed:

ACCEPTABLE CO-MINGLED MATERIALS: Now accepting #1 through #7 Plastic containers. Newspaper (no rain bags), Telephone books, Manila Folders, Office Paper, Brochures, Chipboard (cereal, shoe, cracker boxed etc.), Cardboard Egg Cartons, Shredded paper (in paper bags), Aluminum cans, Catalogs, Junk Mail, Advertising Inserts, Magazines, Corrugated Cardboard, Paperback Books, Pizza Boxes (no food), Tin cans. No household hazardous waste or automotive product container will be accepted. **NO GLASS WILL BE COLLECTED!!!** (All glass must be brought to Howe's Center, 625 S. 10th)

UNACCEPTABLE MATERIAL: Styrofoam, plastic bags, gift wrap, blueprints, handing file folders, paper cups, paper plates, tissue paper, paper towels, photos, pet food bags, fertilizer bags, charcoal bags, kitty litter bags, plastic containers that held oil, antifreeze or other petroleum fluids. Collection days will be the 2nd and 4th week of every month on Wednesday.

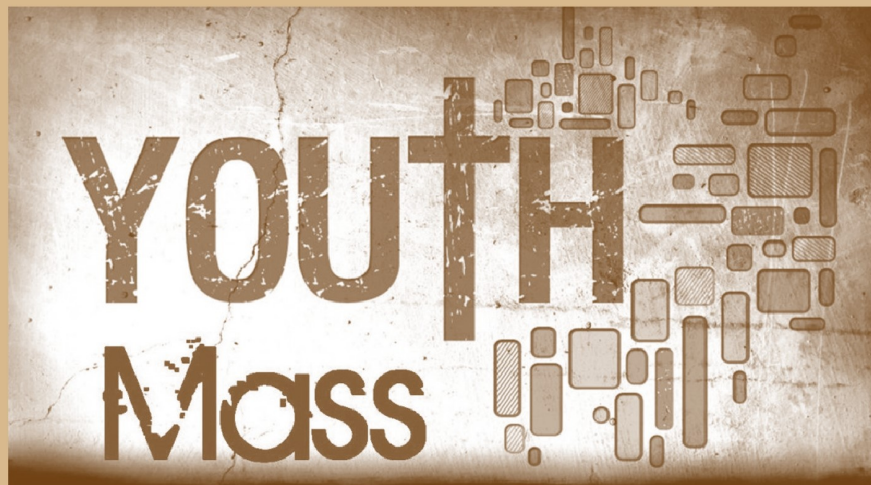

Parish Pastoral Council Summary

Parish Pastoral Council Members are: Delores Thomas, president; Ray Buyle, Cathy Lavis, Lucille Johnson, Tammy Pachta, Dennis Kuehler, Jolene Amtower, Pat McCoy and Jason Ellis.

Fr. Kerry reported that the rectory could be finished by the end of October. The Bishop and the Diocesan Architect Committee have approved us to begin renovation of our church next summer. Fr. Carlos reported that the Madres come to Manhattan from Salina on Fridays to help with baptismal catechesis and preparation for the sacraments of initiation. New families are coming plus farewell baskets are given to those moving from Manhattan. Pat McCoy reported for MCS: the Fund-a-Need auction item for the school this year was for technology. There is discussion about where to put handicap parking for the school. Tom Giller will start part-time on Nov. 1, taking over some of the responsibilities formerly assigned to the Development Director. Commission Reports: Parish Life – the commission met and evaluated the annual Parish Picnic at the zoo. It was decided that we would do that again next year as the participation was good. The date is Sept. 16, 2018. The Annual Birthday Dinner will be April 8, 2018. The plans are for a Mystery Dinner Theater. Liturgy – More altar servers are needed. On Nov. 8th. the KSU Choir will be performing in our church. Social Action – They have been working to promote our parish as a recycling parish. We now will provide a recycling bin behind the school with Howie's. Please contact Lucille Johnson if you are interested in becoming part of this commission. Catholic Formation – is asking for more members for the commission. They would like a representative for the youth and for the older generation. Catholicism 101 is being offered on Wednesdays. It is hoped that the RE parents would attend while their child is in RE. The FORMED program is being used. There are 125 children enrolled in the RE program. Some 30-50 high schoolers are attending formation and CYO on Wednesdays. Theology Thursday begins on the Oct. 19th. Building and Grounds – Fr. Kerry reported that we will be working on a Disaster Plan for natural disaster e.g. winter storms, tornado, active aggressor etc. More information will come out later. If you are interested in being a member of the commission, please call Fr. Kerry. Evangelization – The Mission was well received. They, too, are asking for new members. Next meeting to be announced.

The Council continued with discussion on Joe Paprocki's book "A Church on the Move." Next Council meeting is Nov. 20. No meeting in December.

The Examen

The Examen is a practice of prayer developed and taught by St. Ignatius of Loyola (1491-1556 a.d.). The word “examen” comes from the Latin word that means “examination.” The prayer of examen is found in St. Ignatius’ The Spiritual Exercises. He wanted to help people develop a reflective habit of mind that is constantly attuned to God’s presence and response to God’s leading. Today this prayer is used by Christians and can assist us to find God in our everyday lives and respond more generously to God’s gifts and blessings. The goal of the examen is to grow in intimacy with God and help us to find God in all things. That is, how God is present at all times and in every experience – work, school, relationships, problems, opportunities, times of difficulty and moments of joy. How does a person enter into this prayer form called the Examen? You prepare your mind and heart by first becoming aware of the love with which God looks upon you. Recognize that you are named and claimed as a son or daughter of God. God is for you, beside you and within you. After putting on that mind-set, then a person follows these simple steps:

Step 1: GRATITUDE: Note the gifts that God’s love has given you this day – the people, things, places, opportunities, experiences, etc. Identify each gift and offer thanks to God for each one individually, not taking any of them for granted. For St. Ignatius, the greatest sin was ingratitude.

Step 2: ASK FOR ASSISTANCE: Ask God for an insight and a strength that will make this examen a work of grace, fruitful beyond our human capacity alone. Know that you need God’s assistance to see more clearly your life and God’s presence in your life. Pray for that assistance.

Step 3: REVIEW THE DAY: Become mindful that in some manner God was present in every event, experience and relationship you had today but may have not been fully aware of it. With God, review the day. Starting with the beginning of the day. Recall the relationships God gave you this day as well as remembering the events, experiences, challenges and temptations to sin you experienced. What emotions did you experience throughout the day? Review the choices you made during the day in response to the people and events you encountered.

Step 4: FORGIVENESS: Call to mind your sins from the day. Ask for the healing touch of the forgiving God who, with love and respect for you, removes your hearts burdens.

Step 5: RENEWAL: Look to the following day and with God, plan concretely how to live it in accord with God’s loving desire for your life. St. Ignatius wrote that we “resolve to amend with the grace of God.” You need God’s help to live out your resolutions for tomorrow.
