## CATHOLIC PRINCIPLES & IMMIGRATION

The recent intense discussion in our country reminds us how complex the immigration issue is and how much our system is broken and in need of a new approach.

Following are the principles the Catholic Bishops have articulated to guide us: *First Principle: People have the right to migrate to sustain their lives and the lives of their families. Second Principle: A country has the right to regulate its borders and to control immigration. Third Principle: A country must regulate its borders with justice and mercy.*

I believe it is important to remember that these principles are not in reaction to the present moment, but have been developed ever since Pope Leo XIII first spoke about the issue in his encyclical *Rerum Novarum* in 1891.

# July: The Month of the Most Precious Blood

*The month of July is dedicated to the Precious Blood. The feast of the Precious Blood of our Lord was instituted in 1849 by Pius IX, but the devotion is as old as Christianity. The early Fathers say that the Church was born from the pierced side of Christ, and that the sacraments were brought forth through His Blood. Receiving the Precious Blood at Mass is a privilege.*

## **Chaplet of the Most Precious Blood**

This Chaplet is divided into seven groups, containing thirty-three "Our Fathers" in honor of the thirty-three years during which the Precious Blood flowed in the veins of Jesus, before it was poured out on the Cross for our salvation. After each group, the "Glory be to the Father" is recite in thanksgiving to the Holy Trinity for this great gift of the Precious Blood. While reciting these prayers, you are asked to meditate on each of the seven bloodsheddings of Jesus.

Prayer:

O God, come to my assistance. Lord, make haste to help me. Glory be to the Father, etc. As it was in the beginning, etc.

1st Mystery - Jesus shed His Blood in the Circumcision

Let us ask for chastity of soul and body. Our Father five times. Glory be to the Father, etc. We pray, You, Lord, help your people whom You have redeemed with Your Precious Blood.

2nd Mystery - Jesus shed His Blood while praying in the Garden of Olives.

Let us ask for the spirit of prayer. Our Father five times. Glory be to the Father, etc. We pray You, Lord, help your people whom You have redeemed with Your Precious Blood.

3rd Mystery - Jesus shed His Blood in the scourging

Let us ask for the grace of mortification. Our Father five times. Glory be to the Father, etc. We pray you, Lord, help Your people whom You have redeemed with Your Precious Blood

4th Mystery - Jesus shed His Blood in the crowning with thorns

Let us ask for contempt of worldly honors. Our Father five times. Glory be to the Father, etc. We pray you, Lord, help Your people whom You redeemed with Your Precious Blood.

5th Mystery - Jesus shed His Blood while carrying the Cross

Let us ask for patience. Our Father five times. Glory be to the Father, etc. We pray You, Lord, help Your people whom You redeemed with Your Precious Blood.

6th Mystery - Jesus shed His Blood in the Crucifixion

Let us ask for contrition for our sins. Our Father five time. Glory be to the Father, etc. We pray You, Lord, help your people whom You redeemed with Your Precious Blood.

7th Mystery - Jesus shed His Blood and water when His side was pierced.

Let us ask for the grace of perseverance. Our Father three times. Glory be to the Father, etc. We pray You, Lord, help Your people whom You redeemed with Your Precious Blood. Let us pray: Eternal Father, I offer Thee the Precious Blood of Jesus Christ in atonement for my sins, in supplication for the holy souls in Purgatory and for the needs of Holy Church. Amen

So, what's the difference between a "feast" and a "memorial" and where does a "solemnity" fit in? The Church punctuates the liturgical year by celebrating various events important to the mystery of our salvation - feasts. During the course of the liturgical year, the Church celebrates the whole mystery of Christ, from His Incarnation and birth to His Ascension, to Pentecost and the founding of the Church, and finally to the second coming of Christ in judgment on the Solemnity of Christ the King. On Sundays in particular, we commemorate the Resurrection, when our Lord triumphed over sin and death. In a special way, the Church also honors our Blessed Mother, marking those special events of her participation in the mystery of salvation. Finally, the Church also commemorates the memorial days of saints, who through their lives bring to the minds of the faithful the call to holiness. Saints' days are celebrated with few exceptions on the date of the saint's death— their birth into eternal life.

Technically, the divisions are as follows: Solemnities are the celebrations of greatest importance. Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation (which in the United States are the Solemnity of Mary Mother of God, Ascension, Assumption, All Saints, Immaculate Conception, and Christmas) are always considered solemnities. Other examples of solemnities include the Solemnity of St. Joseph (March 19), the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus (Friday after the Feast of Corpus Christi), and the Solemnity of St. Peter and St. Paul (June 29).

Feasts are of second importance in our liturgical calendar and are celebrated on a particular day. Next in line are memorials, which are classified as either obligatory or optional. Memorials commemorate a saint or saints. For example, the memorial of St. John Bosco (January 31) is obligatory while the memorial of St. Blase (February 3) is optional. Only the memorials of those saints who are of "universal significance" are observed by the whole Church and marked in the general liturgical calendar.

# Academic Achievement At MCS

Manhattan Catholic Schools had four students attend the National History Bee in Atlanta, Georgia on June 1st & 2nd. Brent Golden competed in the 8th grade division and missed the second round through a tie-breaker. Zachary O'Haver competed in the elementary division, first round. Aiden Levendofsky made the 2nd round of the elementary competition and received a medal for being in the top 256 students. Eli Kunz made the quarterfinals and received a medal and a trophy for finishing in the top 64 students in the country. Congratulations to all!

There were 600 students per division at nationals, which students qualified for at a regional bee in Lenexa, KS earlier this spring. MCS had 42 students qualify for regionals and seven students qualify for the national competition. Eli Kunz won the elementary division at the regional level.

When asked what he felt was a neat part of the competition, Eli said, "having other friends from MCS there with me competing in the Bee." The families and I spoke about team competitions. If we qualify 4 students for nationals, we could field a team for competition as well. Zachary and Eli want to bring a team next year! Aiden said, "After experiencing the nationals of the History Bee, I feel motivated to keep studying to improve and keep competing." Not only is there a competition component but an educational experience for traveling that touched Aiden, who went on to say, "I've never seen a city as big as Atlanta before. I was almost dizzy at the size of the buildings and everything that was happening."

The students were very successful! Additionally, the families had many great experiences such as attending a Braves game, visiting the Coca Cola Museum, going to the College Football Hall of Fame, visiting Civil War Battle of Atlanta, and seeing MLK and Civil Rights sites. Great vacation, especially if you drive and see other parts of the United States!

# Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults

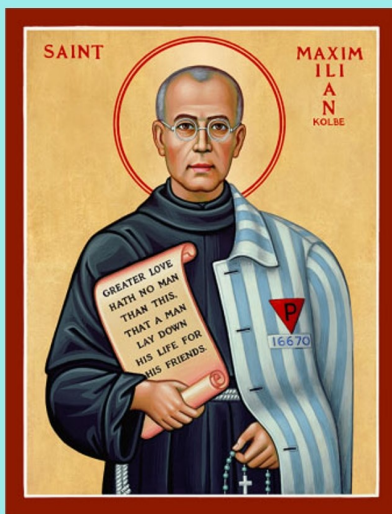

# Adoration Chapel

Eucharistic Adoration has been a great blessing to many holy people. The following quote comes from St. Maximilian Kolbe who lived from 1894 – 1941. He was a Polish friar who volunteered to die in place of a stranger in the German death camp of Auschwitz during World War II. He is the patron saint of drug addicts, prisoners, families, journalists and the pro-life movement.

“My aim is to institute Perpetual (Eucharistic) Adoration, for this is the most important activity. God dwells in our midst in the Blessed Sacrament of the altar. Let us not forget to visit.....Jesus. Let us tell Him we love Him. We might ask Him what He wants of us, what are His wishes. Sometimes we might ask Jesus something for ourselves and something for others. One can speak to Jesus as brother to brother, as friend to friend, more so, since it often happens that men do not understand us, whereas Jesus understands each of us always.”

The St. Joseph's Adoration Chapel at 8th and Pierre is open 24/7 although the front doors are locked from 9pm – 7am. You are encouraged to visit primarily between 7am – 9pm. Eucharistic Adoration is one of the greatest devotionals for transforming your heart to be more like Jesus.

# Budget Shop Annual Luncheon

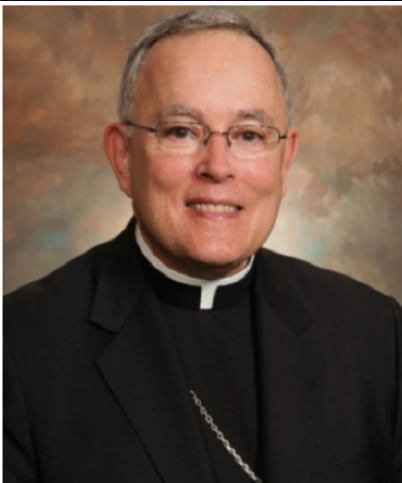
