Candlemas & The Presentation of the Lord

“Forty day after Christmas, we celebrate the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, which recalls the event described in the Gospel according to Luke. “When the time came for their purification according to the law of Moses, they brought him up to the Lord (as it is written in the law of the Lord, ‘Every first-born male shall be designated as holy to the Lord.’)” (Luke 2:22) Joseph and Mary bring Jesus to the Temple, and while they are there, they meet two extraordinary people. First they meet Simeon, who, taking Jesus in his arms, recognizes him as the long-awaited Messiah. Not only that, Simeon know that this Messiah has come not only to the Jewish people, but to all. He is “a light for revelation to the Gentiles” (Luke 2:32) There is a note of sorrow in this joyful encounter: Simeon prophesies over the child, telling Mary the Jesus will encounter great opposition, while her own heart is pierced by a sword. They also meet Anna, a widow, 84 years old, who prays and fasts in the Temple night and day, and who also recognizes who Jesus is, and begins to proclaim him: “At that moment she came, and began to praise God and to speak about the child to all who were looking for the redemption of Jerusalem” (Luke 2:38). Jesus is the light to the nations, and from the moment of his birth, people are drawn to his light. That is why on this Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, we carry lit candles, and the priest blesses the candles to be used the in celebration of the liturgy during 6he coming year.



Because of this, the Mass on this day is often called Candlemas.” *Taken from 2019 Source Book*

Parish Council Update

Seven Dolores Parish Pastoral Council met on Monday, January 21st. Pat McCoy is President; Delores Thomas is vice-president and Jolene Amtower is secretary. Reports: Stacie Levendofsky and Maria McAnerney presented the current plans for organizing the 100th Anniversary of Seven Dolores Parish celebration in 2020. Fr. Kerry reported that the Capital Campaign is coming to a close. There is still follow up work being done on the church renovation. The basement windows have now been installed. MCS reports that a summer childcare program is moving forward. MCS won a trophy for Best Youth Float in the Mayors' Holiday Lighted parade. Paige Levendofsky and Hayden Platt, along with many other MCS students, were among the winners for this year's MLK Jr. Day essay contest. The school is looking at long range planning for the school. Finance Council: The new accounting firm was present at the last Council meeting to answer any questions that the council had. Liturgy Commission: Next meeting February 6 will address the Lenten season. Parish Life Commission: the Parish Birthday Dinner will be held on April 7. Dave Lewis will be the entertainment. Evangelization Commission: The parish mission will be in October. They also gave out candy canes Christmas Eve with the explanation of the stripes and shape at Christmas as a means to evangelize our parish community and guests. Next meeting is Feb. 13 at 6p.m. Social Action: The Pilgrim Bread sale was a success. Over \$1000 was sent to Ascension House in El Paso. Another sale will be held during Lent. Richard Bryant gave a presentation on the Disaster Preparedness Conference in conjunction with Catholic Charities. Comments by Fr. Kerry: There is a plan of possibly using the St. Patrick's Hall as a place to offer meals to the needy in Ogden. More later. Next Pastoral Council meeting is February 18 at 7p.m.

Shepherd's Crossing

The annual meeting was held on January 14 at St. Thomas More Utopia room. The new director is Beth Klug, replacing Bev Olsen who retired in December. The Board of Directors are Dave Rogers, President; Doug Hofbauer, Vice President; Ingrid Logan, Secretary, and Courtney Ellis, Treasurer. Currently, Seven Dolores is in need of a parishioner to serve as representative of the parish. If interested, call Rosie at the parish office. +

Our parish helped Shepherd's Crossing to care for 1,566 families in need in 2018. Our monthly contributions along with other supporting churches and agencies, helped provide rent totaling \$138,109 for 546 families; \$135,447 for utilities for 711 families; \$6,906 in prescriptions for 112 individuals; \$1291 for Birth Certificate, Driver's Licenses, or KS I.D.'s for 47 individuals. They took care of 122 Fairy Godmother & Guardian Referrals; 28 Lion's Club and Eye Doctor Referrals; with over 3000 hours of volunteer hours.

Each year they participate in the Grow Green program and invite the community to participate in the C. Clyde Jones Fun Run in order to raise funds to help those in need. Thank you for your generosity over the years.

A biblical world view of stewardship can be consciously defined as: "Utilizing and managing all resources God provides for the glory of God and the betterment of God's creation." ... "The earth is the Lord's, and everything in it, the world, and all who live in it."

(Psalm 24:1)

Our first Stewardship Family for 2019 is The Platt Family. Gina and Jeremy have been members of the Catholic community in Manhattan for almost 17 years, recently registering with Seven Dolors. What is a Steward? To them, the most important aspect of Stewardship is the act

of taking care of all God's earthly belongings, which allows them to be good stewards within the Church, within the Catholic School Community and towards all God's people. Gina and Jeremy enjoy showing their children, Hayden and Kenley, that volunteering their time, talent and treasure can truly make a difference in what happens within our Catholic community and their own lives. They try to instill in the kids that Stewardship is something that can and should be done every day. Even something we see as a minor issue, or opportunity, has the potential to shine God's light on someone. Their advice to others would be to simply try to be a good Steward in all you do. Starting small, smiling and saying hello, can lead to bigger opportunities to become more immersed in the Stewardship way of living and become all God wants us to be. They encourage others to step outside your normal comfort level. You will find that it becomes easier and easier to give and provide as a steward.

It is difficult to teach or practice stewardship, unless we have a clear understanding of exactly what stewardship is. If we wish to embrace stewardship, we must gradually learn to embrace every definition or aspect of stewardship: Scripture based, gratitude, dependence on God, giving back, a loving response, spending time with God, sharing talent, proportionate giving, giving of treasure, trust in God, accountability, thankfulness, counter-cultural, and discipleship.
