The following quote comes from St. Joseph's Adoration Chapel adorer, Brad Fagan.

A convergence of circumstances motivated me to go on a pilgrimage by myself to Medjugorje in Bosnia and Herzegovina in 2009. I didn't know what to expect but I signed up anyway. Then I got our agenda and all I saw was *Mass, pray, speaker, Mass, pray, speaker*, etc. I thought it would be the most boring, wasteful week and a half of my life. Instead it was the most incredible, inspiring time of my life. I was exposed to a peaceful, calm and joyfulness that I had never experienced. I also participated in some Catholic devotions that I knew next to nothing about. One of them was Eucharistic Adoration.

My first Eucharistic Adoration was outdoors with thousands of people venerating the Eucharist placed in a monstrance on an elevated altar. Practically everyone was kneeling in gravel adoring Christ in total silence. The only lights came from the stars, a few lights placed around the walkways and a light shining on the altar. I was blown away.

One of the first things I did when I got back to Manhattan was sign up for a holy hour at St. Joseph's Adoration Chapel. For some reason it was the first time that I really, truly thought about the true presence of Christ in the Eucharist. Was he really there or would I be wasting an hour each week with just a piece of unleavened bread. I, of course, determined it was Christ and my holy hour has been one of the best hours of my week ever since.

The St. Joseph's Adoration Chapel at 8th and Pierre is open 24/7 although the front doors are locked from 9pm – 7am. You are encouraged to visit primarily between 7am – 9pm. Eucharistic Adoration is one of the greatest devotionals for transforming your heart to be more like Jesus.

As we look to begin the month traditionally dedicated to our Blessed Mother, here are a few little known facts.

- *Mary is the patroness of 73 diocese in the United States. 3 of those Diocese (Including our Salina Diocese) are here in Kansas.*
- *59 Countries have Mary as their patroness. On July 2, 1847 Pope Pius IX published a decree naming the Blessed Virgin as the patroness of the United States.*
- *Mary holds a singularly exalted place in Islam as the only woman named in the Quran, which refers to her seventy times and explicitly identifies her as the greatest of all women.*
- *The Blessed Virgin has over 88 names and titles, including: Immaculate Conception, Help of the Afflicted, Refuge of Sinners, and Lady of Light.*
- *The Vatican recognizes 12 Marian apparitions, with the most recent one being in 1933. Three of the most well known took place at Fatima, Portugal; Lourdes, France; and Guadalupe, Mexico.*
