MARRIAGE-Call the parish at least 6 months prior to intended date. Prep sessions required. No weddings in Advent or Lent.

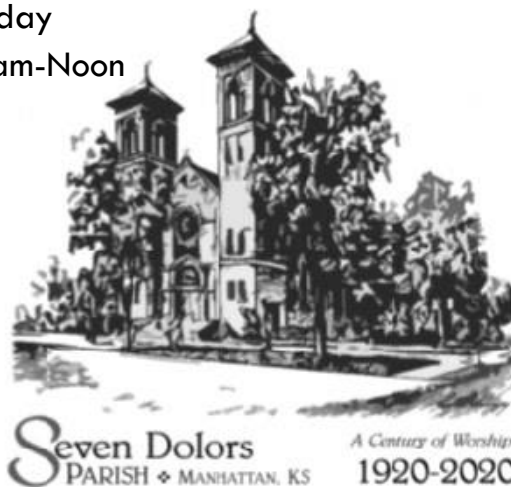

Small Group Highlight

This month's Small Group Highlight is our Prayer Shawl Ministry group.

The members of the Prayer Shawl meeting weekly for prayer and fellowship as they knit or crochet shawls and blankets for those who may need some encouraging thoughts and prayers. The ministry was started in 2007 and in the 12 years since its creation, the members have created over 300 shawls. These shawls have been given to those going through RCIA, parishioners who are dealing with illness, and others who the members thought could use one.

The Prayer Shawl ministry meets on Tuesdays at 10 am in the Parish Center. You don't have to know how to knit or crochet, they will be glad to teach you!



Seven Dolors CYO/YDisciple Choir of Angels Fundraiser



**Envelopes available May 18/19 & 25/26 to be
returned on or before July 31, 2019**

CYO/YDisciple is Seven Dolors' high school religious education group. This past school year we had a weekly attendance of 30 young people and 5 dedicated catechists, who willingly shared this journey of faith with them.

Wednesday nights are successfully drawing the youth of our parish into a peer community to deepen their faith, but now we need your help! This group of young people receives a budget for programming, but all other costs are met through parent support, their after-school jobs or fundraising (most recently bierock sales).

As a community of faith, Seven Dolors has an opportunity to sponsor these young Catholics on their faith journey. Envelopes will be available for pick up before and after Mass this weekend and next. Your donation will be documented on your parish annual giving statement for the 2019 giving year.

How it works—Take an envelope and prayerfully consider a donation to be returned between now and July 31, 2019. If you desire to make multiple donations over the summer, please take more than one envelope. You may return the envelopes to the parish office or in the weekly collection.

A brief description of our events follows:

- **Prayer & Action Summer Mission:** This event is a diocesan-sponsored one week summer 'backyard' mission that takes place within the diocese. Five days of prayer & daily Mass in the mornings and evenings filled with fellowship, faith sharing, and laughter. During the middle of the day the youth and adult sponsors serve the community in which the mission takes place— painting, yardwork, cleaning, etc. (\$80)
- **Steubenville Youth Conferences:** There are 21 sites for this event — this summer our pilgrimage will take us to Denver, CO — it is a three day conference with national speakers, Eucharistic Adoration and daily Mass. This is an opportunity to experience the larger church beyond our diocese and parish. (~\$300-500)
- **NCYC (National Catholic Youth Conference):** A biennial three-day event with national speakers giving keynotes and breakout sessions, 20,000+ attendees, including bishops, priests and religious. The next one will be held in Indianapolis in November of this year. (\$700)
- **And finally,** though this is not an event it is still a need for next year —weekly snacks for 30+ young people (~\$50)
