A Note from the Parish Nurse Committee:

As July has begun, many parents are thinking ahead to physicals for school activities and sports which includes the ever looming question of keeping vaccinations up to date. We wanted to provide you with a brief run-down of what to expect your child to need based on age range as advised by the CDC. As always, discuss questions or concerns with your pediatrician.

Ages 4-6:

- Final (5th) dose of Diphtheria, Tetanus, and Pertussis (DTAP, pediatric dose administered in one injection)
- Final (4th) dose of Inactivated Poliovirus (IPV)
- Final (2nd) Dose of Measles, Mumps & Rubella (MMR, administered in one injection)

Final (2nd) Dose of Varicella (Chicken pox)

Ages 11-12

- Initial dose of Meningococcal vaccine, 2 dose series
- Starting at age 11, you can receive the TDAP vaccine, which is adult dosing coverage for Tetanus, Diphtheria and Pertussis. After receiving this initial one, a booster is required called Td (Tetanus and Diphtheria) every 10 years. Human Papilloma Virus (HPV) 2 dose series can be initiated at this time and is optional. Discuss the benefits and your concerns with your child's pediatrician.

Age 16:

- Final dose of Meningococcal vaccine.

Continue series of HPV vaccine if chosen.

Age 18:

If not previously vaccinated for Meningococcal virus, one dose is recommended before living in a dorm or other shared living situation.

Yearly: It is recommended that children and adults obtain an influenza vaccine in the early to late fall and coverage lasts approximately 5 months from date of injection, ideally the length of influenza "season", typically October – May.

Adverse reactions to Vaccines:

Common adverse reactions to any vaccines include: soreness and redness at injection site for several days, possible low-grade fever, and tiredness.

Less-common and more concerning reactions include: High fever (104 deg. F), Fever induced seizures, changes in behavior, and allergic reaction like hives, facial swelling, or difficulty breathing within a few minutes to a few hours after administration. Seek immediate medical attention if any of these symptoms occur and notify your physician of reaction.
