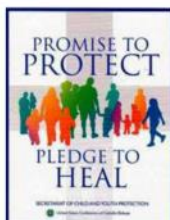

# Candlemas and the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord

Next Sunday (and Saturday), we will celebrate the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord (also known as Candlemas Day). February 2 is 40 days after Christmas. On this day we remember Christ's presentation in the temple, Mary's purification and Jesus' first entry into the Temple. At the Presentation, Simeon prophesied that a sword would pierce Mary's heart (the first Dolor or Sorrow) and that Jesus would be the Light of the Nations. We now remember he is our Light and, as such, it is the custom to bless candles and have them available for people to take to their homes.

Candles will be at the back of the churches. A donation of \$3 per candle is greatly appreciated.

This month's Gratitude Spotlight is about the Knights of Columbus. These donations are used to support the seminarians from the diocese, scholarships for graduating seniors, and MCS. Their annual Tootsie Roll Drive proceeds are donated to the Kansas Special Olympics, with approximately \$3,500 being sent to event coordinators this year! The organization is also active in Pro-Life events, donating money to help purchase mobile ultrasound machines and erecting a Pro-Life billboard. When it came time to move out of the church for the renovations, the Knights were there in force to help the parish. They are also on call for special projects around the community and parish. They have helped a family move and assisted MCS teachers when they emptied their rooms for the renovation projects. During cleanup events, the Knights are often the first ones to arrive and the last ones to leave. The Knights are always ready to help the families of their brother Knights. One Knight recently took family members to see their loved on in Kansas City after a major surgery, and others check in on members whose loved ones are ill. Fellowship is a cornerstone of this organization, with the Knights taking time for visiting before meetings, and spending time in prayer as a group.

These activities are just a highlight of all of the activities that the Knights take part in.
