+**Rice Bowls** were made available on Ash Wednesday and also available in the Gathering Area. The idea is to eat a poor person's meal once a week and place the money saved in the Rice Bowl. These will be collected on Holy Thursday. Two-thirds of the collection benefits Catholic Relief Services overseas and one-third remains in the diocese. Our Shepherd's Crossing and Flint Hills Food Pantry benefit from them.

The story that follows was well liked in 2019 and is reprinted for 2020. The diocesan statistics have been updated.

Msgr. James Hake is one of 19 currently retired priests of the Diocese of Salina. We share his story during the Bishop's Annual Appeal - Call to Share to remind us of the impact gifts have on a very personal level for those benefiting from your generosity. His story of his years of active ministry, and how he continues to serve in retirement, no doubt reminds each of us just how much impact a single priest has throughout the diocese.



For some reason, unknown to me now, I always wanted to be a “Monsignor Dreiling” when I grew up. He was our pastor in Tipton way back when I was a youngster. There must have been something about him that impressed me greatly. I know that's the mysterious way God works in our lives. I'm sure that's the reason I wanted to be a parish priest, living in a community among the people of God.

And I must say, now looking back on those days in the various parishes I've been honored to serve, that life has been very fulfilling for me. Helping the dear parishioners and being such an intimate part of their lives was always a joy and continues to be in my memories. The celebration of the Eucharist and the Sacraments was central, as I'm sure it is for any parish priest. And as priests, it's a great comfort to us to know that the lives of God's people could not be blessed with such great gifts without the priesthood.

Although my life as a priest, for all but the first four years, was also spent in Diocesan work at the Chancery, even that work would not have been so fulfilling for me had I not been able to also serve as a parish priest. Being with and being able to serve God's people is what has “grounded” my life as a priest.

As a retired priest, I am now happy to live with those memories. Of course, living the life of the priesthood also continues, but in a much more limited way.

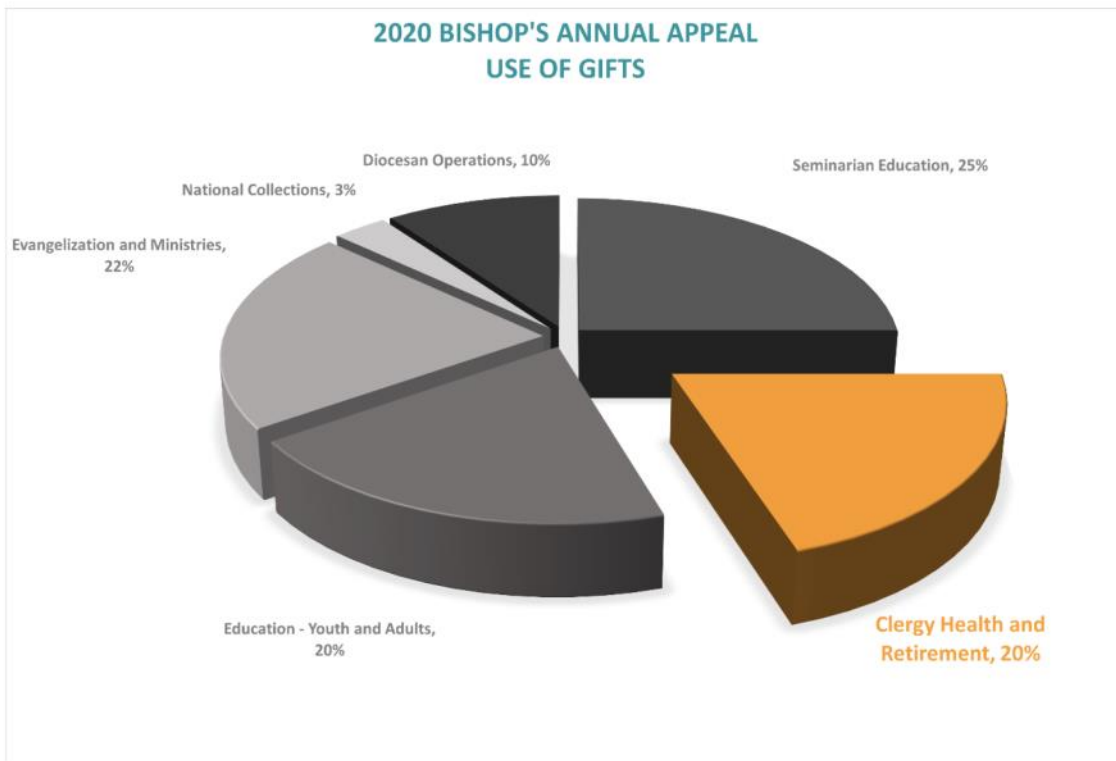
My privilege of “working” for the Diocese partially continues by way of serving on the Marriage Tribunal, for which I was sent to school and trained many years ago. It continues to be a joy and great satisfaction to be of some help to people who are in need of healing because of difficulties in past marriages. Also, I find, as a retired priest, that I can now more freely offer Masses for my family and friends and for special occasions.



We priests, who are retired from the role of active pastors are growing in numbers because, thanks be to God, good health care and medicine is prolonging life. Because of the continued shortage of priests, we hope and pray that our limited “usefulness” will continue to be of help to our priests who are serving full-time, and many in an over-burdened way in our Diocese.
