## **A Brief History of the Chapel**

On November 23, 1994, Father Larry Grennan, Pastor of the Seven Dolors of the Blessed Virgin Mary Parish, received a letter from the Most Reverend George K. Fitzsimons, Bishop of the Salina Diocese that granted permission to pursue Perpetual Adoration of the Holy Eucharist in the chapel of the Seven Dolors Parish Center (formally, the St. Joseph Covent). In his letter, he states, "This private devotion of Adoration of the blessed Sacrament can be a blessing for the individuals as well as for the parish and the entire universal. Church. The integration of this Eucharistic worship into the total life of the church could be helpful for many other activities that are part of your parish ministry."

The Chapel began Perpetual Adoration on March 19, 1995. The original Monstrance was on loan from Saint Patrick's Parish in Ogden. A permanent Monstrance was purchased in April 1999.

In 2002, Diane Heerman was instrumental in beginning the Chapel Library, which is today named in her honor, The Diane Heerman Library. Around 2010, additional shelves were added to create better display of the books. In 2014, Larry Nordstrom completed an inventory of all our books.

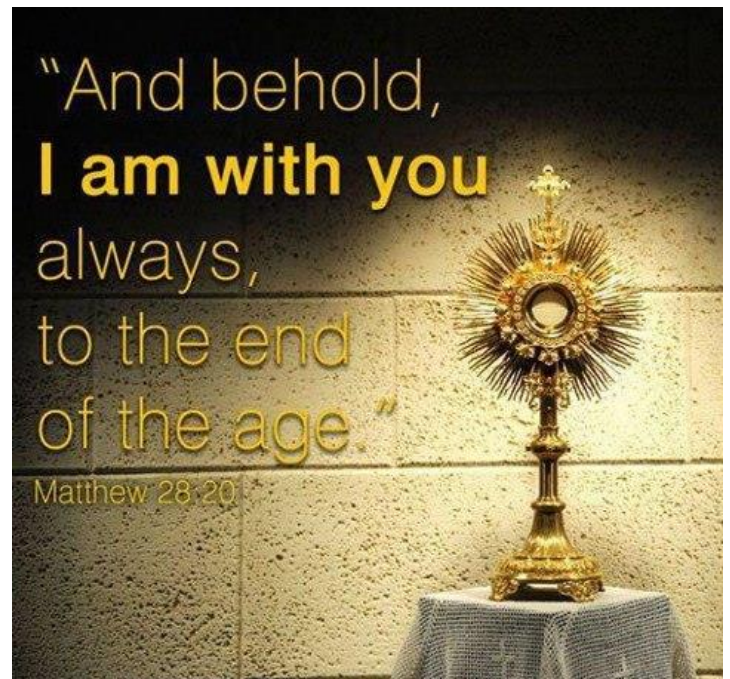

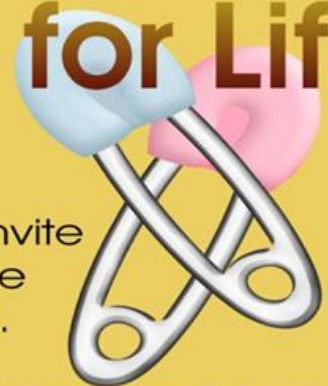
