The Holy Rosary

Early tradition attributes the defeat of the Albigensians at the Battle of Muret in 1213 to the Rosary. St. Pius V attributed the great defeat of the Turkish fleet on the first Sunday of October, 1571, to the fact that at the same time the Rosary confraternities at Rome and elsewhere were holding their processions. Accordingly, he ordered a commemoration of the Rosary to be made on that day. Two years later, Gregory XIII allowed the celebration of a feast of the Rosary in churches having an altar dedicated to the Rosary.

In 1671, Clement X extended the feast to all Spain. A second great victory over the Turks, who once, threatened the ruin of Christian civilization, occurred on August 5, 1716, when Prince Eugene defeated them at Peterwardein in Hungary. Thereupon Clement XI extended the feast of the Rosary to the whole Church.

Until about the 15th century hundreds of mysteries were part of the Rosary devotion then the 15 mysteries that we know today were definitively fixed as "the Mysteries of the Rosary." Pope John Paul II, in his encyclical, *Rosarium Virginis Mariae*, in 2002 added the five Luminous Mysteries.

Through the meditations of the complete Rosary one recalls and has impressed on his mind, the Popes tell us, "the chief mysteries of the Christian religion," "the mysteries of our Redemption," "the great mysteries of Jesus and His Mother united in joys, sorrows, and triumphs." The twenty mysteries are divided into four equal groups, known as "The Joyful," "The Sorrowful," "The Glorious," and "The Luminous Mysteries."

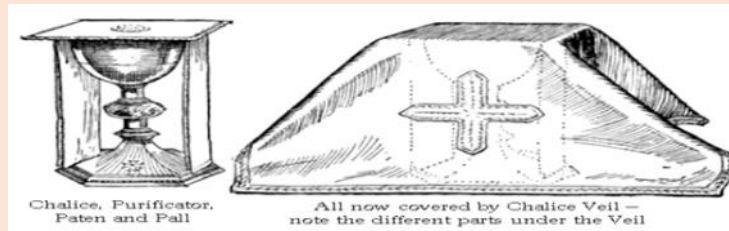

Liturgical Labels

The Chalice Veil

You may have noticed, Fr. Ryan and Fr. Mike, both veil their chalices for the Mass. The General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM) states: "It is a praiseworthy practice for the chalice to be covered with a veil, which may be either of the color of the day or white." The veil represents the covering over the holy vessels (chalice and paten) extending their worth and value as vessels meant to receive the body and blood of Christ. The veil has its history tied with the Old Testament Temple and the curtain of separation between the Holy of Holies, where the Ark of the Covenant stood, and from the rest of the Temple (Heb 9:2-4). At Jesus' death, the Temple curtain was rent in two, signifying the transition of the Old Covenant into the New Covenant. This action revealed the deep connection between the ancient rituals with the fulfillment of God's promise in Jesus in the new rituals (Mt 27:50-51). The liturgical use of the Chalice Veil highlights this transition even more by showing the relationship and the distinction between the two main parts of the Mass, the Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist. The unveiling of the chalice visibly invites us to enter into the sacred mysteries at the altar and reveals the splendor of the new instruments that bring us our salvation.

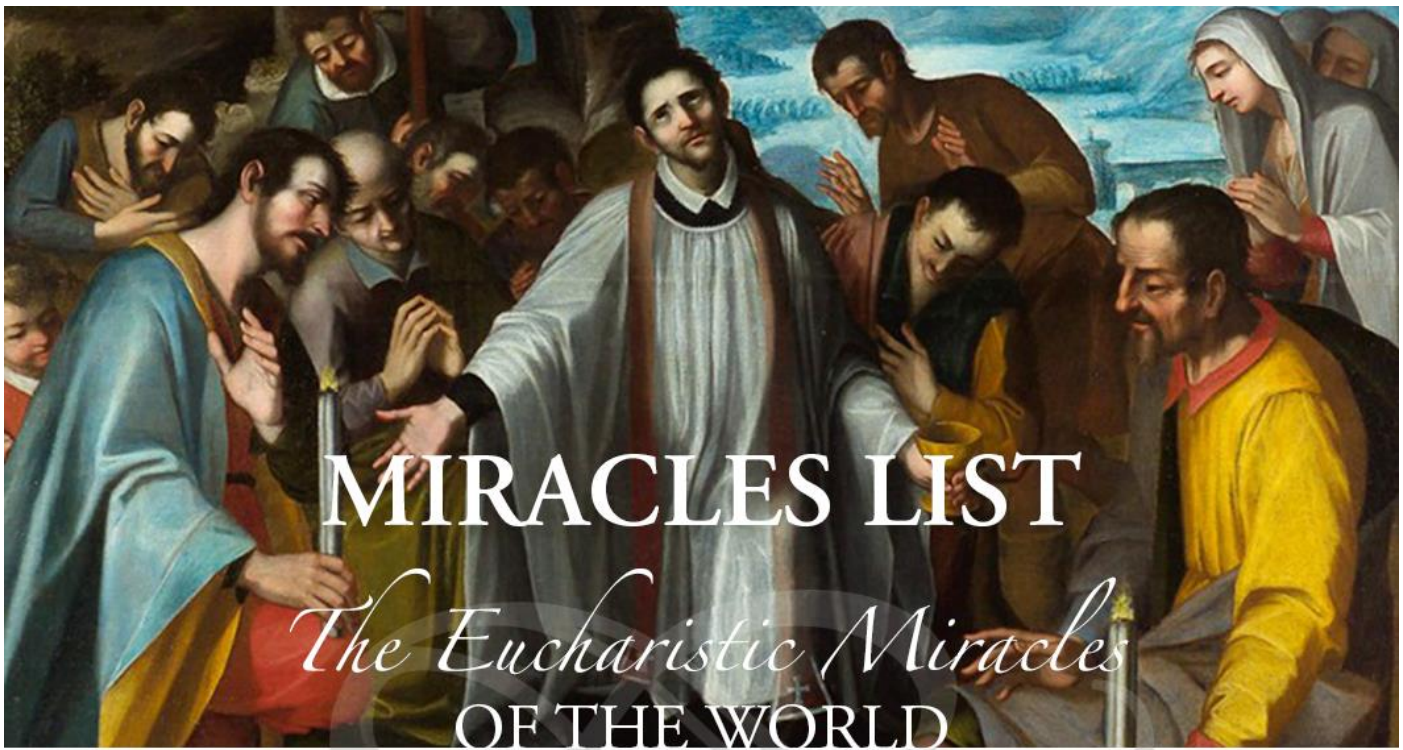

The Eucharistic Miracles OF THE WORLD

In Loving Memory of Fr. Merlin A. Kieffer



Father Merlin A. Kieffer was born on a farm near Clifton, KS on March 5, 1934, the second youngest of 7 children of Peter and Anna (Esslinger) Kieffer. He attended a country school until 1945 when the family moved to a farm near Hanover. He finished elementary school at St. John's School, Hanover [grades 6-8] and attended high school at St. Francis Seminary, Victoria, KS.

He attended college and theology at St. Gregory and Mount St. Mary's of the West in Cincinnati, Ohio, where he received an MA in Philosophy. On May 26, 1960 he was ordained priest for the Diocese of Salina at his home parish of St. John's, Hanover.

He did graduate work in counseling psychology for 4 summers at Catholic University in Washington D.C. and was guidance counselor and instructor in Latin and Church History at the Catholic high school in Concordia and at Luckey High in Manhattan. He served as Associate Pastor at Our Lady of Perpetual Help, Concordia from 1960-63, and at Seven Dolours and Luckey High from '63 to '71, while also serving in parish ministry as associate pastor. From 1964 to '71 he was also Pastor of St. Patrick's, Ogden.

He served as Pastor of Our Lady of Perpetual Help Parish, Goodland, St. John the Baptist, Beloit, Sacred Heart Cathedral, Salina and its mission of St. Joseph, Brookville, St. Frances Cabrini, Hoxie and its mission of St. Martin, Seguin, Ss. Peter & Paul, Clay Center, and its mission of St. Anthony, Miltonvale.

He retired in 2005 due to health problems to Seven Dolours Parish, Manhattan and assisted in sacramental ministry. He led and supervised the parish ministry to parishioners who were sick, homebound, in the hospital and in local care homes.

From 1980 - 1986 he served as the Director of Education and Superintendent of Schools of the Salina Diocese. He also had pastoral care of St. Patrick Parish, Gypsum, and later St. Bernard's, Ellsworth. He served on the Kansas Bishops' Board of Governors as the "Schools" representative of the 4 dioceses in Catholic Education.

In 1989, during a sabbatical, he entered a 4-month Sabbatical Renewal of priestly renewal of Scripture, Theology and Spiritual Renewal at Notre Dame campus, and a second semester in further study of Scripture, Biblical Archeology and Geography at Ein Karim, Israel through a program with theology students of St. John's University, Collegeville, MN. The sabbatical included study tours throughout Israel, the Sinai, Egypt and Greece.

He was a member of Rotary Club and served as President and in other leadership offices. He was privileged to be named a Paul Harris Fellow.
