## CHRIST THE KING

When Pope Pius XI instituted a special feast honoring Christ “the King” in 1925, he grieved for a world that had been ravaged by the First World War and which had begun to bow down before the “lords” of exploitative consumerism, nationalism, secularism, and new forms of injustice. The old power structures in Europe and the Middle East were fading into memory and a new and uncertain world was rising in their place.

Pope Pius recognized that, for the Christian, those passing empires and colonies did not define who or whose they were. Instead, he reflected that the kingdom to which Christians belong is “spiritual and concerned with spiritual things... it demands of its subjects a spirit of detachment from riches and earthly things, and a spirit of gentleness. They must hunger and thirst after justice and more than this, they must deny themselves and carry the cross” (from the Encyclical *Quas primas*, 15). Pope Pius envisioned “a dominion by a King of Peace who came to reconcile all things, who came not to be served but to serve” (20). As the Second Reading this Sunday reminds us, the reign of Christ embraces all people. This is certainly a timely reminder as we confront violence, uncertainty, and questions about what we owe to those who are the victims of terror and oppression. 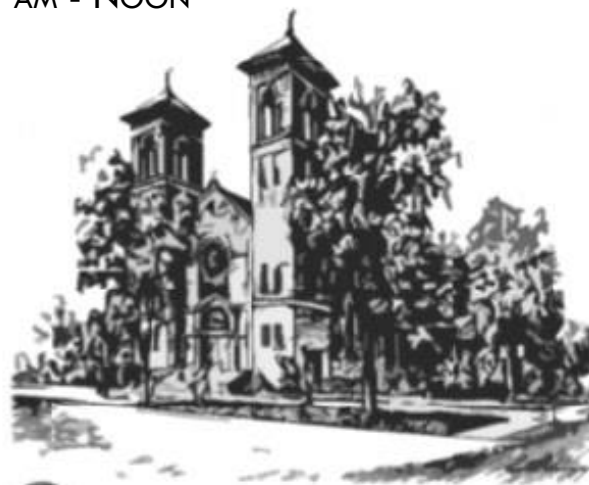

# PARISHIONER UPDATE

Stephen Lauer, a former parishioner, has spent the last year as a novitiate for the Jesuits.

Discernment Update - The purpose of the first year of novitiate was to discern whether I desire to become a Jesuit. I do. The purpose of this second year of the novitiate is to discern whether God is calling me to become a Jesuit. It is not at all clear that God is. During my prayer the past two months, it sometimes seems that God is asking me not to take vows as a Jesuit. Nothing is certain yet, but I want you to know that this is going on so that it won't come as a shock if I am ultimately called to leave the novitiate. In the meantime, I pray for the grace to live in this tension of unknowing, the wisdom to hear God's call, and the courage to follow wherever God leads me. I appreciate your kind thoughts and/or prayers as well.

Experiment in St. Louis - Tomorrow morning, October 23rd, I'm flying to St. Louis. For the next seven weeks, I will work 4-5 days a week at Loyola Academy, a middle school for boys from under-resourced neighborhoods. I'll help teach a social theology class, tutor, and lead a book discussion group. I'll live with the Jesuit scholastics at Bellarmine House at St. Louis University. (Scholastics are Jesuits who've taken first vows at the end of their novitiate and are studying philosophy in preparation for eventually being ordained to the priesthood). I anticipate that living at Bellarmine will be really helpful as I discern whether I'm called to take vows and become a Jesuit.

Updates from California - The novitiate schedule in California is more relaxed than in Grand Coteau and I've been using the additional free time to pray outside and to go on walks in nature. I found a nice park that's near the novitiate where I can go up into the hills overlooking the city and just be. I've also been going out on hikes with other novices. I've been working two days a week at Verbum Dei - a Jesuit high school for young men from under-resourced neighborhoods. I mostly help out with back-office work. This included making graphs and charts to track their progress towards their strategic priorities and calling parents to remind them that their sons need to be vaccinated in order to participate in the corporate work study program that started back up this week. I'm able to communicate in both English and Spanish, and by doing these calls I free up time for the school's full-time staff to do other things.
