Dear Parishioners,

As we step into April it's easy to see the season of spring upon us; the weather, the trees, the grass, the flowers eking out of the ground. It is exciting for us to see this rebirth out of the wintery dormant period. It's exactly this transition from the glum of barrenness into the bright of abundance that the season of Lent is pointing to. The word "Lent" comes from the Old English word *lencen* meaning "springtime". Though we tend to think Lent as an austere season, it's really what comes from the season that, even in the name, our focus is to be turned. The springing up of new life. Here is what God can do and does do, he turns barrenness and death into abundance and life.

In the next few weeks, we will be focusing intensely on the last few days of Jesus' life. We get to see the promised hope of God and the high expectation of humanity in the fulfillment of that expectation spiral into confusion and fickleness. Can you scripturally plot out the events of these next few weeks? Do you have your imaginative map in your head of the events that will play out? In some ways, our modern movies have done a disservice to our own head canon of the beauty of the story of salvation. Though they are filled with artistic vision, they can often overload us with too much information or not the right amount. Our sensory expectations can be stifled when our own experience "didn't match up with" what happened in the movie, or even, what happened last year. My challenge for you is to be new soil, to hear anew this story of humanity and the revelation of Jesus Christ as the promised for Messiah. See the story unfold with new eyes, discover the texture of Way of the Cross, and listen carefully to the breath of life that is finally given up on the cross and then is freely given in the upper room. Open your heart to the life that God desires for you, and let him turn whatever is barren in it to the abundance that he calls for.

Invitation from the Hispanic Community

Every Easter Sunday, it has been our Tradition, as the Hispanic Community, to process, from the Church to the Adoration Chapel, the Consecrated Host. We do this with Hymn and the members of the 4th Degree Knights of Columbus Honor Guard. It is a *beautiful* procession and would be even greater if we all as a Parish come together in honor of our Lord's resurrection. It normally takes place between 1:30 pm and 1:40 pm (immediately after the Spanish Mass).

Shrimp, Rice, and Zucchini Soup

Ingredients:

1 lb Peeled Raw Shrimp
2 Zucchini
Roma Tomatoes
Cilantro
Green Onion
Lemon Pepper, Seasoned Salt, and Pepper
Clamato Drink Mix
Goya Jasmine Rice
Tomato Sauce

How to Season the Shrimp:

Place peeled shrimp in a bowl and season with lemon pepper and seasoning salt. Let it sit for about 1 hour before adding to the soup.

How to Make the Soup:

Boil approximately 2 liters of water. Add 2 cups of Clamato Mix and cut Zucchini (zucchini can be cut to whatever size you choose). Stir occasionally and let it warm up on medium heat for approximately 30 min.

Then add 1 cup each of: Chopped cilantro, green onion, and chopped Roma tomatoes (about two tomatoes). Stir occasionally for approximately 15 mins.

Add the seasoned shrimp and cook until the shrimp is ready. (Usually takes another 15 mins.) Add salt and pepper to taste.
