REPORTS

Finance Report — Tammy Pachta

- Stacie Levendofsky provided the council with the Profit and Loss and Balance Sheet from February.
- Pre-enrollment for the 2022-2023 school year is approximately 66% of expected enrollment.
- The Council recommended a 5% tuition increase.
- MCS plans to purchase another bus when one becomes available.
- The Council agreed to move funds allocated to playground improvements to a short-term savings account.
- Meetings will be scheduled beginning in April to begin discussing the budget.
- Diana Noll requested a discussion to acquire the St. Patrick's cemetery from the Kansas City Diocese.

Latino Liaison - Gloria Green

- Rosie is getting results from the Synod retreat with another retreat scheduled for May, Fr. Carlos possibly attending.
- Gloria will be joining the Catholic Charities Advisory Committee for the eastern region of the Salina Diocese.
- Planning a celebration for Hispanic Heritage month Sept 15th—Oct 15th. Maybe join together with the Parish Picnic.

Commission Reports

Liturgy — Joe Wolf

- No meeting due to Holy Week Masses.
- Ramona is working on assignments for liturgy with the new members that signed up recently.

MCS — Tammy Galvan, Fr. Ryan

- Teacher contracts went out. Interviewing for vacant positions of Rhianna Nelson and Megan Umsheid.
- Enrollment is steady at 273. Cardinal Camp is two-thirds full for Summer 2022.
- Mike Hubka provided a brief overview of the 2022-2023 school year that includes a salary increase for teachers.
- A 5% tuition increase was approved.
- Two buses were approved for \$42,000 each. This will come out of a fund that is not part of the general fund.
- 4th quarter activities planned including Stations of the Cross, First Communion, Movie on the Lawn, end of year picnic 'Walking Into Summer,' Teacher Appreciation Week, Music Concert, Talent Show, Jr High Dance, potential field trips, 8th Grade Parent Mass and Graduation.
- All school Masses have been back in session.
- eRate bids were accepted to switch to fiber lines this summer with an update of the phone lines as well.
- May 11th is the last day of school.

Council of Education report:

- The Senate did not extend the pandemic free meal waivers. They will expire on the last day of this school year. KSDE created an online application for families to determine eligibility for future free and reduced meals.
- Megan Umschied created an Advancement Handbook for whomever assumes the Advancement role in the future.
- The MCS 2022 auction is set for Friday, October 14th in the Utopia Room at STM.
- The MCS Annual Golf Tournament will be Friday, June 17th, 2022 at Stagg Hill Golf Course @ 9a.
- \$325,000 was raised for the playground with a committee assembled. \$67,000 of the total is from a grant that must be used for the project by May 1, 2023.
- Chris Morgan started as the part-time evening custodian. Maintenance continues to complete many projects.

- The Luckey Cardinal Scholar's Bowl team finished 2nd in Salina Diocese Meet, also BVL and Riley CO champs.
- A STREAM committee was created to continue growth of hands-on activities during the school year. A STREAM summer camp is also being considered.

- Birthday dinner was held April 3rd, 2022 in the MCS gymnasium.
- Good feedback about the entertainment, attendance, and food.
- Considering a Latino theme for 2023.

Building and Grounds — Fr. Ryan

- Church Marquee is in the making. Planning for finalization.
- South tower is fixed. Waiting for new hardware for the doors.
- The city said we can remove damaged and uneven bricks at the budget shop sidewalks and replace with concrete.
- Father sent letter of support to the city to extend street bricks on Juliette in front of the church.

Evangelization — Judy Parks

- Discussed sending more pictures and event info from Seven Dolors to the Register.
- Welcoming committee met - 25 new members with four local households. Several addresses out of town in Ogden and Wamego, 5 Hispanic families.

Social Action — Tamra Storms

- Review of the commission's focus and outreach for new members that joined from the Stewardship drive.
- Pilgrim bread sales from Lent were approx \$1500 and went to CRS to aid refugees in Ukraine, Afghanistan, Syria, Haiti.
- Trees were handed out after Masses for Arbor Day. Adding Laudato Si contributions will be added to the monthly newsletter bulletin.
- Next meeting will focus on increasing participation with Life Choice Ministries, their 'Walk for Life' in June, and planning the Arts on the Green event for August 28th.

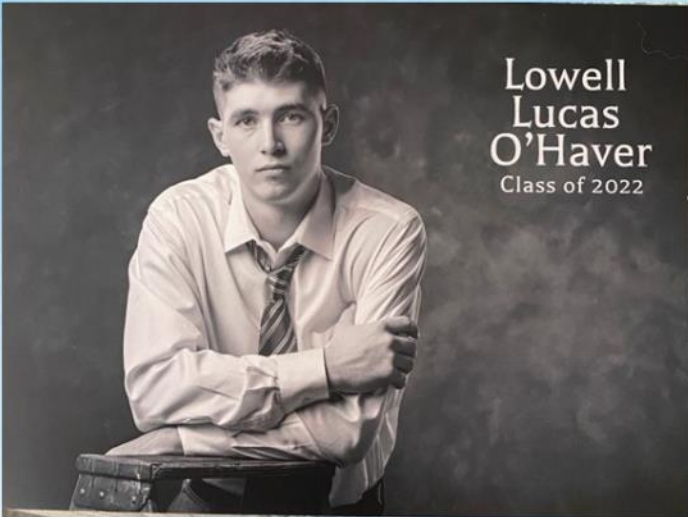

ON CARE FOR OUR COMMON HOME

LAUDATO SI'

“Praise be to you, my Lord.”

“LAUDATO SI’, mi’ Signore” – “Praise be to you, my Lord.” These are the words that open Pope Francis’ encyclical on ecology and care for God’s creation. These words, quoting St. Francis of Assisi’s beautiful canticle, remind us that our common home is like a sister with whom we share our life and a beautiful mother who opens her arms to embrace us.

Pope Francis’ encyclical letter [*Laudato Si’*](#) was released in June 2015. Five years later, in 2020, Pope Francis invited all Catholics and people of good will to celebrate its fifth anniversary by protecting families and future generations through action to care for our common home. Here are themes that Pope Francis highlighted in *Laudato Si’* which require our urgent response today.

- **A Moral and Spiritual Challenge.** The ecological crisis, Pope Francis writes, is a summons to profound interior conversion—to renew our relationships with God, one another, and the created world.
- **Care for God’s Creation.** God created the world and entrusted it to us as a gift. Now we have the responsibility to care for and protect it and all people, who are part of creation. Protecting human dignity is strongly linked to care for creation.
- **We are All Connected.** We are connected to the rest of the human family, to the created world, and to those who will come after us in future generations.
- **Impact on the Poor.** People in poverty have contributed least to climate change, yet they are disproportionately impacted by it. As a result of excessive use of natural resource by wealthy nations, those who are poor experience pollution, lack of access to clean water, hunger, and more.
- **Called to Solidarity.** We are one human family and have a shared responsibility for others and for creation. Wealthy countries have a responsibility to reduce consumption of non-renewal resources and should help poorer nations develop in sustainable ways.
- **Technological and economic development** must serve human beings and enhance human dignity, instead of creating an economy of exclusion, so that all people have access to what is needed for authentic human development.
- **Supporting Life, Protecting Creation.** Concern for nature is incompatible with failure to protect vulnerable human beings, such as unborn children, people with disabilities, or victims of human trafficking.
- **A Time to Act.** Pope Francis calls for a change in lifestyle and consumption. We can make important changes as individuals, families, and communities, and as civil and political leaders.
- **Hope and Joy.** “Injustice is not invincible” (no. 74) and we act knowing that we seek to live out God’s vision of renewed relationships with God, ourselves, one another, and creation.

How You Can Respond

Each of us are called to take concrete steps – from reducing consumption to working for political change – to better care for creation. Here are some ideas.

1. **Become more aware of our connectedness.** Care for one another and creation includes understanding that “everything is connected” (no. 91) and that the economy, politics, community involvement, and technology all affect the future of the planet and humankind. How can we become more aware of our connectedness?
2. **Changes to lifestyle and consumption habits can make a big difference.** For example, get a re-usable water bottle, take shorter showers, walk, bike or take public transportation instead of driving, recycle, compost food waste, and buy energy efficient appliances.
3. **Make changes institutionally at your parish, school, or workplace.** For example, start recycling and composting, use washable dinnerware in cafeterias, share electronically instead of printing, do an energy audit, and install solar panels.
4. **Support local efforts to solve environmental problems.** Community groups around the country are working to make city, county, and state-wide changes that can make a big difference. Find out what is going on locally and get involved.
5. **Contact your members of Congress** to share Pope Francis’ message and urge action to address climate change.
