REPORTS

Finance Report — Tammy Pachta

- Stacie Levendofsky provided the Profit and Loss and Budget to Date documents for the council to review.
- The council approved Tammy Pachta to review grant spending records.
- The kiosk is still currently being constructed.

Latino Liaison - Gloria Green

- Fundraiser for Hispanic Heritage Month will be September 18th on Mexican Independence Day from 4-7p in the Luckey Gymnasium. Hispanic Heritage Month is Sept 15th—Oct 15th.
- Selling tamales, empanadas, coffee, agua frescas, jewelry.
- Funds raised will be used for Mananitas celebrations for December.

Commission Reports

Liturgy — Joe Wolf

- No meeting.
- Tim and Cindy Donahue are training for hospitality ministry.
- New lectors and Eucharistic ministers being trained. Hopefully new server training coming soon.
- Ramona reports new missalettes have been ordered - staying with same format, but will now have side-by-side English/Spanish.
- New Lectionary coming in the future. Same three year cycle, but will be closer to the 'Revised Standard Version.'

MCS — Tammy Galvan, Fr. Ryan

- Playground equipment options are being reviewed and purchased. Funds allocated need to be spent by May 2023.
- The new childcare director was hired from Creche — Anna Bonilla.
- A third kindergarten class will be added for 2023.
- Approx enrollment for Fall 2023 will be 250+.
- Salina Diocese has overall accreditation for the first time. It is usually just independent schools.

Catholic Formation - Deb Shepek, Vanessa Vargas

- No meeting.
- Vocation Bible School - July 11th-15th.

Parish Life — Jolene Amtower

- New members were added last week, however, more members are still needed. Gloria reports Bonilla's would also like to join when they return after summer vacation.
- Meeting next week to plan parish picnic being held on August 28th, 2022.

Building and Grounds — Fr. Ryan

- Church Marquee brickwork will start July 1st. Thomas Sign reports the sign is on its way.
- Garden around Marquee will continue to be rock, as mulch runs off. Previous discussion recommended replacing rock due to availability to cause destruction to church property/stained glass windows.
- Water damage has been occurring at the basement of the church, possibly from the side door. Minimal damage to property from the last big storm.

- The hardware of the inner doors of the church need to be evaluated for adjustments so they stay open.
- Discussion for options to replace 'pool noodles' on church door handles with another heat friendly option. Also to update flowers as they are faded.

Evangelization — Judy Parks

- Continued good response and attendance from the new parish families.

Social Action — Tamra Storms

- Planning continues for Arts on the Green for September 11th, 2022.
- The event will be held on the green space north of Luckey Building.
- Celebration of the Arts - visual, culinary, musical, crafts - and will incorporate Pope Francis' Laudato Si.

Old Business

- Mark Cloud will be here August 9th and 10th, and August 16th-20th to take pictures for the new parish directory.
 - Laptop will be made available with pictures immediately after photos.
 - Four rooms needed — pre-meeting, photo room, two rooms to review photos.
 - Weekday hours 2-8:30p; Weekend times 10a-4:30p
 - May not need as much help as in the past, but will look for volunteers. Women's Circle Members have helped in the past. May reach out to K of C members also.
- Fr. Ryan requested names for new possible members to fill upcoming counsel positions that are expiring soon.
- Prayer and Action teams are here thru June and have been quite busy.
 - Additional snacks needed — about 28 students here.

New Business

- Discussion for council members that need to be replaced.
 - Term limits - three year terms with up to two consecutive terms.
 - Constitution reviewed for elected and appointed positions.
 - Fr. Ryan will continue to evaluate upcoming positions that are coming to term.
- Parish Report to the Diocese will be coming out in July - pastoral council members are needed to review and sign.
- Questions regarding 'Value Them Both' Amendment were raised to Judy Parks by parish members.
 - The banner was damaged and the smaller signs were removed from church property by unknown persons in the middle of the night.
 - Signs can be placed anywhere on private property, but cannot be placed on 'easements' between sidewalks and the street.
- Discussed Plan of Action training for crisis responses during Masses will be held on June 28th in Salina. Other meeting locations will be Hays and Colby. Possibly another meeting in Manhattan.
- Building committee to be set up in the future for discussion and planning of a new Parish Center.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR ADULTS

Now is the time for our parish to reach out to those who we think might be looking for what is missing in their lives. Could it be faith? A faith community? How can you reach out to them without being intrusive?

In the following weeks, you will read four steps that can help you to spread the word about RCIA – the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. We hope this can help you be confident in “being a disciple of Christ” through the Catholic Church.

Step 1: “We must begin to nurture friendships. Friendship was the original model of evangelization. The first Christians did not seek to spread the faith by means of political power, and they didn’t have the use of the mass media. They simply engaged in the oldest and most reliable method of influence – friendship. ‘Word of mouth’ endorsement by you about your Catholic faith and our parish can influence another to maybe seek out more information about the Catholic church.” (from Rediscovering Catholicism by Matthew Kelly.)

Staff Spotlight

Meet Rosie Rundell!

Rosie began working for the Church over 40 years ago. She started serving in Lay Ecclesial Ministry at St. Elizabeth’s Parish in Salina, first under Fr. Larry Grennan, then Fr. Leroy Metro, and then one year with Fr. Frank Coady before she moved to Manhattan to serve as Director of Music and Liturgy. During that time she worked to learn more and pursued classes and degrees, first through the diocese, then from Benedictine College, and Aquinas Institute of Theology. She has a Maser’s in Pastoral Ministry and is a certified Spiritual Director. Rosie currently serves as the semi-retired Directory of RCIA.

Rosie finds that being with people is the most rewarding part of her job, “Our parishioners give me life. I feel most graced when I get to accompany someone in their Spiritual Journey. RCIA has always been a passion for me and being responsible for the parish’s sacramental prep all these years has been a privilege.”

When asked if she could meet one saint and why, she said that she would like to meet St. Paul. “He was such an evangelizer and traveled throughout the world known at the time of Jesus preaching the Good News. He came up against all kinds of issues and adversity yet still persisted in doing and knowing what was Spirit-filled and right.”
