Questions and Answers on the Topic of Abortion

It has been brought to my attention that there needs to be some discussion regarding the topic of abortion and how we are called to handle this issue as Catholics. Abortion is a hot topic as it pertains to people and their real-life decisions. There is much to cover so this Q&A is not meant to be an exhaustive list. There will be disagreements regarding these answers, however, we are called to be charitable in our responses.

In a nutshell, what is the Catholic church's teaching on abortion?

The Catholic Church teaches that direct abortion, willed either as an end or a means, is gravely contrary to the moral law. Notice, abortion, as defined by the Church, is the direct willing the death of the unborn child. We can call it a zygote, fetus, or conceptus, but that it is a unique human individual, aside the mother and father, is what the Church points to as warranting protection. Yes, even something that small has dignity and worth.

(Resource: Catholic Catechism # 2271)

Is there any distinction made by the church for special health situations (for example, ectopic pregnancies or situations which are life-threatening for the mother)?

Distinctions are made by the church for special health situations. There are many complications that can and do occur with pregnancy. The principle that the church holds to is making sure that the problem is addressed where the problem occurs. A typical example is with ectopic pregnancies. These are often brought up and are misunderstood in the abortion debate.

An ectopic pregnancy is when the fertilized egg/ conceptus begins to develop in the fallopian tube and not in the uterus. This is not the proper place for the development of life. The fallopian tube is where the problem occurs, not the conceptus, as the fallopian tube is not working properly. Therefore, the solution here is to fix the problem of the failing fallopian tube. There is no way to transplant the conceptus into the uterus, but there is a way to remove the failed portion of the fallopian tube with the conceptus in it. The conceptus will die as a result, but the fallopian tube has been prioritized for the treatment and care. The principle of double-effect occurs, the priority is to care for the pathology, so the means and the end is to cure the fallopian tube, but simultaneously, the child will die, but it was not targeted as the primary problem.

The direct purpose is the cure of the pathology, the unborn child is not the pathology. The Ethical and Religious Directives for Catholic Health Care Services published by the USCCB states:

Operations, treatments, and medications that have as their **direct purpose the cure of a proportionately serious pathological condition of a pregnant woman are permitted** when they cannot be safely postponed until the unborn child is viable, even if they will result in the death of the unborn child. [bold for emphasis] [Part 4:#47]

In summary, what does the Value them Both amendment address? If passed, does it completely ban abortion?

The amendment was written as response to a 2019 court case where the Kansas Supreme Court found a right to abortion in the Kansas Constitution. This court case now acts as the precedent that could strike down previous and future laws regarding abortion. The Value them Both Amendment will place in the Kansas Constitution, through the language found in §22, the basic desire of the people in the state the right to legislate the regulation of abortion and guarantee that abortion is not funded by the government, i.e., tax dollars.

The aim of the amendment itself is not an outright ban on abortion. Though the legalese of the document may sound confusing, the language reads: that laws can be written to include rape, incest, and life-saving measures as possible circumstances to receive an abortion. Those opposing the amendment will contend that it will lead to further legislation that will ban abortion. They also contend that KS has sufficient laws in place already regarding abortion. Those two statements neglect knowing with certainty the outcome of legislation that could pass an all-out ban, and it neglects with certainty that the Kansas Supreme Court will uphold current legislation because of its 2019 ruling. This amendment hopes to insure and maintain current regulations.

What about instances of rape and incest? Are there allowances made for those situations, or does the Church expect victims to carry those children to term?

The church understands that those who have suffered a traumatic experience through rape or incest have undergone a grave injustice. When the rape or incest brings about pregnancy the pregnancy does not mean that the answer is abortion. In the same Ethical and Religious Directives mentioned above it states this concerning a victim of rape:

A female who has been raped should be able to defend herself against a potential conception from the sexual assault. If, after appropriate testing, there is no evidence that conception has occurred already, she may be treated with medications that would prevent ovulation, sperm capacitation, or fertilization. It is not permissible, however, to initiate or to recommend treatments that have as their purpose or direct effect the removal, destruction, or interference with the implantation of a fertilized ovum. [bold for emphasis] [Part 3:#36]

What happens to the souls of aborted babies? Purgatory? Heaven?

The church understands that each unique individual human being is made in the image and likeness of God and is directly willed by God. God as creator has revealed his mercy to us in his Son Jesus Christ. This mercy is applied through the judgement of God, so we entrust children who die by abortion, and all those who have died without Baptism, to the mercy of God who desires that all be saved. (Resource CCC #1261)

What if I had an abortion, or have been affected by an abortion?

The Church offers the mercy of God and a way towards healing through the sacrament of confession. Men and women are recommended to use these resource opportunities as well.

FIRST RECONCILIATION & FIRST COMMUNION

FIRST RECONCILIATION & FIRST COMMUNION at Seven Dolors can be requested starting in 2nd grade.

- For the 2022/23 school year, First Reconciliation and First Communion can be requested for children in the 2nd grade. Child will need to be enrolled in and attending the Religious Education program.
- If your child is above 2nd grade for the 2022/23 school year and would like to receive their First Communion, they will need to complete **one year of Religious Education** classes and will be eligible to register for First Communion prep their second year of Religious Education.

Starting 2023/24, all children - including 2nd graders - will need to have completed one year of Religious Education before requesting First Communion. If you have a 1st grader in 2022/23, they will need to be enrolled in Religious Education for the 2022/23 year to request First Reconciliation and First Communion in 2023/24.

CONFIRMATION

CONFIRMATION at Seven Dolors can be requested starting in 8th Grade – child should already have received Baptism and First Communion.

Confirmation Parent/Child meetings are scheduled for October 9 at 2pm in Spanish and 3pm in English at the church.

- Confirmation classes meet on scheduled Sundays from 3pm to 5pm. There will be approximately 10 Sunday classes which will be scheduled once we have received the Confirmation date from the Bishop's Office.
- **In addition to the Sunday Confirmation classes**, children requesting Confirmation for the 2022/23 school year will need to be registered and attending Religious Education or enrolled at MCS.
 - If your child is an 8th grader at MCS, you will need to complete the Religious Education Registration Form.
- For the 2023/24 school year, **one year of religious education** is required before requesting Confirmation.
 - For Religious Education students: if you have a child in 7th grade for the 2022/23 school year, you will need to register them for Religious Education this year in 7th grade. When they are in 8th grade, during the 2023/24 Religious Education classes, you can request Confirmation.
 - For Manhattan Catholic School students: to request Confirmation, your child should be enrolled and attending MCS 7th grade classes for the 2022/23 school year and 8th grade MCS classes during the 2023/24 school year.
- Starting in the 2023/24 school year, if you have a child older than 8th grade, they will also be required to complete **one full year of Religious Education** before they can request Confirmation.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION REGISTRATION

Seven Dolors offers a complete religious formation program for Pre-K through 12th Grade. This includes the preparation and celebration of **First Reconciliation** and **Communion** (2nd Grade). We meet Wednesday evenings from 6:30-8pm.

Registration for the 2022-23 school year begins August 3.
First day of Religious Education will be September 7.

- Families who were registered for the 2021-22 year will receive an email with the registration link.
- For new families, visit the sevendolors.com website to complete the online Registration Form located under the Faith Formation/Religious Education option.

****For children receiving sacraments, you will need to fill out a Sacrament Information Form (found on website). You will also need to submit a certified copy of the sacraments your child has received. These can be turned in on the first night of Religious Education classes.**

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION NIGHT

The first night of Religious Education classes (Pre-K thru 12th grade) will be Wed., September 7. We will begin with a family Mass at 6:30pm in the church. After Mass the Knights of Columbus will provide dinner for Religious Education families in the Manhattan Catholic School Elementary gym. Children will be dismissed to classrooms after dinner and parents will be able to complete registration forms.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR ADULTS

I had the opportunity to attend a National Gathering of Christian Initiators held at Loyola University in Chicago. There were over 200 other attendees from throughout the United States. It was invigorating to be among so many lay ministers who have the same passion about RCIA as I do.

The theme was “**Evaluating and Revitalizing the RCIA in Your Parish.**” I knew that in going to the conference that I would come home with lots of ideas....and I did.

The first thought I had was our whole parish needs to embrace their responsibility to Evangelize! Sounds pretty intense, doesn't it! Well, here are some thoughts on the matter:

On December 8, 1975, Pope Paul VI issued his apostolic exhortation **Evangelii nuntiandi**, or, as titled in English, **Evangelization in the Modern World**. This influential document defines what it means to “evangelize” or, as the first line of the document says, what it means to “proclaim the Gospel to the people of today.”

In recent years, Catholics have become more comfortable with the word and concept of *evangelization*. **Evangelization is more about how we live our lives after we leave the church on Sunday.** Each week we are challenged by the Word, nourished by the Eucharist, and supported by the community to go forth and spread the Gospel message in word and deed. “Those who have received the Good News and who have been gathered by it into the community of salvation can and must communicate and spread it. (13) Evangelizing is in fact the grace and vocation proper to the Church, her deepest identity. She exists in order to evangelize, that is to say, in order to preach and teach, to be the channel of the gift of grace, to reconcile sinners with God, and to perpetuate Christ's sacrifice in the Mass, which is the memorial of His death and glorious resurrection. (14)

So....does this mean you have to go knock on people's door and ask them if they have “accepted Jesus as their personal Savior?” **NO!** A couple ways to evangelize in our parish is to pay attention to the people choosing to join the RCIA Process. Pray for them. Eventually I would like you to “adopt” one of them. (more about that later). When the Knight of Columbus breakfast begins again in September, come introduce yourself to the group. They will be eating breakfast with you.

By Baptism We are Called...by Confirmation we are “Recalled.” Every Sunday, we gather after the 10am Mass in the church basement. Come and see....
