Dear Parishioners,

When I began seminary, I met regularly with a spiritual director. One of the first things we spoke about was humility. Humility, he told me, was what I needed to be looking at more for my life and he recommended to me a little book by a monk named Andre Louf called "The Way of Humility". It was a little skinny book, and to be honest, it was a book that didn't speak to me. I felt it was more like a concordance skimming some select texts for the word "humility" and copy-pasting it in a document, binding it, and calling it a book. I really didn't know what humility was and it didn't seem to help me. Humility was an abstract idea in my mind, it seemed too far away from me to actually obtain. I wanted to grasp it intellectually and I couldn't find any type of pattern for it in my life. What was even presented in the book seemed to just be going over my head.

What I would discover was that I made humility too big for myself to fully grasp. The reality of humility is to make the movement to smallness of oneself. The greatest scriptural quote on humility is from St. John the Baptist, "He (Jesus) must increase, while I must decrease." John 3:30

This weekend's first reading from Sirach talks about humility as the appropriate disposition that one needs to possess as a child of God. "Humble yourself the more, the greater you are." Sirach 3:18. Humble yourself. Humility is wrapped up in knowing that we are human, humus, earthly, and that there is something that is still greater than us. God asks us to approach him in our littleness, knowing that he provides us with a message and a gift in Jesus in the Eucharist. Humility is the approach of the centurion saying, "Lord I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof." Matthew 8:8. What a beautiful gift for us to have these words on our lips before our own reception of the Eucharist at Mass.

Humility understands that there is more, and more; more to learn, more to gain, more to understand, more to be moved by, more to be grateful for... The greatest pattern of humility is given to us by Mary who listened to the voice of God and said "yes" to being the Mother of God. She was open to more and more, even knowing that God's gifts are provided in the suffering that she would endure in this blessed role. As we prepare to move into September we are invited to become more like Our Lady of Sorrows through humility. May we open our hearts to receive more of what God has in store for our high reaching minds. Bring yourself lower to receive from him how he desires to stoop down to us to meet us in our humility.

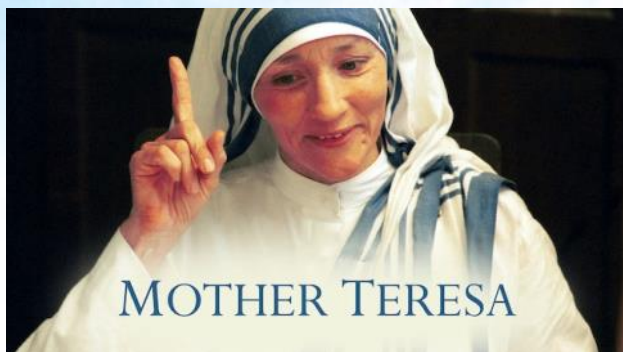

Notes from the Music Ministry

Thank you.....On behalf of the Seven Dolors musicians, we are extremely grateful for your support and for your participation in joyfully singing at the Masses. It so awesome to hear your voices fill the church in prayer and song. A special thank you to all Cantors, Parish & Youth Choir members and instrumentalists for sharing their gift of music and leading us to be a “singing” Parish.

Here are some musical opportunities available:

- ♪ **The Parish Choir** is welcoming new members of all voice parts. No choral experience is necessary but is helpful. This group meets each Tuesday from 5:30 – 6:30 and sings two services per month as well as Christmas, Holy Week and Easter. A short voice-part placing with the director will help you find your “voice” in the choir.
- ♪ **Youth Choir** – The Youth Choir sings at Christmas, Palm Sunday, Holy Week and First Communion. Practices will either be on Wednesday evening before Religious Ed or Sunday mornings at 9:00 a.m. More information will be coming in the near future.
- ♪ **Instrumentalists** – Instrumentalists of all types are welcomed to accompany or lead services. The ability to read music is required.
- ♪ **Cantors** – Cantors provide musical leadership for Mass when the choir is not singing. If you enjoy solo-singing or singing with one other person, this may be the opportunity for you to share your gifts! Nervous? Our choir director and music director can help build your confidence and enhance your skills! A brief meeting with the music director and choir director will begin the process for scheduling new cantors.

LITURGY NEWS

Starting Labor Day Weekend, which also begins the fall season, we will switch from singing the Mass of Christ the Savior to the Mass of Spirit and Grace. Why do we switch Mass settings throughout the year? Why is the Church decorated differently at different times? Why do the Priests wear different colors of vestments throughout the year? Each season throughout the Church year has its unique identity. We have been in Ordinary Time since June 6th (Monday following Pentecost) and will continue until the 1st Sunday in Advent. Since Ordinary Time, is the longest season of the liturgical year, we sing two different Mass settings, one over the Summer and one for Fall in which we will also see more Fall decorations in the Church.

How do you know what Season we are in and what Mass setting are we singing? At each Mass, the Cantor begins our celebration by saying "Welcome and what Sunday we are celebrating". The number of the Mass setting is posted at the top right hand side of the hymn board.



Our liturgy is slowly returning to normal after the last two years and that means we are scheduling our normal number of ministers to each Mass. We are seeing our active minister numbers declining each quarter. If you are interested in serving as a liturgical minister in any form, please email or call the parish office. We are needing Altar Servers, Hospitality Ministers (people who will greet everyone coming into Mass), Eucharistic Ministers, and Lectors. Please pray and consider becoming a part of our weekly liturgy.

Meet Gloria Green

Gloria has worked with the Hispanic Choir for about 6 years and became the Spanish Ministry Director approx. 3 years ago. Her role as the Spanish Ministry Director is to help families who have difficulties speaking English with the registration portion into religious education for their children, as well as those who are adults needing other sacraments. "I also give Baptism Preparation classes to Spanish speaking parents and godparents who are Baptizing their children. I help coordinate Quinceañeras for teenagers who are celebrating their 15 years, as well as Matrimony Ceremonies here at Seven Dolores. I also translate for MCS, as well as Religious Education when needed." Gloria feels that the most rewarding part of her work is seeing the enthusiasm of parents watching their children receive the Sacrament of Baptism and know that their precious little angels have become true sons and daughters of God!

When asked which saint she would meet if she could, Gloria said, "That's a tough one!!! I am going to say San Juan Diego Cuauhtlatoatzin. He was fortunate enough to be in the presence of our Blessed Mother, and was chosen to deliver a powerful, although difficult request to the Bishop in Tepeyac, México. He did not give up until the request was fulfilled."

Latino Liaison - Gloria Green

- Spanish Ministry will participate in Arts on the Green on Sept 11th with culinary and art items.
- A celebration for Hispanic Heritage Month will be held September 18th in the MCS gym on Mexican Independence Day from 4-7p. This will kick off Hispanic Heritage Month Sept 15th—Oct 15th.
 - Vendors from our parish will provide arts and crafts, food, music, and more to provide fellowship and to raise funds for the Our Lady of Guadalupe celebrations in December.
 - Empanadas, pozole, arroz, coffee, agua frescas, and jewelry. Mexican bingo and piñata fun will also be held.
- A fundraiser will also be started for an Evangelization Youth Retreat for all youth at Seven Dolores.

- Playground equipment options are being reviewed and purchased. Funds allocated need to be spent by May 2023.

- New council members have been added and training for the roles of council members will be held.
- Back to School night was held August 15th. Reviewed feedback from the evening.

Catholic Formation - Vanessa Vargas, Megan Major

- Vocation Bible School was held July 11th-15th with good success.
- Adventure Timeline series will be used for new curriculum for youth religious education.
- Adult education is being held on the 2nd and 3rd Tuesdays at 6:30p in the church basement. Vatican II documents are being read and discussed.

Parish Life — Jolene Amtower

- Parish Picnic was held at Sunset Zoo on August 21st, 2022 with a good turnout.
 - a cake walk was held after the meal and the entire zoo was rented out to allow attendees to walk around.
- A date will be picked for the church birthday dinner for 2023 and planning will start January 2023.

Building and Grounds — Fr. Ryan

- Budget Shop received some flooding from faulty plumbing. Estimates for repairs are being gathered and completed.

- The new marquee sign for in front of the church has been completed by Thomas Sign. Electrical work is still needed.
- Sonar equipment for the church towers has been installed and Fr. Ryan is pleased with their use in deterring bats.
- Water damage at the church basement has been addressed and has stopped since the gutter cleaning and other maintenance has been completed. The basement and carpets were deep cleaned and look great.
- Help is needed for additional volunteer cleaning for the church from families. The women's circles have been helping a lot, but need additional assistance.
 - CYO members will also be asked to assist and that will also benefit them in getting their volunteer hours.
 - Announcements for church cleaning opportunities will be made at Mass and placed in the bulletin.

Evangelization — Judy Parks

- Efforts are being made to increase outreach to the sick and homebound parish members.
- New or nearly used religious items - rosaries, medals, crucifixes, prayer cards, etc. - can be provided to Evangelization for use with home visits and to give to new parish members.

Social Action — Tamra Storms

- Planning continues for Arts on the Green on September 11th, 2022 on the green space north of the Luckey Building. Proceeds from the event will benefit Be Able.
 - Scoot Voos, and several volunteers and neighbors, from Be Able will attend to share success stories and to discuss how they help members of our community that are often overlooked.
 - Celebration of the Arts and fellowship - visual, culinary, musical, and hands-on crafts.
 - Visual: Manhattan Water Colorists with Deb Umscheid, Mary Lou Glende and Mary Welch - parish artists, Steve Moser with Be Able artists including a caricature artist, Glorious Beads with Gloria Green, soap products by Diana Munoz, Cathy Austin with Ogden House of Hope, and Rooted Fair Trade will be present. A portion of their sales will be donated.
 - Culinary: CYO bierocks; Spanish Ministries with empanadas, tamales, elotes, and agua frescas; local community bakers from the Mennonite community and Seven Dolores.
 - Musicians: Bob and Melissa Atchison, Be Able Garage Band, Ukrainian teen vocalist - Oleksandra Lapshova, Saxophonist - Nate McClendon, with Benediction by the Spanish Ministry.
 - Youth crafts hosted by the Riley County 4-H youth and Trevor Durbin focusing on Laudato Si.
